**Corned Beef and Cabbage**  
Broadcast: May 10, 1952

1 small cabbage  
1/2 cup water  
2 cups shredded corned beef, cooked or canned

1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup  
1/2 cup Per Milk  
1/4 teaspoon dry mustard

Cut cabbage into 8 wedges and put into skillet with water and salt. Cover and cook over medium heat about 30 minutes, or until tender. Remove cabbage to platter. Stir corned beef, soup, milk and mustard into skillet. Put cabbage wedges on top. Cover and cook over medium heat for 10 minutes. Serve meat sauce over cabbage wedges. Makes 4 servings.




