**Jellied Grapefruit Salad**  
Broadcast: November 25, 1950  
No. 2 can grapefruit segments 1/4 teaspoon salt  
1 package lemon 1 cup cold Pet Milk  
2 tablespoons lemon juice 1/2 cup finely cut celery  
1/2 cup finely cut nuts  
Drain grapefruit; save juice. There should be 1 1/4 cups juice. If not, add water. Heat juice to boiling. Add gelatin; stir until dissolved. Remove from heat and stir in lemon juice and salt. Chill until slightly thicker than unbeaten egg whites. Cut grapefruit segments into small pieces. Stir milk into chilled gelatin; fold in cut-up grapefruit, celery and nuts. Put into oiled quart mold. Chill until firm. Serves 4 for 2 meals.

# Good Roads Would Require Unit System For All Counties

Delegates to the 52nd annual convention of the Washington State Good Roads Association went on record as favoring legislation which would require all counties to operate under the unit road system.

The opinion was set forth in a resolution adopted when the conclave was held in mid-September in Walla Walla. Austin McCoy of Vancouver, chairman of the executive committee, was elected president to succeed David C. Guilbert of Spokane.

Other officers chosen were Douglas A. Shelor of Seattle, executive vice president; Lewis Show of Seattle, treasurer; Hub Holmes of Ellensburg, Olaf E. Casking of Seattle, M. J. Schmitt of Port Angeles, A. R. Nieman of Vancouver, Louis Bovee of Cashmere and Leon E. Titus of Tacoma, all vice presidents. Clayton Speck of Sunnyside will be chairman of the executive committee.

Olympia was chosen the 1951 convention city.

A number of other resolutions were adopted in addition to the one favoring statewide road administration under the unit system. Legislation was recommended which would allow for the formation of local improvement districts outside incorporated

cities and towns. Areas forming such LID's would provide for the cost of construction and improvement of local roads and streets.

The Association favored establishment of a highway commission which would have actual control and direction of the highway department. The body would be composed of five members appointed at large by the governor for six-year terms.

Amendment of the present laws to extend the application of the controlled access principle to present streets and highways as well as to new routes was sought in a resolution.

The secretary of defense was requested to declare the Pasco-Kennebec bridge under the highway act which was recently passed by congress. Such a step would bring additional funds for the bridge. Also in the field of bridges, the Association favored construction of the necessary bridges and tunnels in the Puget Sound area which may be recommended by the toll bridge authority.

The legislature's joint fact-finding committee on highways, streets and bridges was urged in a resolution to complete adequate studies of tax income and road needs to provide the 1951 legislature with accurate figures to set up financing for essential roads in areas to be irrigated under the Columbia Basin project in the next three years.

That same committee was asked in a resolution to consider seriously supplementing highway funds currently available by issuing bonds to be paid off over a period of years from the receipts to the motor vehicle fund.

Another resolution called for the appropriation of highway funds by the legislature to be based on the budget presented by the highway department, and granted in a lump sum to the department.

speeds of vehicles using streets and highways was emphasized in a resolution favored by the Roads Association. The group named the Washington State Patrol and highway department to enforce the laws. The resolution further provided that the legislature make available any additional funds needed, and penalties for violation of such laws should be increased.

Amendment of present laws was recommended so that it would be economically feasible for private capital to be invested in state parks for hotel and other tourist accommodation development.

Another resolution recommended to the legislature was that sufficient funds be set aside to conduct adequate license examinations for new drivers and for the re-examination of accident-prone drivers. Other funds for the re-establishment of a vehicle safety inspection program also were requested.

Enabling legislation for cities to provide for off-street parking was recommended with a view toward expediting the flow of traffic.

Former WSACC President W. A. Galbraith, in speaking at the annual banquet, stressed the importance of every segment of a road system and explained how it fit into the picture on the whole. As a river depends upon its tributaries for its life blood, so does a major highway depend upon its arterials, he said. In speaking of administration, good local autonomy is needed—a maximum of local autonomy, he emphasized.

## Country Needs Two-Party System

Only woman in the U. S. Senate—Mrs. Margaret Smith of Maine—believes very strongly that our country needs two good and strong political parties, and that neither of them should stay in power too long. "A change is good in politics, as in most other things," she says.

Hundreds of letters have come to her since then, from Democrats and Republicans all over the country. Eight to one, she approves her view that decency comes first.

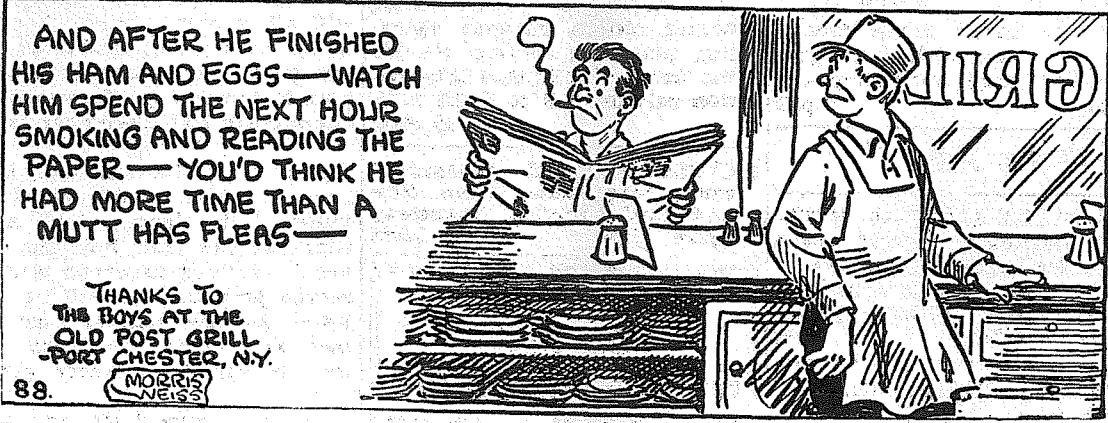

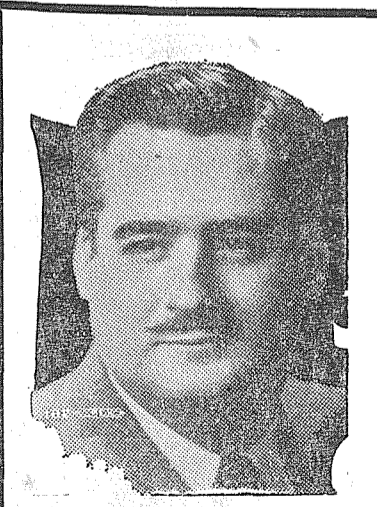

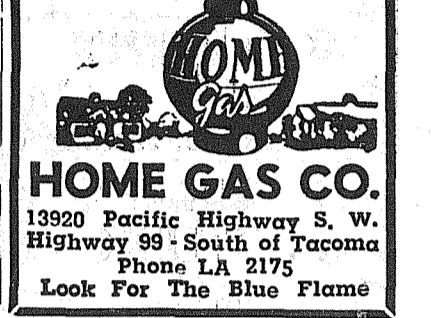
**Entrance Age For School Will Change Next Fall**

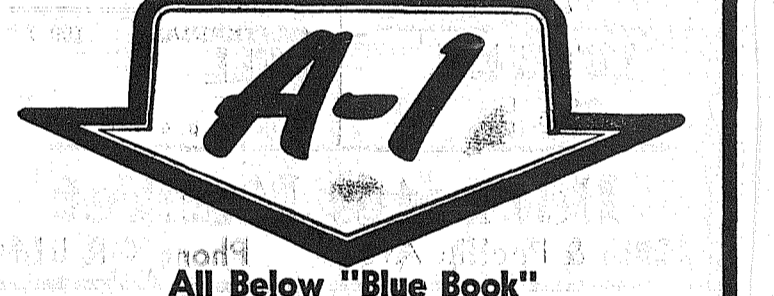

## Your Property Taxes And Duties of County Assessor

by John Schlarb

This little folder has been prepared so that our Pierce County taxpayers may have a better understanding of the provisions of our property tax laws and the duties of the County Assessor.

As the property tax is a tax based on the value of property or according to value, it becomes necessary that some agency be set up to evaluate property. The office of County Assessor was therefore created by the State Legislature for this purpose. Its job is to appraise the property to be taxed. When the value is ascertained, 50% of this value is placed on the tax rolls, whereupon these rolls are submitted to the tax levying agencies for the purpose of

fixing the tax levies. The Assessor has no part in fixing these levies.

The Assessor deals only with the valuation columns on your tax statements. The law makes it mandatory upon him to assess property at 50% of its fair value and the courts have construed the words "fair value" to mean market value. The law reads that fair value is that value for which the property would be taken in payment of a just debt from a solvent debtor. The duties of the Assessor as they apply to fixing assessed valuations, are clearly prescribed by law, as the reader can see.

Question: When should complaints by the taxpayer be directed to the Assessor's office?

Answer: Only when there is good reason for believing that his property has been overvalued by the Assessor. If it can be shown that it can be re-

placed for a less amount than the full value placed upon it by the Assessor's office, or if it will not sell for as much as the total value placed upon it by this office then you, Mr. Taxpayer, have cause for complaint, and this complaint should be registered with the Assessor. It, however, the Assessor's valuations are fair and are in accordance with what the law provides, then do not direct complaints about higher taxes to this office. Taxes are not the concern of the Assessor. He has no power under the law, either to lower or raise them. This power belongs solely to the tax levying agencies of our local and State governments.

Question: When is property assessed?

Answer: Property is assessed every year as of January 1st. The taxes resulting from this assessment or appraisal are payable the year after the assessment is made. For example, the 1950 taxes will be based on the 1949 assessment. This yearly assessment requires occasional inspections of property by deputies from the Assessor's office. Very often these inspections result in a saving in taxes for the taxpayer.

Question: What do I inquire about tax payments?

Answer: All inquiries relating to the payment of taxes should be directed to the County Treasurer. He mails out the tax bills and collects all property taxes. Be sure to furnish him with the legal description of your property when asking for your tax statement. Failure to receive your tax statement will not prevent your taxes from going delinquent.

Question: Why have assessed valuations been going up since the war?

Answer: Where such valuations have been raised by the

Assessor, it has been either because they were too low in the first place, and out of line with other property valuations in the county, or because market values have been going up. An increase in market values always calls for an increase in assessed valuations, under the law, regardless of the need for taxes. Added improvements, of course, may add to your valuation.

Question: Why have taxes been going up?

Answer: Either because market values of property have been going up, which means higher assessed valuations, or because of higher tax levies. The voting of higher tax levies by the voters themselves accounts for many of the higher temporary tax raises.

Question: Why have more taxes been needed?

Answer: Because of the mounting costs of government caused by inflation. School costs have also greatly increased as a result of the big jump in school attendance. Let us not overlook the fact that the present tax dollar which goes to the county, municipalities, state and public schools, buys only about half of what it bought during the pre-war period. Your local public officials cannot be held accountable for this reduction in the buying power of the tax dollar.

Question: Does the Assessor's office employ trained, experienced and qualified appraisers to value property?

Answer: Yes. No field deputy is ever sent out by the Assessor's office to appraise property before he is first trained for the work or has had previous experience in the art of appraising. The heads of all appraisal departments have had many years of real estate and appraising experience before coming to the Assessor's office. They can

qualify in any court. Many of the field deputies have had building and real estate experience and some of them have been in the appraisal department of the Assessor's office for as long as thirty years, which has given them most valuable experience.

Question: Is property being over-assessed here?

Answer: Emphatically No! No property in the County is being assessed for more than 50% of market value. This being the case, there is no over-assessment of property. All you need to do, Mr. Taxpayer, is to look at the valuation column on your tax statement for the answer to this question. You should have some idea as to the value of your property.

The Assessor's office has nothing to gain by over-assessing property. On the other hand, Assessors cannot be true to their oaths of office and grossly under-assess property, as some few taxpayers would have them do. Some of us may not like our general property tax laws but so long as they are in the statute books, it is the duty of the Assessor to honestly administer them. He is faithful to his oath of office if he fails to do this.

**HOLDOVERS HAVE TROUBLE - GETTING SALARY INCREASE ..**

Because of the attorney general's ruling on changing a county's classification in which he points out that holdover county commissioners are not entitled to a raise in salary, it is now apparent that holdovers are caught twofold in regard to a salary increase.

Even though a county changes in classification subsequent to new census figures a holdover commissioner may not receive a salary increase since it is a "well recognized rule that the salaries of officials cannot be increased during their term of office."

At the same time, holdover commissioners cannot receive an increase in salary as provided in chapter 200, Laws of 1949, the salary increase bill. Uniformly, holdovers cannot receive an increase in salary during their term of office.
