



By Mrs. Kenneth L. Lampitt, Midland Mothers and fathers of preschool children, do you realize what your Preschool group in your area is for? We have a Preschool group in your

area that meets once a month at the the purpose of purchasing epuipment For example: Some groups pur-

chased outdoor merry-go-rounds, others have small slides and sand boxes. These things are invaluable to the children as they keep their minds and hands occupied. As parents, we want our children

to enjoy every advantage, and the teacher and school authorities have come to recognize and expect our help and cooperation. In our outlying areas, our schools

cannot furnish everything the children need outside and inside the room. Therefore, with a Preschool group assisting, this equipment is made avail-

Last year Central Avenue Preschool started what it hopes will be a continuing project, providing outdoor playground equipment for the kindergarten and first grade children of the school. This equipment will be especially scaled to the size of the five and six year old, and will be assembled on a segregated part of the general playground. Equipment will be those things generally in use on playgrounds and will have the approval of the school authoritines as to its suitability for the preschool child.

This coming year our money-making projects will be for this purpose Whatever equipment can be made by the fathers of Central Avenue Preschool will be acquired in this fashion. Raising the money will be mama's job; spending it will be papa's jobunder mama's eagle eye, of course. Central Avenue Preschool has tried

to provide whatever supplies and equipment our kindergarten has needed that could not be furnished by the school board. This has included rhythm band instruments, records, construction blocks, play corner toys,

In Midland-Harvard, our group assisted in purchasing an outdoor merry go-round and we hope with our project for the coming year we will be able to buy a slide and have our husbands and fathers build our sand

Parkland Preschool has assisted in supplying such equipment as a slide, ingle gym, construction blocks, aquarium and radio phonograph. The principal project for the coming year will be to cope with providing the increasing attendance with adequate equipment and supplies.

Spanaway's play equipment is indoors. Due to the efforts of past Preschool groups, the kindergarten has a slide, a car, a play house, a sturdy Tarzan tower and a slide. Probable projects for the future are an aquarium, records and construction blocks and rest cots.

Elk Plain, being newly organized, is hoping to acquire some of the equipment that will help our children even though at this time we will not be able to have our kindergarten in our own school. We need you, ALL of you, to help

us make our Preschool a success.
