## Saturday Night Dance For Free Ambulance

On Saturday evening, June 14, a big dance is being held in the Metropolitan Park hall at Spanaway for the benefit of the ambulance fund. The dance is a purely donation affair—those attending may give as much as they wish, or nothing at all—but it is hoped that a substantial amount will be received for the upkeep of the free community ambulance being operated by Pierce County Fire district No. 7 (Spanaway) for the help and protection of practically all of the south end of the county.

Good music will be provided by a group of musicians who are donating their services. Lunch will be served. Martin Gibbons, who heads the rescue squad in charge of the ambulance service, urges all friends of the project to turn out, have themselves a big evening of dancing and donate generously to the ambulance fund.

"We need equipment to help you when you need us. Our services are given without pay, but there are certain expenses to be met to keep the ambulance in operation. In the past month we have averaged more than a call a day, have administered oxygen in several instances and have used other supplies, all of which cost money. So, please turn out in droves, fill the hall and have fun. You don't need to make reservations—just come!"

Mr. Gibbons points out that the ambulance is for emergency use only. In cases where time is not important, he asks people to call a private ambulance from Tacoma or one provided through the sheriff's office. In this way, the ambulance is available instantly when needed in the community.

WASHINGTON—24 May, 1952  
Returned from a very interesting trip south. It was a profitable trip, too, from the standpoint of exchange of information and ideas with the staffs of the Naval districts.

I flew from Washington to Norfolk, Va., in a plane of the Navy's Fleet Logistic Wing. I have read previously that a study of air accidents had indicated a greater chance of survival in case of a crash if seats were installed facing backwards, but this was my first flight in a plane so arranged. I found that seats arranged this way cause no discomfort. When looking down at the passing scenery, it makes no difference whether you are looking forward or backward.

I spent two days in Norfolk, conferring with the training staff of the Fifth Naval District and members of the staff of the Atlantic fleet. I had the good fortune of discovering that one of my old commanding officers lived in Norfolk. We got together for dinner and spent several enjoyable hours talking over our 2 1/2 years on the Cotten DD669.

I went on to Charleston, S. C., where I spent one day with the staff of the Sixth Naval District. Then on to New Orleans, La.

I spent a week end in New Orleans. It was very hot, but I had a fine time sightseeing. I walked through the famous old French Quarter with its many old buildings, balconies with wrought iron railings, beautiful patios, and famous French restaurants. I gorged myself on French cooking, particularly sea foods, for which New Orleans is famous. I spent Sunday afternoon riding on an old sidwheeled steamboat up and down the Mississippi.

Monday I spent at the headquarters of the Eighth Naval District and Tuesday flew to Atlanta, Ga., where I attended the meetings of three Naval Reserve Divisions. Wednesday back to Washington, D. C.

I find it very interesting and educational to visit various parts of the country. But one thing I have certainly learned is that the good old Pacific Northwest just can't be beat, for my money, as a place to live.

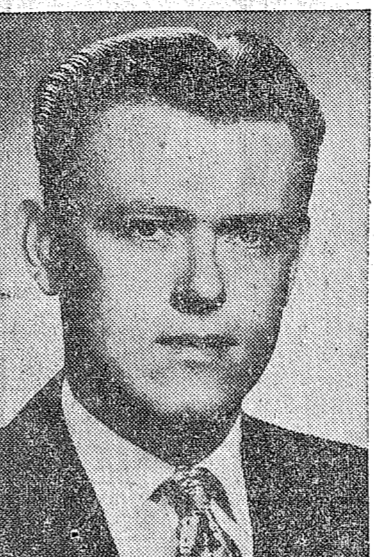

## Eastvold Announces For Attorney General

State Senator Don Eastvold, a successful Tacoma attorney, today announced that he would be a candidate for the state office of attorney general on the Republican ticket. East-

vold's election as a state senator in 1950 in the predominantly Democratic 29th district was the first Republican victory in that district in 20 years.

He proved himself an aggressive and able campaigner and his entrance into the race for attorney general promises to set the stage for an interesting and hard-fought contest.

Eastvold is 31 year old, married and is the father of five children. In addition to practicing law as a member of the firm of Goodwin, Eastvold & Hicks, he teaches two courses in business and labor law at Pacific Lutheran college, of which his father, Dr. S. C. Eastvold, is president.

Eastvold was selected Tacoma's Young Man of the Year in 1951 for his contributions to church and community activities. He is a member of the board of trustees of his local congregation, Trinity Lutheran church, and also serves as circuit president of the Lutheran Brotherhood. He has been an active adult scout, serving for two years as chairman of the Southeast district of the Mt. Rainier Boy Scout council. Among his club and fraternal affiliations he lists Kiwanis, Scandinavian American fraternity, Elks, Eagles, American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars and Sons of Norway.

In announcing his candidacy, Eastvold made the following statement: "The position of attorney general is one of public trust which demands the highest standards of morality and integrity. The constitution and the statutes of the State of Washington prescribe duties and responsibilities which go far beyond being a mere legal adviser to state officials and departments."

"The courage with which he assumes his duties in the area of law enforcement in large measure sets the pattern for such activities in the local levels of government. It is my firm conviction gained from experience first




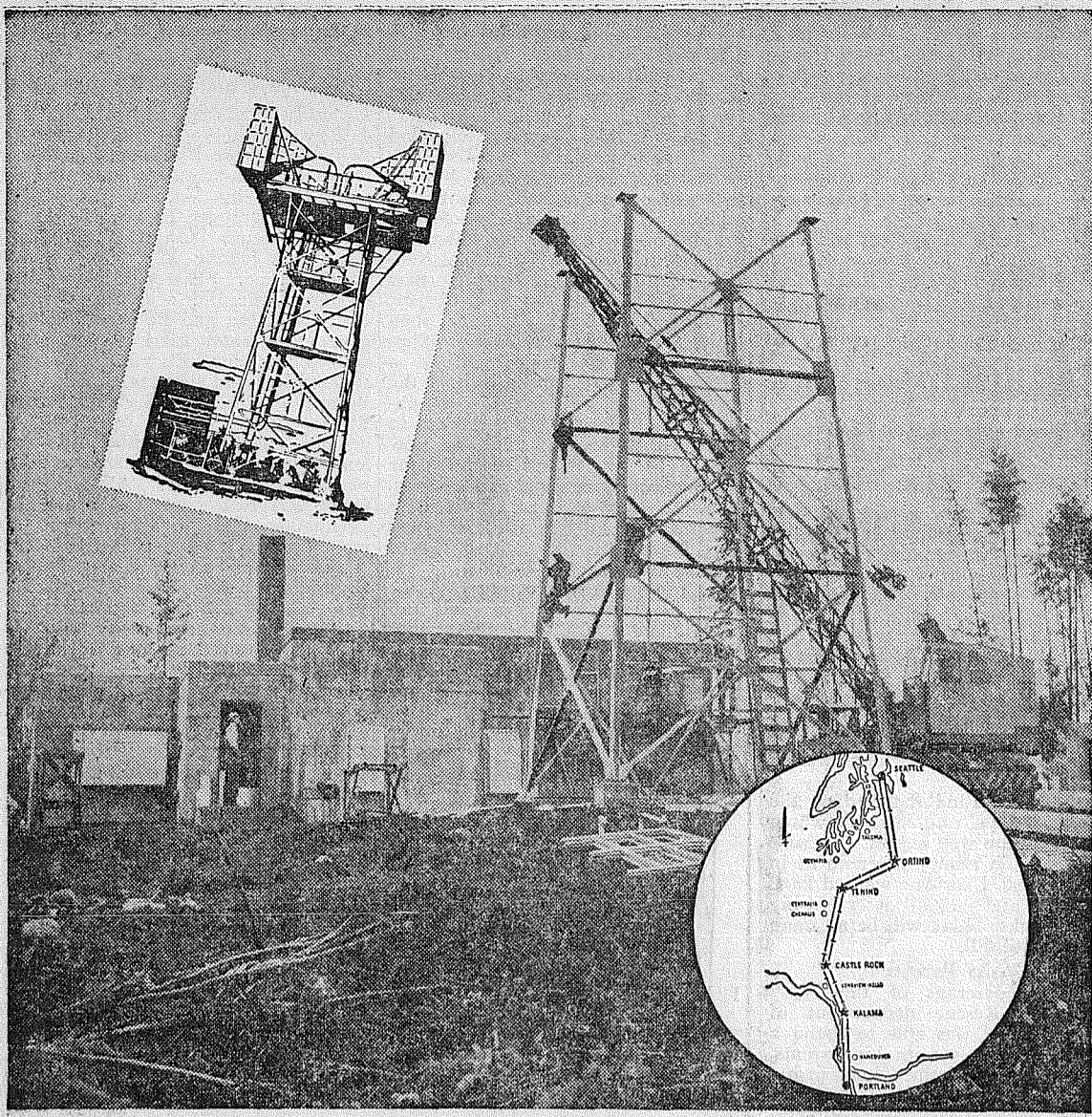

This tower being assembled on a hilltop near Tenino is one of the four being erected at the relay points between Seattle and Portland. The other three sites are Orting, Castle Rock and Kalama. All of the towers are 37 1/2 feet high except that at Orting is 52 feet high. The steel in the structure will weigh 20 tons. Two antenna horns, each weighing a ton, will be mounted on top of each of the towers. All tower construction work is scheduled to be finished by the end of next week (June 7) after which the antennas will be mounted and the highly technical operation of aligning the horns and testing will proceed up to July 6. Also shown above is an artist's sketch of how the relay tower will look when it is completed.

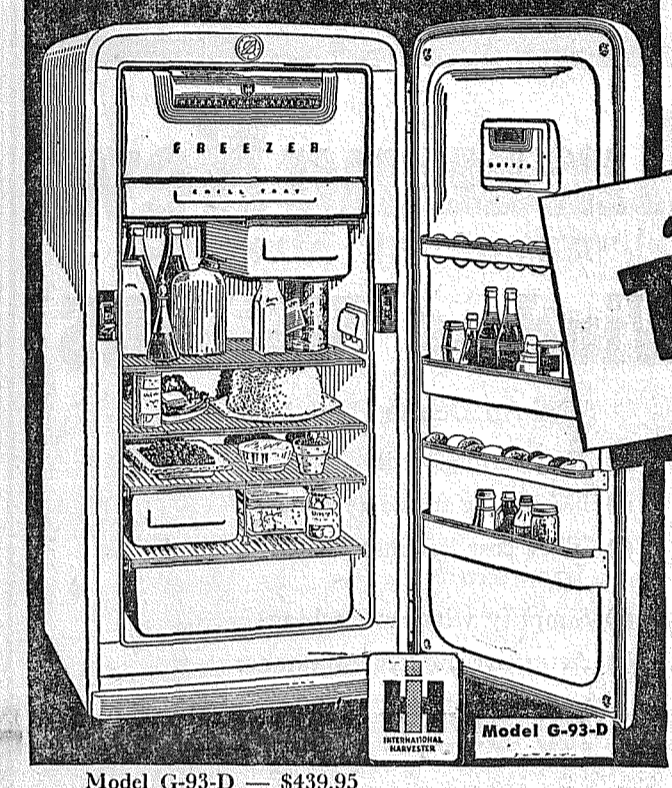

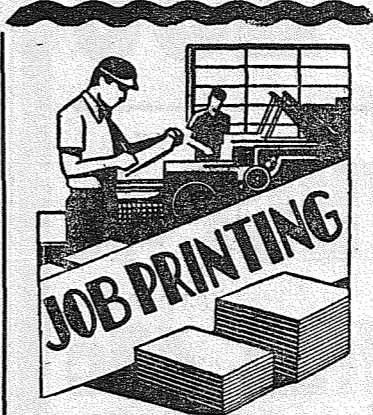
**Plane Tosses Out Flier Then Grabs Him Again**  
 A flier in a C-46 transport recently pulled an "in-again-out-again-Finnegan" routine in turbulent weather over Korea.

The freak accident happened to Capt. Fred C. Seals Jr., of Dallas, Tex., who was making a cargo drop to a Fifth Air Force radar unit in a mountainous area where rough air and tricky currents set the big transport swerving and pitching violently. Capt. Seals, who is attached to the Combat Cargo Command, was standing in the open door of the C-46 assisting the crew in preparing to drop 300-pound cargo packs when a twisting maneuver threw him out of the plane.

"I found myself in midair. I was wearing a parachute and tried to push and kick myself away from the plane to keep from being slammed against it," the captain said.

The transport then swerved in the rough air current and scooped Capt. Seals back in through the side door out of which he had been flung and sent him sprawling on the floor. The plane hit another pocket of turbulent air and this time Capt. Seals was thrown to the ceiling. As he came down a cluster of jerrycans hit his foot, breaking it. (AFPS).
