Drain beans and save liquid. There should be 1 cup. If not, add water. Mix flour, salt, paprika and pepper on a piece of paper. Pound flour mixture into both sides of meat with edge of a small plate or saucer. Mix with the milk any flour that is left from pound. milk any flour that is left from pounding meat. Let stand. Brown meat slowly on both sides in hot fat in a skillet. Drain off all fat. Add onion and the 1 cup bean liquid. Cover and cook over medium heat about 45 minutes, or until meat is tender. Put meat on a warm platter. Stir milk mixture and beans into liquid in skillet. Heat slowly 10 minutes. Serve hot with the pork steaks.



Correction



The middle of September is a good time to start using lights on the pullet flock. Layers need a 13-hour day to maintain top production. 


