and Parkland residents, we plan to try an experiment in direct service from your home to down-town Tacoma and



1/4 cup butter or
margarine
1 cup sugar
1 cup corn syrup teaspoon vanill cup coarsely broken, unsake Heat milk and butter until butter melts Mix sugar, syrup and salt in a 2-qt saucepan. Bring to a boil over medium heat. Then cook to firm ball stage (see note) stirring often. Stir in milk mixture gradually so that sugar mixture does not stop boiling. Cook and stir until candy reaches firm ball stage again. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla and nuts. Pour into a well-greased 8-inch square pan. When firm, turn out on cutting board or waxed paper and cut into inch squares. Makes 5 dozen, or 1½ lbs. NOTE: Drop a tiny bit of the bot mixture into a bowl of cold (not ice) water. If the candy forms a firm ball and remains firm and round when you lift it out of the water with your fingers, then the candy has cooked long enough. Be sure to take the pan off the heat while testing the candy.





Harry was 22 years old when he started in 1912 as an assistant lineman at \$2.25 a day with the Sunset Telephone & Tellegraph Company, predecessor of Pacific Telephone. Successive promotions led to the position of Supervisor of Maintenance for the 17 tele-

phone buildings in the Tacoma area in 1952. Throughout almost a half century of service in the telephone industry, he saw the telephone change from a novelty to a necessity and saw the number of telephones in Tacoma grow seven-fold from
