



3 tablespoons grated
American cheese 1 lb. ground beef ½ cup Pet Milk 7 tablespoons chili 3 cup rolled oats

Turn on oven; set at moderately slow (350°). Mix well the beef, milk, 1/4 cup chili sauce, oats, salt, dry mustard and pepper. Shape into 8 oblong patties. With back of teaspoon, press a hollow in each. Put into greased shallow baking pan. Bake 30 min. Put equal amounts of 3 tablesp. chili sauce into hollows. Arrange cheese on top. Bake 15 min. longer, or until cheese melts. Serve hot. Makes 4 servings.

Judges of the contest are Mrs. Mobley, kindergarten teacher, and Mrs. Sannerud, first grade







A. B. "Kim" Comfort, Pierce

County Republican and long time State Representative, has been "dumped" by the Langlie Machine on specific orders from King Arthur himself. No local publicity has been given to this drastic "Party" move due to the simple fact that King Arthur exercises remarkable control over the "news columns" of the State's press as well as over those who must bow and scrape within the Republican Party. > Those handling administration of the state's Financial Responsibility act believe it has worked out well in its first year of operation. Few realize that 5,600 motor vehicle operators licenses have been suspended to date and these drivers are kept off the highways until they put up adequate proof of financial responsibility to pay for accidents they have caused. Very few changes in the law will be sought of the Legislature, although there's some feeling that the law should be completely compulsory so that every driver would be responsible before an accident occurs . . . not being allowed to put up cash or kind afterward.

Unfortunately license tabs weren't in the hands of every County Auditor by November 15th, the date the tabs were supposed to go on sale. This is attributed to the fact that the state penitentiary had to change over machinery to make the new tabs plus the lack of incentive on the part of inmates to speed up the job. Hardly the same enthusiasm there for a job of this kind as one finds in a private concern. Luckily the rush for the new tabs hasn't been too great, mainly because there will be no LOW NUMBERS on the tabs.

There will be no sudden outpouring of dollars in new buildings at state institutions just because Referendum 8 has been adopted. Construction will follow a gradual process because the Department of Institutions wants the 20 million to go as far as possible towards providing new facilities. Number One priority will be ward buildings for the institutions housing mentally defective persons; but even in this case, it will probably take four to six monnths to get plans off the drafting board.
