The "Fun N Fantasy" theme was carried out in a floral fairytale of color and music for the events.

Afifi Temple - first in adult.

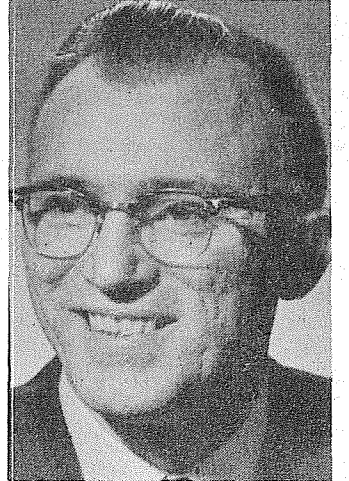
El Toreador of Touray and Longview-Kelso Drum and Bugle Corps - first and second, respectively, in drum and bugle corps.

## Franklin Pierce Supt. Named "Top Innovator"

Dr. Edward E. Hill, Franklin Pierce Superintendent, was selected one of the top "Innovative Educators" in the nation last week and invited to attend a seminar by the Institute for Development of Educational Activities July 16-23 in Honolulu.

Dr. Hill's selection was based on two programs being developed by the Franklin Pierce School District, Project PROMISE (Program Resources to Operate Model Instructional Systems in Education) and Project "Communicate".

The Institute, financed by the Kettering Foundation, invests funds on a national basis to underwrite innovative education. In order to study ways of utilizing new systems to improve efficiency and quality of education, 375 educators who have distinguished themselves by implementing efficient quality systems are offered expense-paid trips to participate in one of three seminars held annually.

Purpose of the seminar is to offer administrators an opportunity to assess the efficiency of current innovative programs, to extend the scope

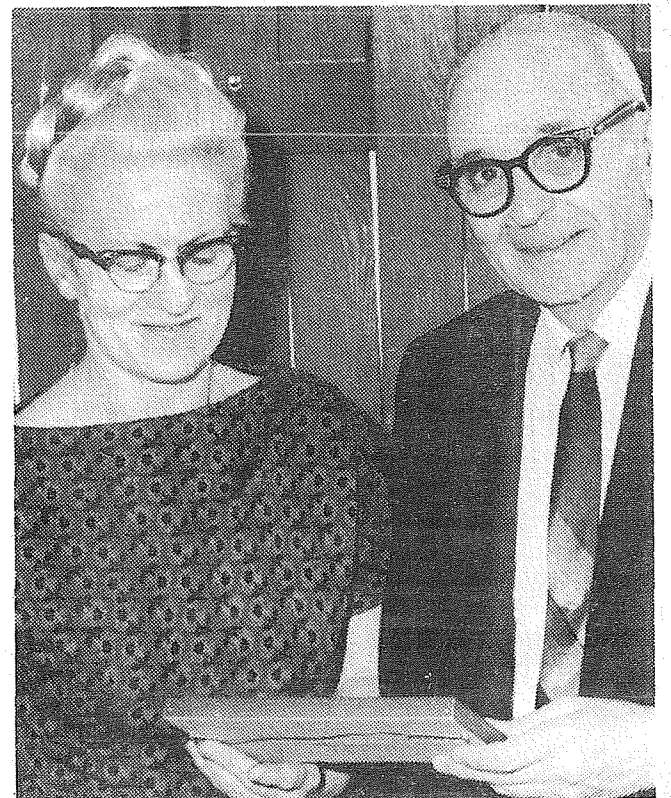
of educators knowledge about educational innovations, and to create a national network of school administrators interested in inventive education.

Project PROMISE, planned for Keithley Junior High, will utilize video tape equipment to evaluate student response to teaching. Operation "Communicate" is a communications system to establish a better dialogue between administrators and teachers.

Dr. Hill's participation in the seminar is expected to receive approval of the school board. The seminar will be held at the beautiful Kamehameha School in Honolulu. The offer was extended in the form of a letter received by Dr. Hill last week and will be presented to the board at their next meeting.

"I am honored by the invitation," Dr. Hill told the Herald, "but it has caused a slight complication at home. My wife has outlined several dozen reasons why she should accompany me." The all-expense paid offer was not extended to the educators' wives. "I expect she'll probably find a way to go," he concluded.

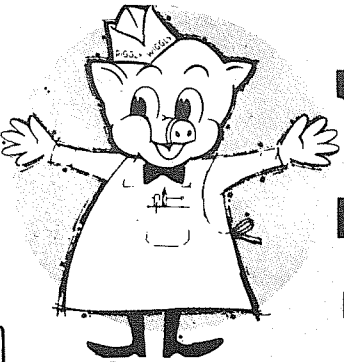

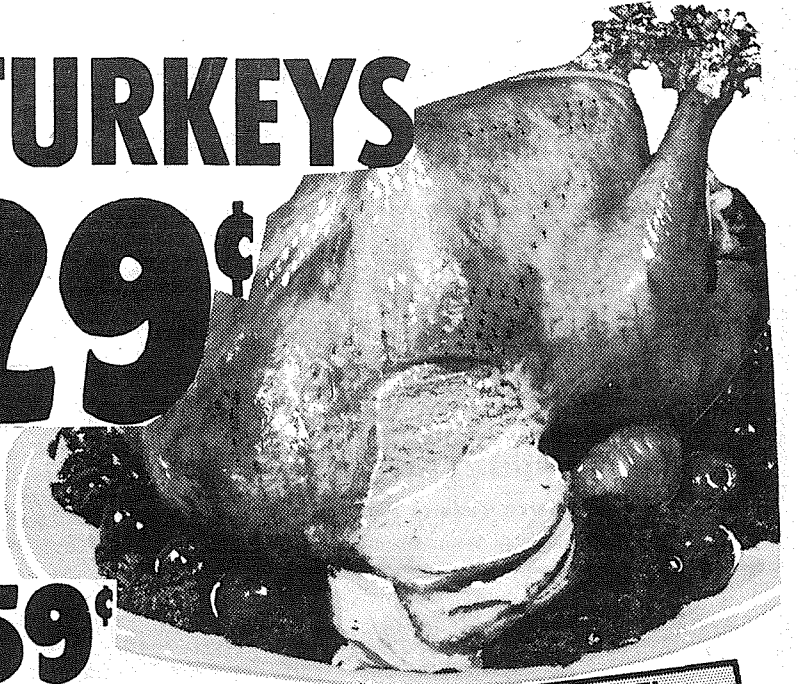

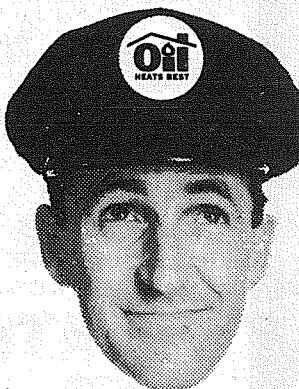

# Suspects Arrested In Market Robbery

Two 21 year old suspects are in custody, and a warrant has been issued for the arrest of a third man in connection with the recent armed robbery of Food King Market, 112th and Park Avenue, Sheriff's detectives disclosed late last week.

A Fort Lewis soldier, who is alleged to be the ringleader of the trio, was arrested and disarmed after a stakeout spotted him attempting to return to his Parkland area home. Arresting detectives recovered the snub-nosed pistol used in the robbery from the suspect's inside coat pocket. He made no attempt to use his weapon.

The second suspect, charged with driving the get-away car, was picked up at Fort Lewis. A warrant has been issued for the arrest of the third partner, a 19 year old California man who received an undesirable discharge from the army March 9th. He was described by military authorities as "a chronic bed-wetter."

The two men in custody have admitted participating in the Food King robbery, and have

been linked with armed robberies at Ponder's Pawnbrokers and McKinley Avenue Tomboy Market, deputies stated. The Parkland man was positively identified as one of the robbers of Food King during a show-up line at the Pierce County Sheriff's Office.

Detectives asked one suspect why he turned to armed robbery. "I needed money to pay the rent," the man replied. After dividing the money three ways, each suspect received about \$156, deputies learned.

The case was cleared through the efforts of Detectives H.E. Suprunowski, E.W. Meyer, B.R. Regan, and R.J. Harford.

PARKLAND - Warrants were issued last week charging two men with stealing office equipment valued at \$650 from two Franklin Pierce District Elementary Schools, Detective R.J. Harford reported last week.

Brookdale and Andrew Christensen Schools were burglary victims the same night. Entry to both buildings was gained by breaking windows, deputies reported.

Typewriters and adding machines were the object of the burglaries. No ransacking was evidenced, Deputy Sheriff Matthew Medicus reported. Medicus investigated the Brookdale break-in.

GRAHAM - A bearded suspect was reported to have taken a goat and two rabbits from the property of Jackline Ollivier, Rt. 1, Box 467, Graham, Deputy Sheriff Matthew Medicus reported last week.

The goat, described as a 2 month old Nubbin doe, was tied to the corner of a pump-house at the time of the theft, Medicus stated. The rabbits were white, and about 4 weeks old.

A passing motorist, who witnessed the theft, said the suspect had a small child with him, and was driving a red-black 58 to 59 model car.

SUMNER - Burglars splintered the rear door of the residence of Larry J. Knoblauch, Rt. 1, Box 137, Sumner, to gain entry and steal about \$35 in personal property, Deputy Sheriff W.D. Stout reported last week.

The burglars ransacked cupboards and drawers taking a Kodak Instamatic Camera and an Unice Electric can opener, Stout stated.

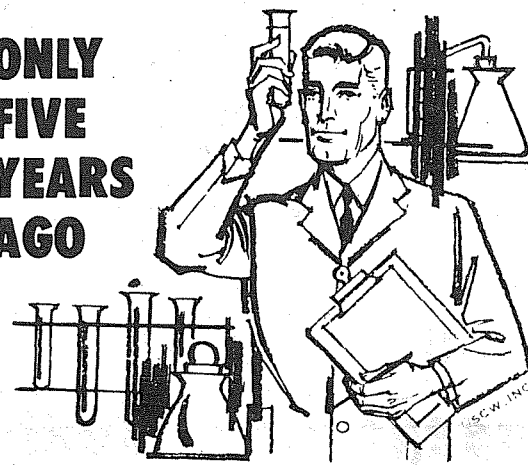

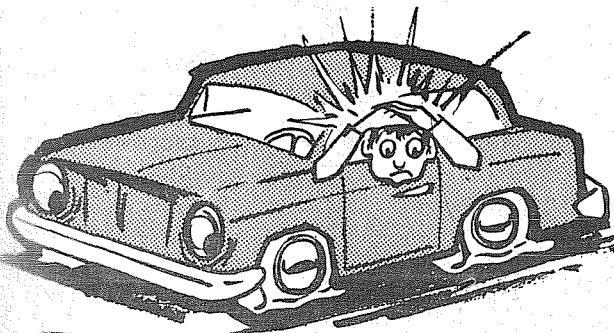

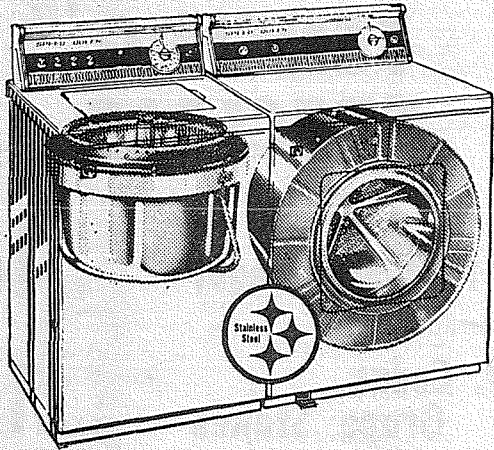
