## IMPROVEMENT DIST. HOLDS MEETING

The third meeting of the Clark Creek Improvement district was held Monday evening, March 27, at the Brookdale Golf Course clubhouse. Property owners present voted to form an organization which would be recognized by the State Soil Conservation Authority. Five men were elected to represent the Clover Creek Improvement district in consultation with the Board of County Commissioners and the State Soil Conservation Authority. They included: B. E. Bassitt, John Richards, Austin S. Reger, Donald Duncan and Harry Sharpe.

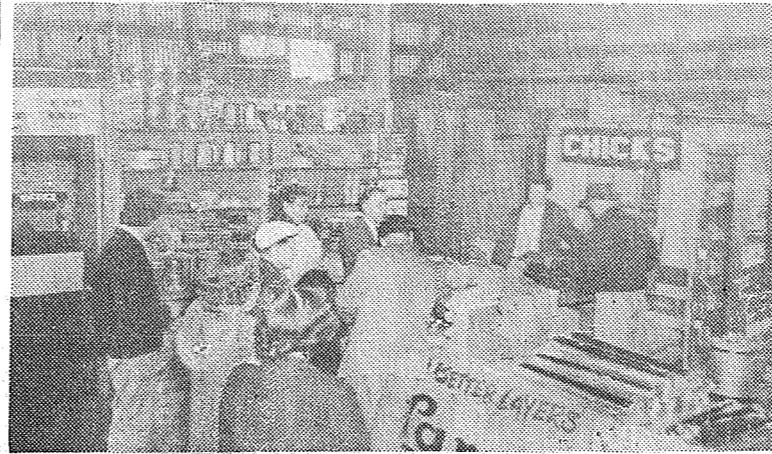
Harry S. Sharpe, president of the club, emphasized that there is no finality to action taken by the committee. "Our only purpose now is to gain information and study the possibilities of effective flood control. We are not committing ourselves to any proposal until we have examined its effect, and all property owners have had an opportunity to express their views," Mr. Sharpe stated.

It was further pointed out that no positive action would be taken without a vote of valley residents.

The next meeting will be held when the Community work is completed and information obtained to the satisfaction of the committee. Members will be notified at the earliest possible date.

Harry H. Sprinker, county commissioner and Mr. Stancer, county engineer, attended Monday's meeting to explain various things pertaining to flood control. Mr. Anderson, the state soil conservation authority, also explained various ways of organizing and obtaining the information necessary to help bring about satisfactory solution to problems pertaining to Clover Creek flood control.

## KITCHENEERS AND LINOLEUM STORE NOW OPEN

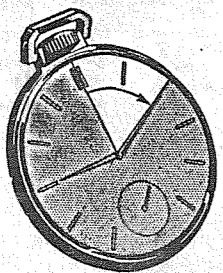

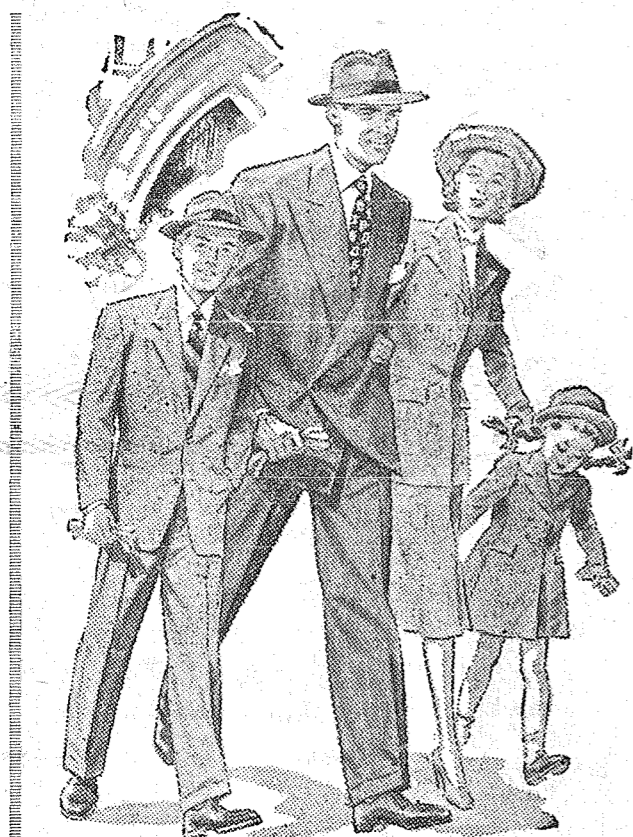



Broadcast: April 1, 1950  
2 cups mashed sweet potatoes, cooked or canned  
1 lb. smoked ham, 1/4-in. thick  
4 slices canned pineapple, drained  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/4 teaspoon cinnamom  
3 tablespoons corn flake crumbs  
1/2 cup Pet Milk  
Turn on oven; set at moderately hot (400° F.). Mix potatoes, salt, cinnamom and milk. Cut ham in four 4-in. squares. Put into shallow pan. Put about half of potato mixture on ham squares. Cover with pineapple slices. Top with rest of potato mixture. Sprinkle with crumbs. Bake on center shelf of oven 30 min., or until ham is tender. Makes 4 servings.  
\*Baked or boiled ham or lunch meat also can be used if baking time is reduced to 20 min.





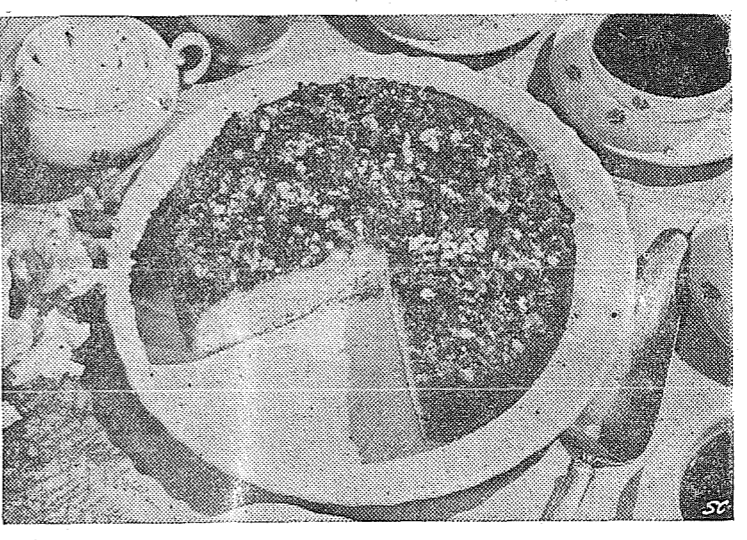

**Easter Morning Coffee Cake**


1 1/2 cups sifted, all-purpose flour	1/2 cup chopped nuts
1 cup sugar	2 teaspoons Royal Cream of Tartar Baking Powder
1/2 cup Blue Bonnet Margarine	1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon cinnamon	1/2 cup milk
1 tablespoon melted Blue Bonnet Margarine	1 egg, well beaten

Sift together in mixing bowl flour and sugar. Mix in Blue Bonnet Margarine thoroughly with pastry blender or 2 knives. Reserve 1/4 cup of this mixture and blend in cinnamon, melted margarine and nuts. To remaining flour mixture, add baking powder, salt, milk and well beaten egg. Beat well. 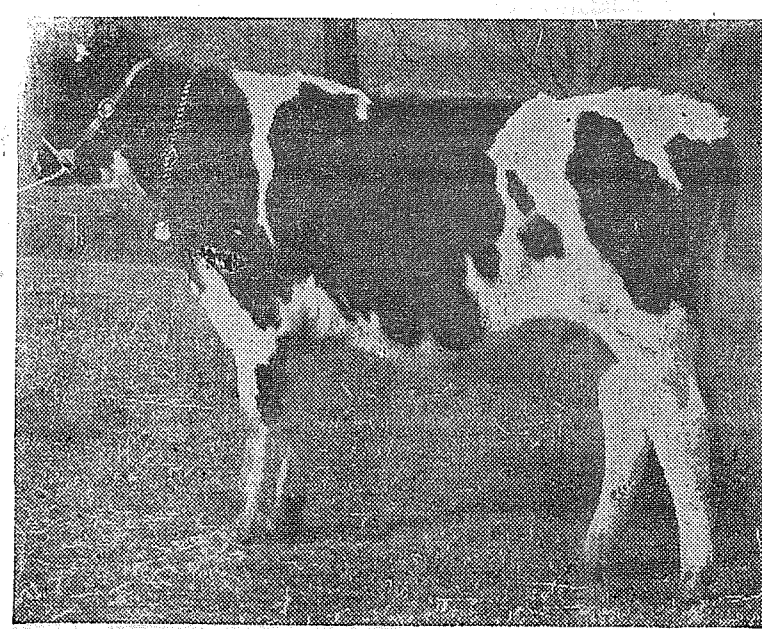
**How to Handle Just-Fresh Cows**

For a month after calving, the cow is naturally in a more or less delicate condition. Nature is stimulating her to give all the milk she can at that time, so further stimulation by feeding a milking ration, may force her beyond the limit of her strength.

This may bring on udder trouble, throw her out of condition, or weaken her so that she may not be able to withstand disease, the Purina Research Laboratories points out.

For the first month after calving, it is recommended the fresh cow be continued on a ration of D and F Chow or Bulky Las and a mixture of oats. This not only helps to keep down the "troubles" mentioned, but being a good body-building, easily-digested feed, it helps to hold on body weight and build up strength lost in calving.

In short, this practice helps to increase production and maintain long milking life by keeping down the "troubles."

**Cows Require More Grain Ration With Low Quality Hay**

A dairy cow should be fed the same type of milking ration regardless of the type of roughage, research has proven, with the amount of the grain varied, rather than the protein content.

The important point is to feed less grain ration with good quality hay and more grain ration with poor quality hay.

The reasons for this, Purina Research Laboratories explain, is when cows are allowed all the roughage they want, they will eat less pounds of a low quality roughage than they will of a high quality roughage.

The food nutrients lacking in the reduced amount of roughage, therefore must be furnished by an increased amount of grain ration.

The latest knowledge of dairy cow feeding demonstrates that rations containing 16% to 18% protein, and high in total digestible nutrients do the best job.

When cows fed medium or poor quality roughage are given enough pounds of grain ration to meet their energy or carbohydrate needs, they will automatically get enough protein to meet their full protein requirements for body maintenance and for heavy milk production from a 16% to 18% feed.

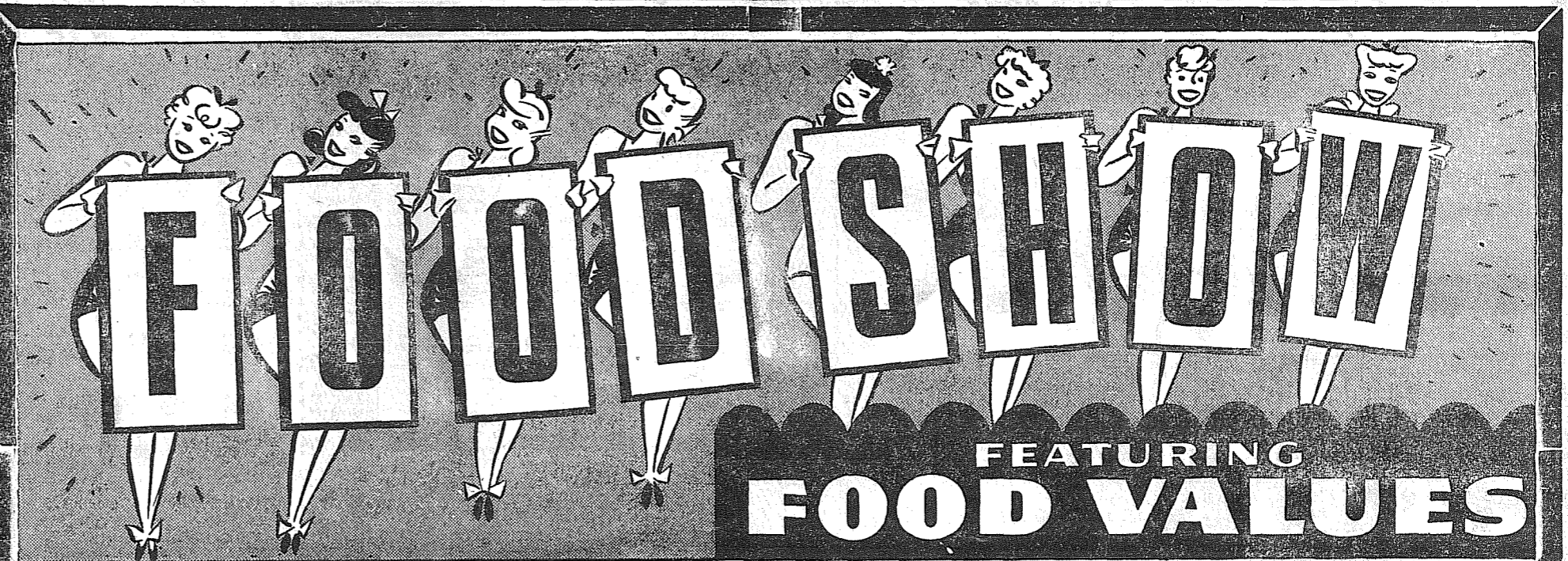
