number of important changes will be coming up inside the state Democratic organization between now and January 8, when the Legislature convenes at Olympia.

Among the most important decisions will be the selection of a state party chairman. The regular term of Chairman Art Garton expires this month. Party insiders still won't hazzard a guess as to who will be picked to guide the Democratic Party destinies for the next two years, but behind-the-scenes moves are under way.

In Seattle veteran King County Democratic Club President Geo. Ryan will also be retiring from office this month. Ryan, who has served 15 terms as head of this key party organization, has been warned by his doctors to slow down. His successor will be chosen on December 9.

A great amount of organizational work must be done by Democratic lawmakers before the Legislature meets. Democrats regained the control of the Senate which they lost in 1946 and will also hold the upper hand in the House.

House Speaker, Senate Pro-tem President and majority leaders will havve to be decided upon before the opening gavel bangs in January. Democratic majority in the Senate is slim and party



In fact, Pasadena has accomplished more in the 18 years of Council-Manager government than it did in the preceding 35

years under the old system. So you can see that if Puyal-lup adopts the Council-Manager

Plan it is not just another experiment, but a form of Government that is sound and will bring Civic minded men into office instead of just Politicians.

The state of Maine is going all out for Council-Manager city government. Today there are well over 100 cities who have adopted the plan and these are being added to daily. This frugal and conservative state is kicking over tradition by attempting to abolish politics in town government. Furthermore, Maine is not leaving it to happenstance to find trained people to take over municipal reins. The University of Maine offers a complete course of four or more years in "Public Management," which turns out men steeped in the A, B, C.'s of building roads and filter beds, and are trained in every phase of city managing from double entry bookkeeping to how to get along with a die-hard selectman, from sanitary engineering to snow removal.

Puyallup in the past year has needed badly a sanitary engineer on our incomplete sewer system, and too last winters snow removal.
