A Christmas Message

At the request of the editor of the TIMES-JOURNAL, it becomes a great pleasure again for me to greet all the readers with a very sincere benediction in the name of Him Whose birthday we celebrate on December 25.

Christmas is not a time in which we take a stand for or against Santa Claus. It has been said that, "Santa Claus is a highly controversial character." Another very devout writer states that, "There are efforts abroad to impeach Santa Claus," and that "The presently ruling office holder should be removed from office is not contested by thinking Christians." Many other wise devout Christians regard Santa Claus as an old fellow who is quite harmless. The matter of great importance is to examine ourselves and to see whether or not we have drifted

far from the true spirit of observance of the feast of the Nativity of Jesus, our Redeemer.

There are secularly minded people who are so ignorant of the meaning of Christmas that they think religion is intruding and getting mixed up in "the Christian racket." Those who are older are inclined to become cynical about present-day practices. It is difficult for those who grow older to retain the simplicity of youth—to recapture the impossibly wonderful spirit of the Christmas of their childhood. For such it is important to look after the brightness of Christmas as it was in youth and not to be overcome by the hardening of the arteries. It is easy to understand that the gleaming lights on the Christmas tree cannot be as thrilling at 50 or 60 or 80 as they were when they were first seen in childhood.

For people who have been in the business world, the value of Christmas presents is computed by the cost mark rather than by the priceless loveliness of one good giver to another. It is well that we keep in mind that though the joy of receiving may not be as great as it once was, we may still have as much joy in giving to others as we ever had. To those who are of mature and sober adulthood, there is something to take the place of the material giving and receiving of youth—namely, a sense of the greatness of God's gift, as Christmas's add up each year. How, how may we get ready for Christmas? There are old

books to read—ISAIAH, MICAH, and the GOSPEL ACCORDING TO ST. LUKE. Those who experience that the evening-time of life is settling down upon them may find in Jesus of Nazareth, born in Bethlehem, the answer to all the prophecies. With a background of such great doctrines, hope will burst into a bright flame, and the angels will echo in the hearts of faith. Let this steady flame continue in our lives. There is enough of truth in these old books to keep the world warm. We will keep our share only if we look in the right place for it. Let everyone searching for the true spirit of Christmas sit in quietness and let the ancient hope glow again in their thoughts.

Let all of us this month be in quietness as we salute the coming of the Christ on the world's greatest day. If our joy is to continue, it must grow a little each year, or like the tree that stops growing, it will be dead. Let no one substitute egg-nogs or Scotch for the beautiful spirit of Christmas.

We send to every person reading these words the greetings of peace on earth and goodwill among men. Such people will be in a state of friendship with God. Such a peace cannot be taken from us. Whether we receive his gifts or little gifts, may our souls be prepared to receive the greatest gift—Christ Himself. May He be pleased and permitted to remain in our hearts always. Christ is the reason for Christmas; may He be our joy forever.

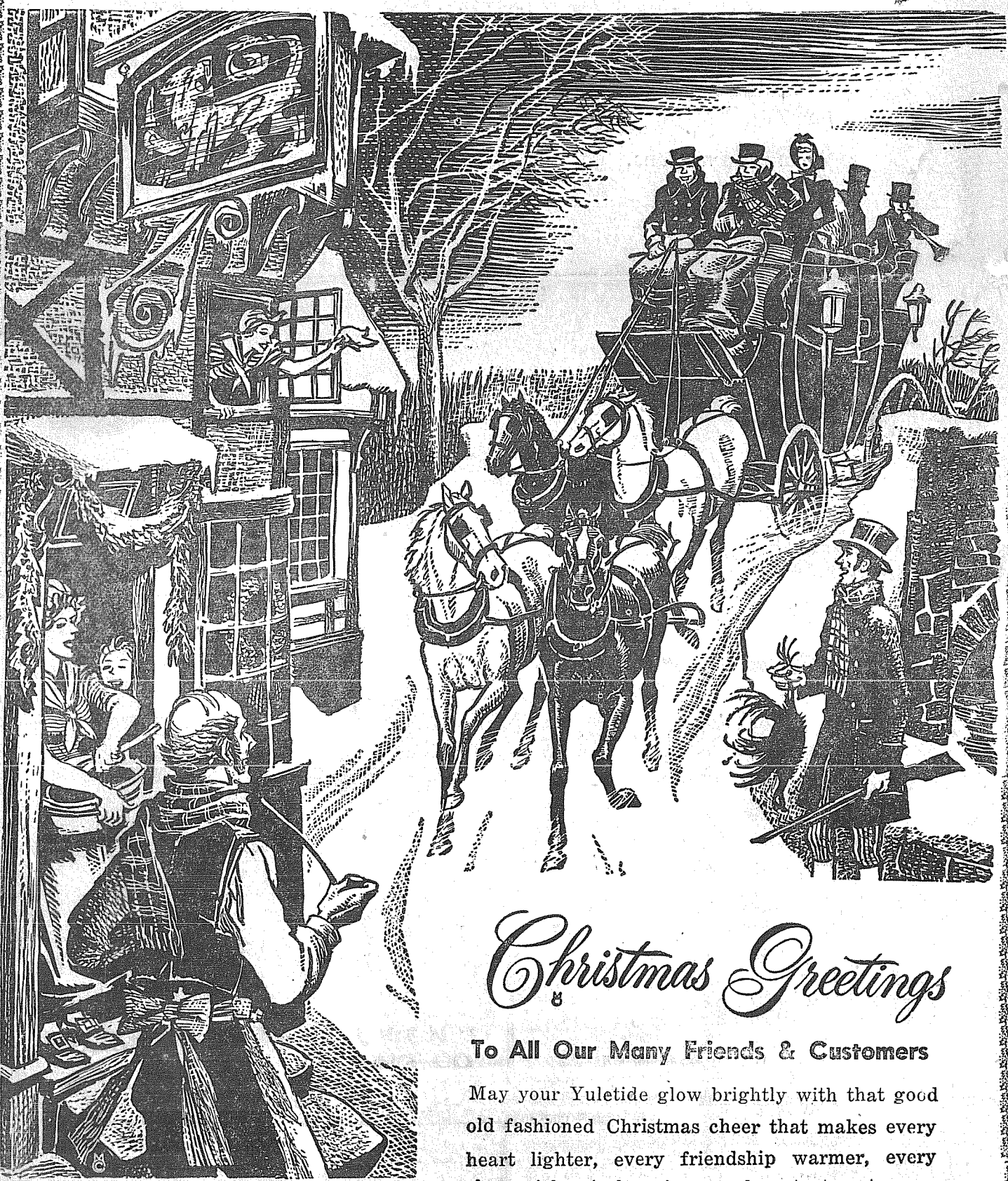

During the afternoon there were a few lost

It was a busy day for all the grown-ups that planned the party and looked after the small guests for the afternoon. Everyone had a wonderful time and arrived home safely. 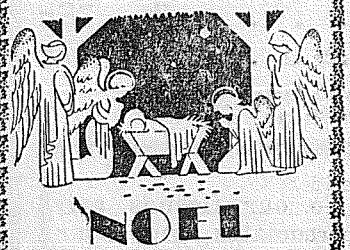

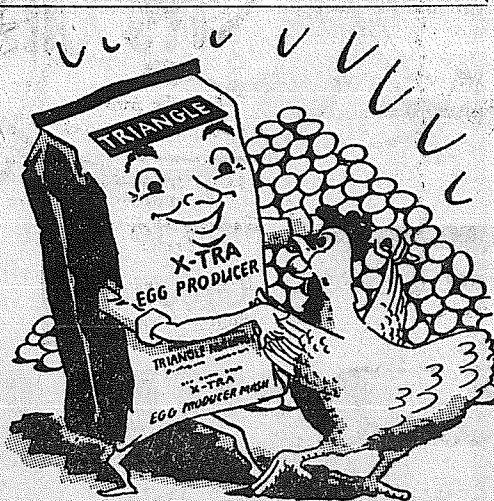

 totaling \$270,000.

William M. Robbins, the Fund's president, stated that three colleges have been selected to receive unrestricted grants of \$25,000 each for operating funds. They are Antioch, Whitman, and Williams. They were selected from a group of independent American colleges of high scholastic standing and with records of superior administration. If the Fund's present program of aid to education is continued, the colleges selected for participation one year would not be eligible for participation during the year immediately following.

The Fund also is contributing a total of \$145,000 to 11 state and regional associations of private liberal arts colleges, with a total of 158 participating members. These associations, formed to facilitate appeals for financial support, will distribute the funds among their members.

Two other grants were announced by Mr. Robbins. The National Fund for Medical Education, which gives support to the operating needs of the nation's 80 medical schools, is to receive \$25,000. The United Negro College Fund, with 31 participating college members, is to receive \$25,000.

The General Foods Fund was incorporated in March, 1953 to make contributions to organizations in the charitable, educational, and scientific fields.

C. D. Directors Outline Plans; Ask Public Aid

The importance of public participation in civil defense was stressed during an all-day

meeting of civil defense area directors, executive staff members and law enforcement officers Wednesday, December 8, in Tacoma's Winthrop hotel. More than 100 delegates from the western part of the state attended, according to Pierce County Director Gus K. Partridge.

Public interest in the civil defense program is vital to the

welfare of the country, according to Capt. Roy F. Carlson, executive officer, Washington state patrol, who blamed public apathy on lack of civilian experience with war.

"Cooperation between C.D. officials and the public is more difficult here than it is in Europe because civilians over here never have had a bomb destroy their homes," he said.

Harry Sprinker, chairman of the Board of Pierce County Commissioners, told the delegates that he feels that public officials at all levels of government also are guilty of this lack of interest. He pledged his personal support to the C.D. program.

John J. Lenhart, Director of Spokane Civil Defense, suggested that interest might be

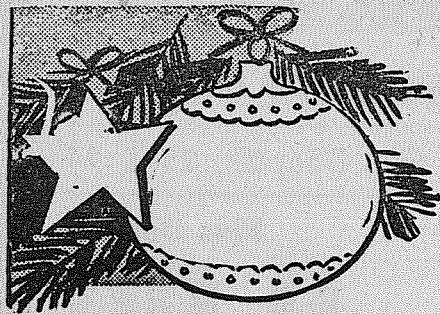
awakened by methods similar to those used to alert citizens to Operation Walkout in Spokane early in the year. This was done through letters read in churches, pamphlets distributed by children, hotel managers and storekeepers, and through newspapers and radio and TV spots. Lenhart seconded a plan presented earlier by Lt. Robert Marshall of the traffic division

of the Tacoma Police Department, which entailed personal calls on homes by block wardens.

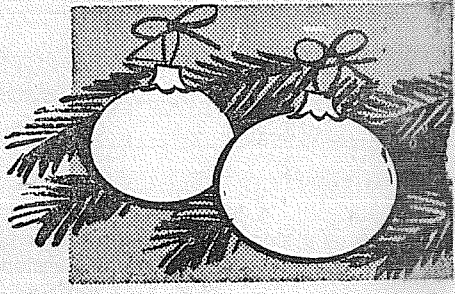
"The need for C.D. workers is still very great," Lenhart said. "In Spokane we recruited auxiliary policemen through our regular police officers, each of whom was asked to bring a friend suitable for this kind of work."

Recruitment of auxiliary police was also urged by Chief James Pryde of the state patrol. Agreeing with a statement by Admiral B. G. Lake, Washington State Deputy Director of Civil Defense, that "we must get our people out from under the H-bomb because there is no protection from such a bomb," Pryde stressed the need of a well trained traffic control

force. "We need a good auxiliary police force that can handle such traffic problems as may be caused by a mass evacuation," he said. "But we also need C.D. workers in all other capacities. Our job is to make people aware of the importance of civil defense."

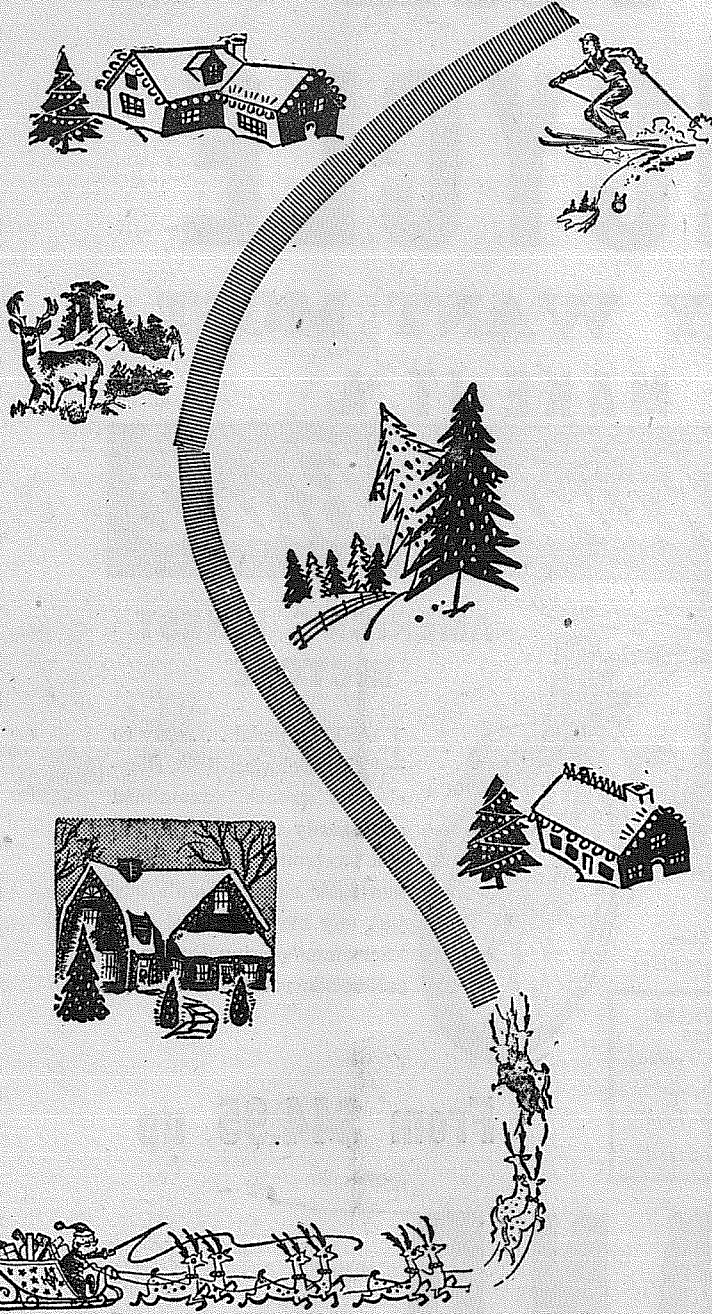

Telephone Men and Women Preparing for Annual Madigan Army Hospital Christmas Party

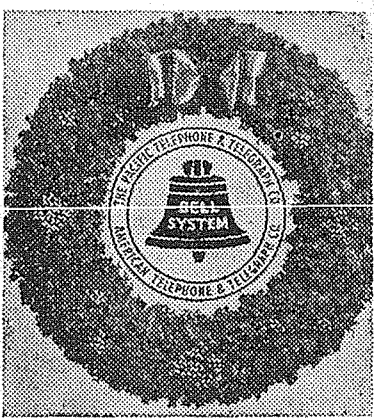

County Agent's Corner

By C. R. Doran

Are you looking for a home in the country? If the answer is yes then your objective is the same as expressed by a large percentage of the callers at the county agent's office at 501 Court House, Tacoma. Some are interested in land that will support a full-time farm operation such as dairy, beef, fruit or some specialty crop. This group is in the minority since most of the callers want a place that will handle a cow, a beef animal or two, garden, pets for the youngsters and in general a place that provides a good outdoor home environment for the family.

This is a fortunate situation since available good farms are scarce but acreages of our poorer farm soils can be found at reasonable cost that will provide opportunities for part-time farming or just rural living.

Here is a suggestion for checking the soil capabilities of that prospective farm of yours. The county agent's office is equipped with a set of large soil maps showing soil types found throughout the settled areas. It was developed from the extensive soil survey of 1939. Equipped with a legal description of the property we can spot your place on the soil map. Your acreage will be cut with irregular lines forming areas of different colors. Each color indicates a different soil type. Each color is numbered, traced to the legend that names the soil type. Each soil type is described as to appearance, texture and a description of the soil below the surface telling you what you will find by exploring with a shovel. It indicates the crops best suited to the soil type.

An hour with our soil maps

can help you determine the best crops for your land or it can help you find the land suited to the crops you wish to grow.

Several Pierce county poultrymen were busy keeping track of their poultry chore time during this month. This is part of a labor study conducted by our office. Purpose of the study is to try to find ways to care for the birds in less time. On some farms this may not be possible. On many it is. So far six poultrymen have returned their time charts. George Baker, Puyallup; Howard Freeman, Waller Road; Phil Arneson, Lakebay; Bill Hannam, Vickery Road; Cecil Foster, Buckley, and L. C. McFadden, Parkland, have completed their part of the study.

As soon as all the records are completed we will summarize them and make the results known. A study such as this can prove very helpful to poultrymen in analyzing their chore routes.

If you prefer to make your own holiday fruit cake, now's the time! Supplies of dried fruits and nuts are showing up in abundance on retail markets. With the makings handy you can prepare a treat for the family and Christmas gifts for your special friends all in one process.

One of the newer ideas for fruit cake gifts is one pound loaves. They are generally easier to slice and also to wrap than the traditional old-time big

round fruit cake. If metal foil is used for a wrapping, wrap the cake first in waxed paper so the acid of the fruit will not come in contact with the foil.

Following is a tested U.S. Department of Agriculture recipe for five one pound loaves of fruit cake.

Ingredients:

- 1 pound prunes,
- 1 pound seedless raisins,
- ½ pound candied citron
- ¼ pound nut meats (about 1 cup)
- 1 cup butter
- 1 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
- 4 eggs,
- 1 tablespoon milk
- 2 cups sifted flour
- 1 teaspoon mace
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon soda

Method

Soak prunes if they seem dry; pit and chop. Soak raisins 20 minutes in hot water and drain. Cut citron in strips and chop nuts. Mix all together. Cream fat and sugar together. Beat in eggs and milk. Sift flour, spices and soda and stir into fruits and nuts. Add to creamed mixture. Grease and flour five small loaf pans. Line bottoms with brown paper, greased. Pour batter into pans. Bake at 250°F (very slow oven) for three and one-half hours. Cool slightly. Then remove from pans and strip off paper. Cool thoroughly and wrap in waxed paper. Store two weeks in a cool place before using.

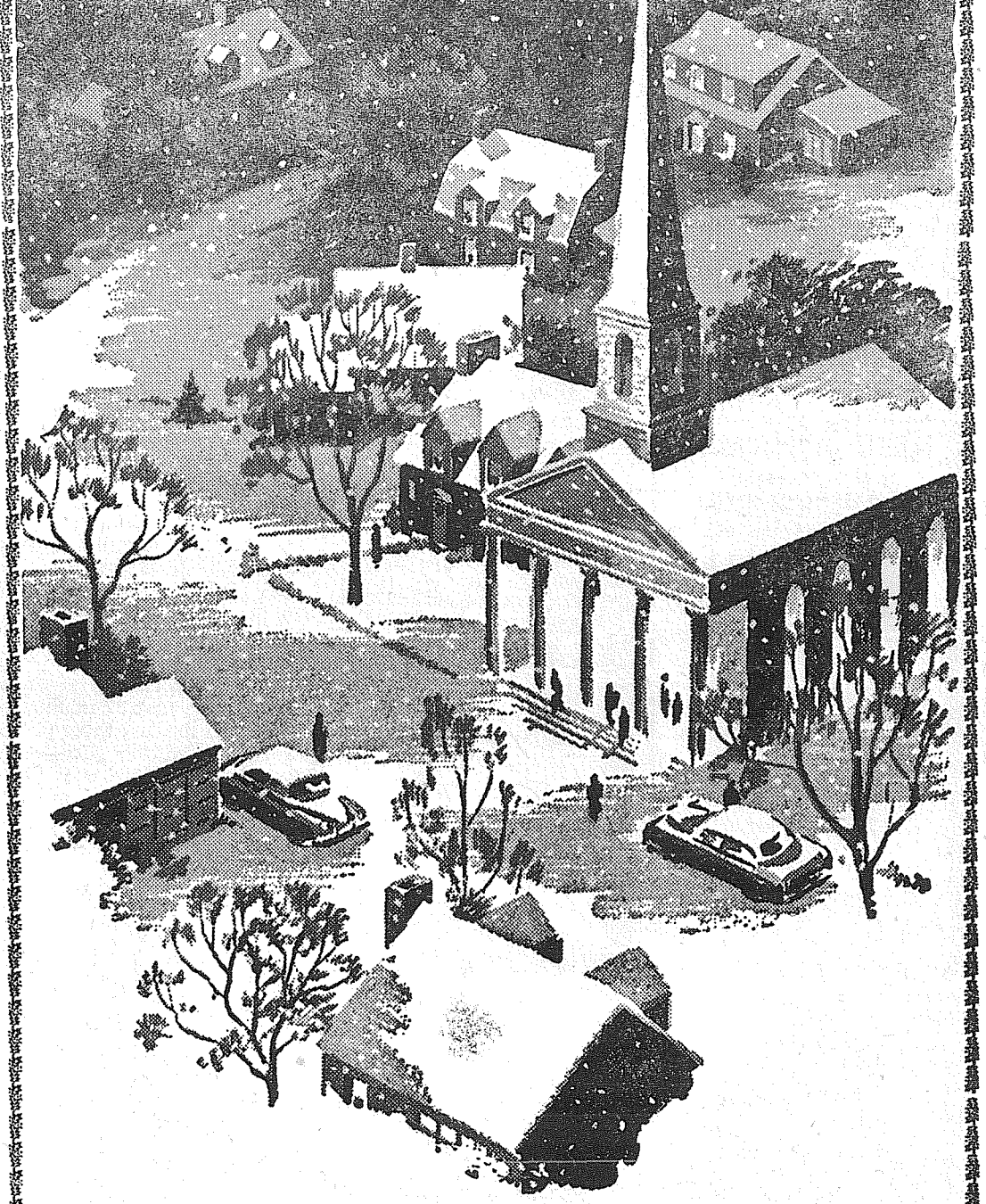

IN THE HUSKY HUDDLE with TIPPY DYE

Probably the most discussed rule change in basketball this year is the so-called bonus rule in foul shooting, whereby a player on a one-shot foul is awarded a bonus shot if he makes good that first attempt.

You've probably already read of several games in which the winner has scored more than

100 points, and a lot of comment has flown back and forth between fellow coaches and in the press.

I currently am serving on the national rules committee, which consists of a coach from each of the eight NCAA districts, along with several other men, and we studied this particular rule, as we do all others, with great care before accepting the recommendation of the majority of college coaches.

In effect, it's exactly the opposite of last year's one-and-one rule, when a player got a second shot if he missed the first. Statistics show that it is worth 6/10 of a point now whenever a player is fouled, whereas a year ago it was worth only 3-10 of a point. Object in raising the penalty, of course, is to make a foul so costly that coaches and players will do everything in their power to avoid fouling and thus eventually cut down the number.

There has been some talk that

the game will be lengthened by the new rule, but that effect hasn't been noticed in our Washington games yet. Logically it shouldn't be lengthened, since many times last season a player missed the free throw and got a second shot anyway.

The rule puts a premium on good foul shooting, of course. Last year our most efficient men at the foul lane were Doyle Perkins, Jim Coshow and Karl Voegtlin. Players who hit around 70 per cent, as these three did, will benefit greatly from the bonus rule.

Probably the Husky who'll score most from the rule, though, is our captain and center, Dean Parsons. Dean set two Northern Division records last year for most free throws made and most attempted, so he's obviously our most prolific foul shooter. On top of that, where he hit 62 per cent last year, he now is averaging about 70 per cent, which means he can pick up maybe two extra points a game.

The bonus rule is in effect only for the first 37 minutes of play, with the last three played exactly as in the past—every foul being a two-shot foul. However, few coaches are satisfied with the two-shot rule in the last three minutes, and right now several high schools around the country are trying the bonus rule for the full length of the game. The report on this research might well lead to the elimination of the three-minute rule.

Job Clinics For Veterans Set

In order to familiarize veterans with job opportunities in Federal service and their many other benefits, a Federal employment clinic will be held in ten Washington cities beginning on January 17, in Seattle. The following cities have been chosen as the meeting place for the various parts of the State:

Seattle, Tacoma, Bremerton, Bellingham, Port Angeles, Aberdeen, Vancouver, Spokane, Walla Walla and Yakima. This announcement was made today by the U. S. Civil Service Commission in cooperation with the various Veterans organizations as well as Federal and State agencies. Two meetings will be held in each of the cities, a technical meeting in the afternoon particularly for service officers and personnel officers of Federal, State and private industries, and an open meeting in the evening to which all Veterans will be invited. The holding of these clinics marks the second in the series of such meetings. The first was held last spring as a part of the U. S. Civil Service Commission's expanded program for counseling veterans.

George A. Feid, Regional Veterans Federal Employment representative, will head the clinic. He will advise on job opportunities, examinations, qualifications, etc., as well as rights and benefits of veterans' preference in Federal employment.

Service officers, employment chairmen and other interested officers of veterans' organizations are particularly invited to attend, so that they may in turn assist their membership. Information will also be given by representatives of the Contact and Training sections of the Veterans Administration, the Bureau of Veterans' Reemployment Rights and the Veterans Employment Representative of the U. S. Department of Labor, representatives of the State Employment Service, the Bureau of Apprenticeship, Veteran's Rehabilitation Council, representatives of the Governor's Committee on National Employ the Physically Handicapped and others.

There will also be an open evening meeting which, it is hoped, will be sponsored jointly by all veterans' organizations in the city, at which time discussion of veterans' benefits will be held and questions answered. This will permit those who cannot attend the afternoon meeting to become informed and have their specific questions answered.

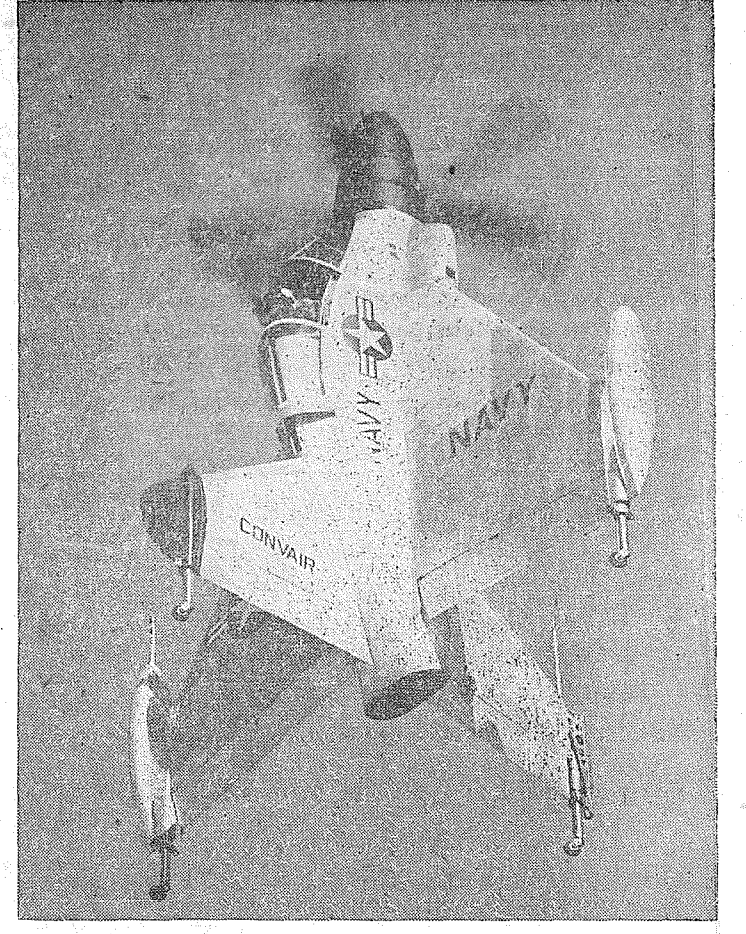

dollar. The new ambulance has
been obtained but tires were
needed, so the cost of the tires
and tubes was the immediate
need. It was understood, how-
ever, that any money donated
beyond that needed for the tires
and tubes would be turned into
the ambulance fund for the nec-
essary running expenses.

Mr. Loring's proposition ap-
pealed to a number of generous

The Spanaway ambulance
