**RECIPE OF THE WEEK**

**Ham and Green Bean Dinner**  
Broadcast: August 30, 1952

1 large slice smoked ham, 1/2 inch thick  
1/4 cup finely cut onion  
4 teaspoons flour  
1/2 teaspoon dry mustard

1/2 cup liquid off green beans  
1/2 cup Pet Milk  
2 cups drained, green beans, cooked or canned  
1/2 cup grated American cheese

Cut ham into 4 pieces. Brown on both sides in skillet over medium heat. Remove to warm platter and keep hot. Cook onion over medium heat in fat left in skillet. Blend in flour and mustard. Stir liquid off green beans into onion mixture. Boil slowly for 1 minute, stirring all the time. Add milk and green beans. Heat until steaming hot, but do not boil. Put beans and sauce on the ham slices. Sprinkle cheese over top. Serve hot. Makes 4 servings.

Holten, who is serving a 20-year sentence, was so happy to see me that he stretched his arm through the bars to shake hands with me. One must get pretty lonesome for familiar faces to demonstrate such enthusiasm for an attorney who put him behind the bars.

I chided my good friend and colleague, Senator Copeland, about the disparity between numbers of men and women who were in the penitentiary; there being only 45 women inmates compared to some 2000 men. Henry's wife said that this plainly showed that women were fundamentally better than men.

At one of the larger rallies in Eastern Washington, I was advised before the meeting that several Democrats were present, including two Democratic office holders. At first I thought that they had come at the request of my Democratic political opponent to gather what information they could from my talk. I was very surprised when the meeting was over that the two Democratic office holders asked for some of my literature to distribute among their friends. . . . Of course I could not refrain from asking them why they wanted to help me. 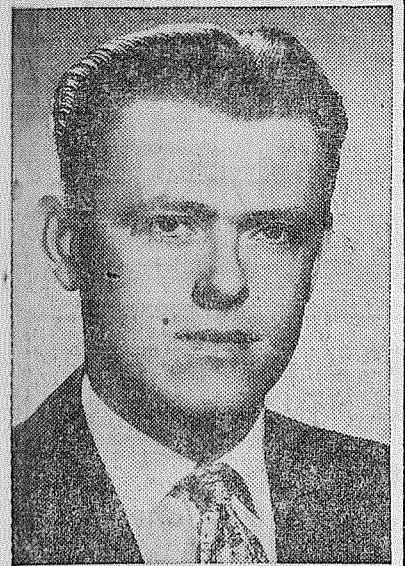
