## More Helping In Yule Trail Holiday Plan

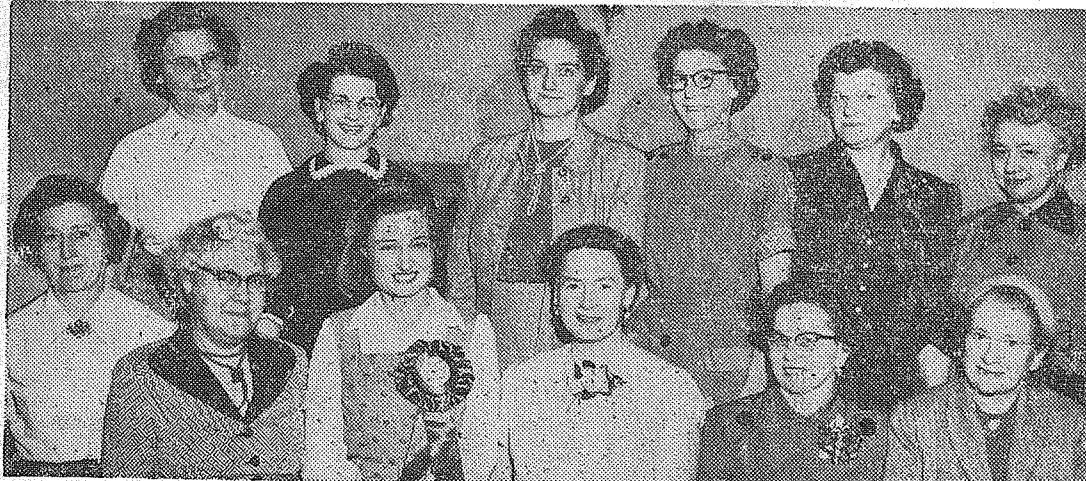
The Yule Trail to Paradise theme adopted by the Roads to Paradise Mount Rainier Resort Association is being accepted along the roads leading to the

### County Agent's Corner

By George Purcell  
Did you ever hear of personal friendships explained in banking terms of credits and debits? Here is a little different twist to an old story I ran across the other day.

"People consciously or unconsciously seem to recognize and repay social debts as well as financial ones. If this is true we might assume people can accumulate or bank social credit like financial credit with other individuals. Then it follows that those having a stock of social credit can expect a favorable response when an opportunity is presented for social payment by those socially indebted to them. Here is an illustration. Recently when a farmer lost his hand in a corn picker his neighbors finished picking the corn and took turns doing his chores until he was able to work again. In a casual conversation with two of his neighbors they were asked just why they had helped Fred so much when they had not helped Joe when fire destroyed his barn. Joe living in the same community had had to dispose of his livestock and his crops remained unharvested because the neighbors hadn't volunteered to come to his rescue. The only answer given for this treatment was that "Fred would have done the same for us", and one neighbor added, "Remember how he pitched in and helped me when Phil went into the army?" But they could not recall any occasions when Joe had helped any neighbors. He had moved out from the city, took no interest in neighbors or friends even though he took an active interest in the community. Another simplified explanation might be that Fred's neighbors were repaying a social debt and at the same time accumulated social credit from Fred. True, it was a spontaneous act done without any other thought than that Fred was in trouble and needed help but he needed help too; yet no one recognized it or they at least didn't do anything about it."

Cattle Records  
Cattlemen are becoming more and more aware that beef cattle like people should not be valued just on looks or "type" alone. Research at Washington State and other colleges as well as purebred beef cattle pays future dividends. This record keeping called production testing is fairly new in this state and this county. It involves the weighing of calves when born, when weaned and when about a year to 18 months of age with all the calves being managed and fed similarly then figuring out the daily rate gains, keeping the profitable animals with good weight

gains and culling out those with poor weight gains.

Daily rate of gain from weaning to marketing is especially important because: 1. It is highly correlated with efficiency of gain and profitability of cattle. 2. It means a shorter time in reaching market weight and condition.

This saves labor and provides more rapid turnover in capital. It has been found that daily rate of gain 70% heritable. This means that 70% of gains of above average gaining cattle can be expected to result from heredity of stock saved as breeders. It does not mean feed, care and management are not important. But type is important and needs careful consideration in right perspective so we also grade cattle for type in production testing. Other characteristics some cattlemen are keeping tab on are barren cows, poor-milking cows, late calving cows, "spooky" (nervous) cattle, fighters - these can cause great injuries and expensive handling time, off-type cows those lacking size, and lacking width and depth in rib and heart.

Recently I have worked with Frank and Andrew Chopic of Lacamas - Angus breeders and Otto Reise of McMillin - Hereford breeder in the grading of this year's calves. These calves were weighed at the same time to get the weaning weights. Both herds had uniform quality calves. One of the calves dropped last March 8 weighed 658 lbs. last week. This means a better than two pound average daily gain which is very good.

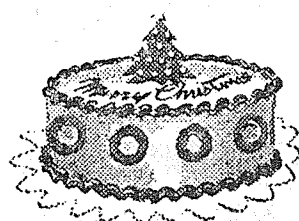

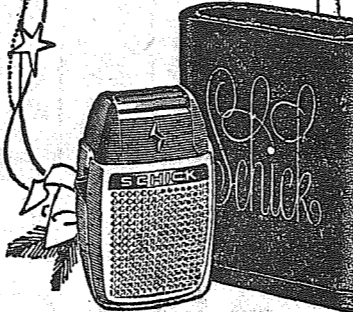

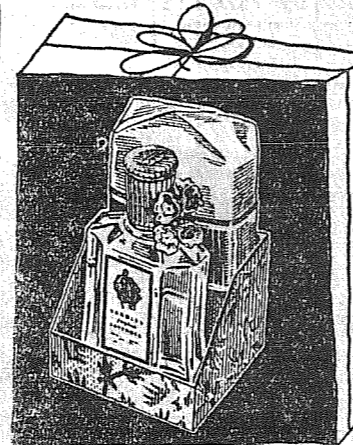
