**Woodland Scouts On Weekend Trip**

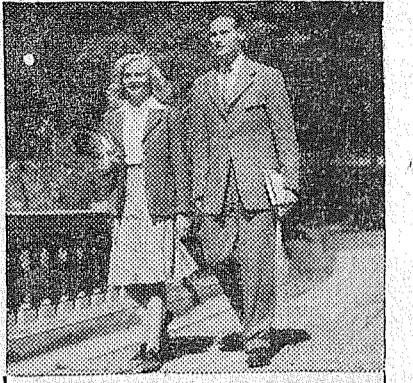

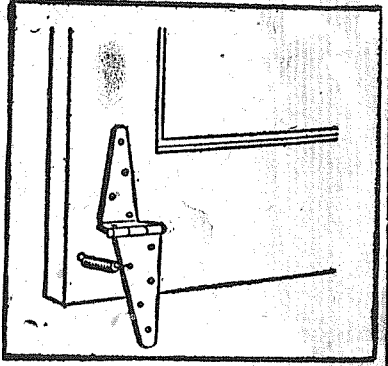

**Door Stop for Garage or Barn**  
An easy way of controlling an open garage or barn door is illustrated. Bend one side of a strap hinge, attaching the bent half to the door with screws so that the straight end touches the ground at 45 degrees.



Fasten a short piece of coil spring to the door and loose end of the hinge. The spring will hold the door stop in place on the ground. It also will cause it to snap back after the hinge has been flipped up to move the door. This is strictly a "do action" device which is cheap and always works.
