Joan Arterburn, who has been active in 4-H activities for the past three years, became the new president of the Midland Girls' 4-H club Saturday.

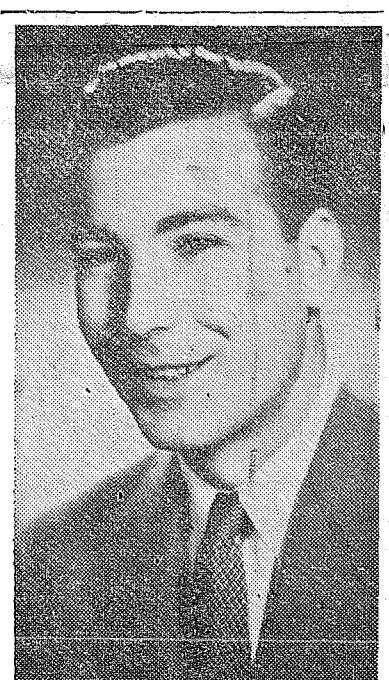

## MEDITATION

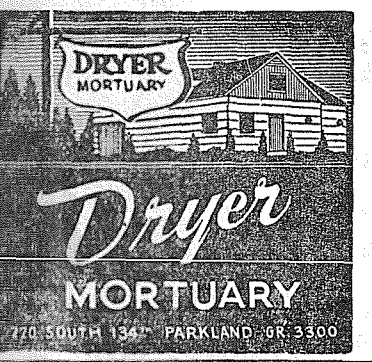
DID YOU HAVE A FIRE?

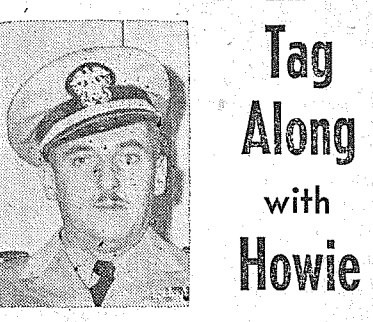

**LETTER TO THE EDITOR**

Editor, Times-Journal:  
If the Pierce county government enacts the proposed new Pierce county building code, it will mean permits, fees, inspections and restrictions to the rural areas. It will apply to any structure or part of a structure to be built, altered, repaired or moved. Building construction fees as follows:  
Fifty dollars to \$500, \$1.00; \$500 to \$1,000, \$1.50; \$1,000 or more, 2.50 plus \$1.00 for each additional \$1,000; wiring, two inspections, \$5.00; plumbing inspection, \$1.00 plus 50c per fixture; septic tank and drainage inspection, \$3.00 (now enforced); foundation inspection, framework inspection, completed building inspection.  
Any valuation over \$1,000 shall have two sets complete plans, also specifications as to adjoining property, buildings and roads, with plans for drainage, sewage disposal and water supply.  
Violation fine, \$100 or 30 days in

jail, or both. Each day of violation constitutes a separate offense.  
These are just a few items in the 29-page proposed code. Residents of rural areas will have an opportunity to voice their opinions at the County Commissioners' meeting Monday, Oct. 15, 10:00 a.m., Pierce county court house.

**Tasty Pork Loaf**  
Broadcast: October 6, 1951  
1 lb. ground pork 1/2 cup crushed corn flakes  
2/3 cup Pet Milk 1/2 teaspoon powdered sage  
2 tablespoons finely cut onion 8 small sweet potatoes, cooked or canned  
1 1/2 teaspoons salt  
Mix well pork, milk, onion, pepper, salt, 1/2 cup crushed corn flakes and sage. With wet fingers, shape meat mixture into a loaf. Roll loaf in rest of corn flakes. Put into shallow baking pan. Bake in moderately slow oven (350) 1 hour. Then put sweet potatoes around loaf; spoon fat in pan over potatoes. Continue baking 20 min. longer, or until loaf is brown. Makes 4 servings.
