Spanaway Ambulance on Another Errand of Mercy



The free ambulance maintained in connection with the Spanaway Volunteer Fire department again proved its worth Monday morning when used to rush to the Pierce County hospital nine-year-old Tommy Porter after the child was seriously injured when struck by the car of George F. Timmons of Morton at Spanaway. Hurling 62 feet by the impact when he ran in front of the Timmons car, Tommy suffered a compound fracture of the left leg, a severe skull fracture, deep cuts about the head and internal injuries. Examining physicians state he has a 50-50 chance to pull through. He is the son of Mrs. Rosebell Vera of 175th and A Sts.; his step-father, LeRoy Vera is in the service and now overseas. State Highway Patrol Officers Al Stewart and Riley Bryant investigated the accident.

WWES Open House July 22 Will Benefit Poultry Raisers

Puyallup, July 15—The latest in poultry research will be on display here during the annual Farmers' Field Day and Open House at WSC's Western Washington Experiment Station Thursday, July 22.

Poultry scientists at the Station are working on problems of poultry management, disease control, nutrition, breeding, and egg quality. Here's a rundown of what Field Day visitors will see and hear about.

Wire floor or cage management is being compared to litter management for laying chickens. During the past four years, pullets have been raised on range and on wire and then housed in a conventional laying house on litter, and in wire floored community cages indoors and outdoors. Range-reared pullets laid best two of those years, wire floor raised birds

best the other two years. High winds and low temperatures definitely seemed to cut egg production of birds maintained in outdoor cages. In mild winters, however, about equal egg production was obtained with all three groups, according to R. S. Hansen, in charge of Management investigations.

Gordon E. Bearse, Poultryman of the Station, indicates that an extensive experiment testing the value of different levels of antibiotics in the diet of laying hens will be open for inspection. Antibiotics have proven to be a big help in raising young chicks, reducing mortality and stepping up growth rate. The question is—Will they reduce mortality and increase the number of eggs produced by laying hens? The experiment hasn't progressed far enough as yet to determine if the antibiotics will be of any value. Nevertheless, poultrymen of the area should be

Window Display To Feature Stojack Awards

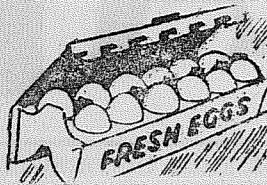

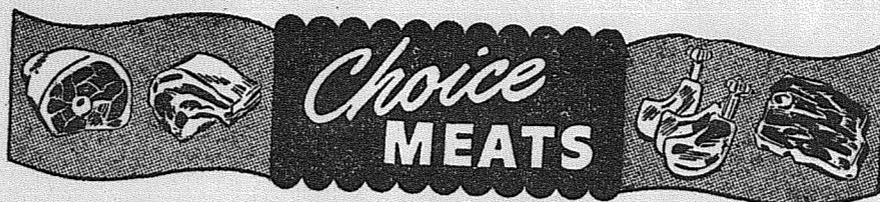

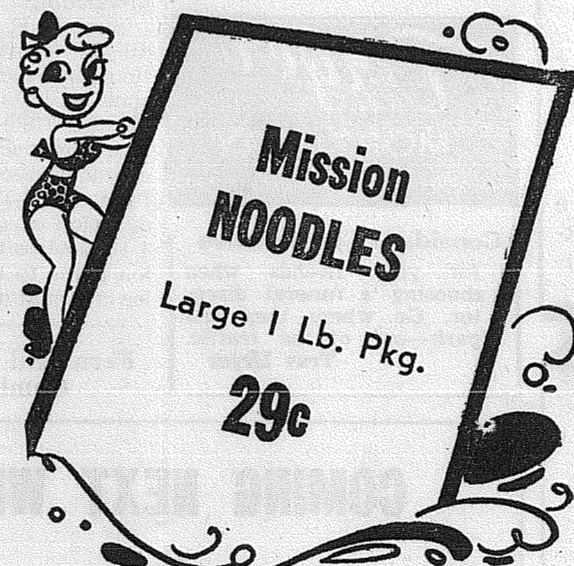

The choir is sponsoring a cruise through Puget sound on the Gallant Lady on August 8. Tickets may be purchased from the choir members. Just keep the date open.

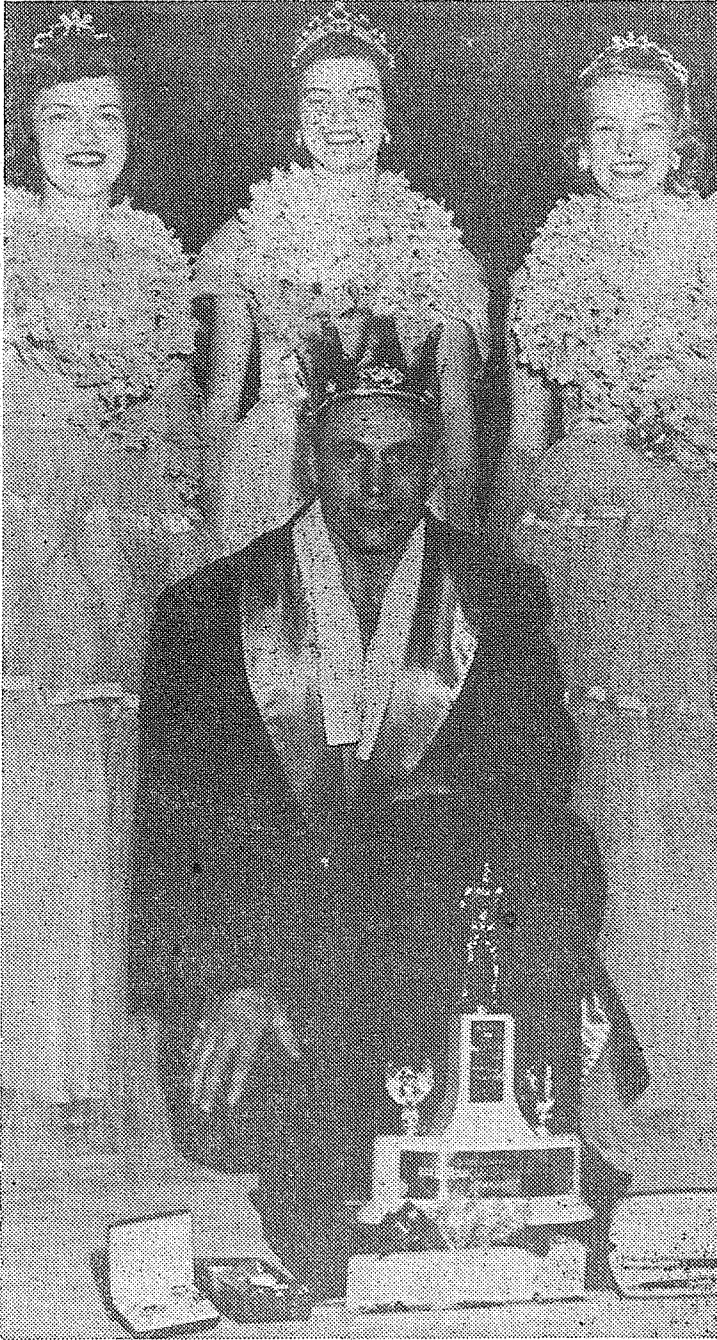
