Mrs. Paul Bacon is now convalescing at her home at 72nd and Canyon Road following an operation in a Tacoma hospital.



RECIPE OF THE WEEK
HUSBAND-TESTED RECIPE
by Mary Lee Taylor

Juicy Salmon Loaf
Broadcast: March 4, 1950

1/4 cup Pet Milk
3 tablespoons salmon liquid
1 lb. can salmon, flaked*
1 egg

1 1/2 cups soft bread crumbs (2 days old)
2 teaspoons grated onion (can omit)
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper

Turn on oven; set at moderately slow (350° F.). Grease well, then dust with flour a quart loaf pan. Mix all ingredients well. Pack into prepared pan. Bake about 35 min., or until firm and light brown on top. Loosen sides of loaf with knife; let stand 5 min., before turning out. Serve with slices of hard-cooked egg and creamed peas if desired. Makes 4 servings.
