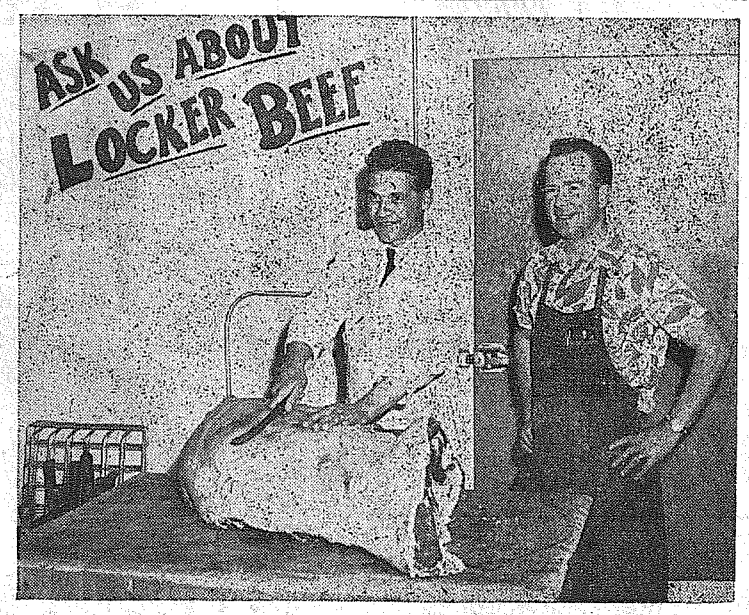

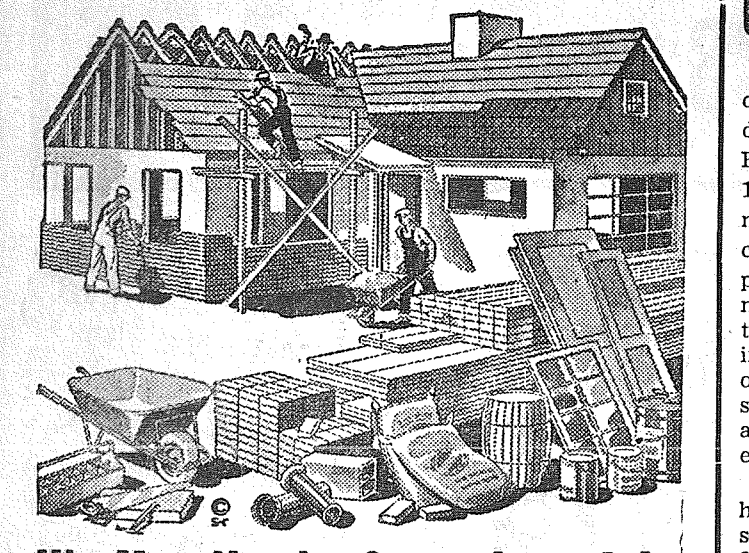

**Old-Time Bread Pudding**

4 slices bread  
(2 days old)  
2 Tablespoons soft  
butter or  
margarine  
1/4 cup seedless  
raisins  
2 slightly beaten  
eggs

1/4 cup sugar  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 cup Fat  
Evaporated Milk  
1 cup boiling water  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
4 teaspoons sugar  
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon

Toast bread on both sides. Spread one side with butter. Cut into quarters and put into greased baking dish holding about 6 cups. Sprinkle raisins over toast. Mix well in a bowl beaten eggs, 1/4 cup sugar and the salt. Stir in milk and water. Add vanilla. Pour over toast. Let stand 10 min., then press toast into milk mixture with spoon to soak up the liquid. Sprinkle over top a mixture of 4 teasp. sugar and the cinnamon. Bake on bottom rack of 350 oven (moderate) about 30 min., or until knife inserted near edge comes out clean. Makes 4 servings.
