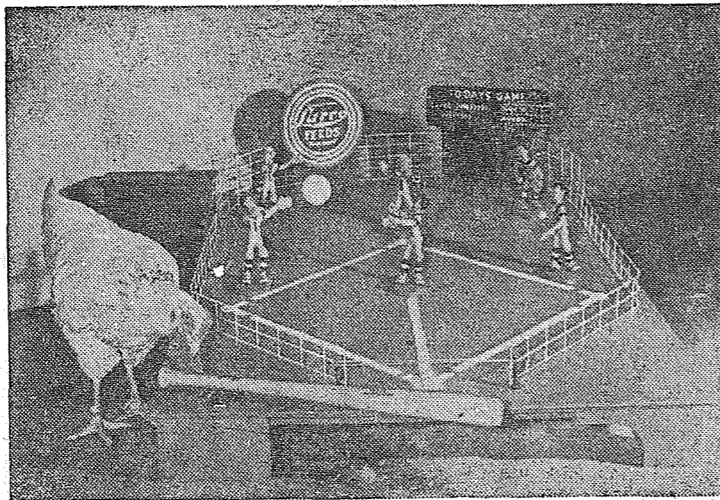

Round-up Parade To Be Big Event

Entries for the largest western parade in the state of Washington are already pouring into the parade headquarters. This year's Parkland Round-up parade promises to be one of the highlights of the year. Under the able direction of Jack Brown, this gigantic parade is scheduled to take place Saturday morning, June 12, at 11 o'clock. It will proceed from 96th and Patterson to Pacific, south on Pacific to 121st, west on 121st to Park, on Park to Garfield, on Garfield to Pacific, and again on Pacific south to 138th and from there to the Round-up grounds on J street. It will be approximately 3 miles long and last for over an hour. Featuring mounted groups, antique cars, floats, bands, clowns, and all that goes into a successful parade, the theme will all be developed along the western motif. Anyone, any

group, anywhere, is invited to participate in the parade. Many of the groups throughout the county sponsoring entries in the Daffodil Festival parade have already pledged themselves to entering the Parkland Round-up parade. Dignitaries from throughout the state will be guests of honor and lead the parade.

Following are the rules governing entries:
1. All entries must be of western or old-time motif, with exception of marching units, bands, drill teams, and official

cars.
2. All entries must be in position by 10:30 a.m. Entries accepted until 3:00 p.m., June 5th.
3. You will be notified of extension by 10:30 a.m. (Continued on Page 8)
