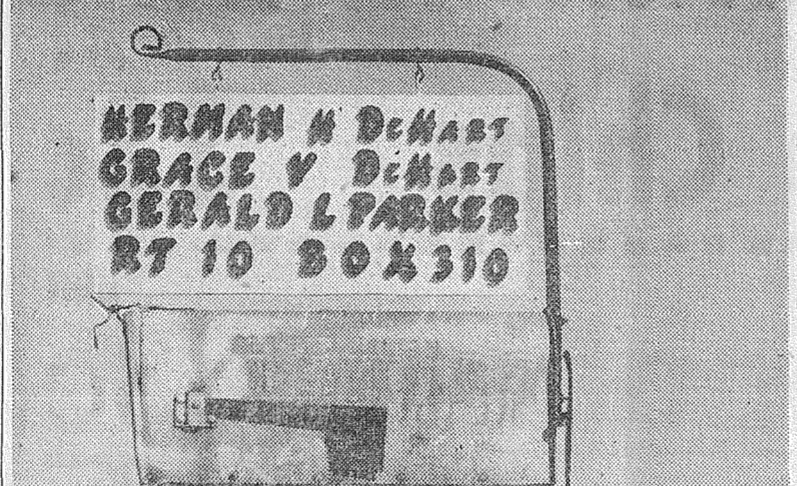
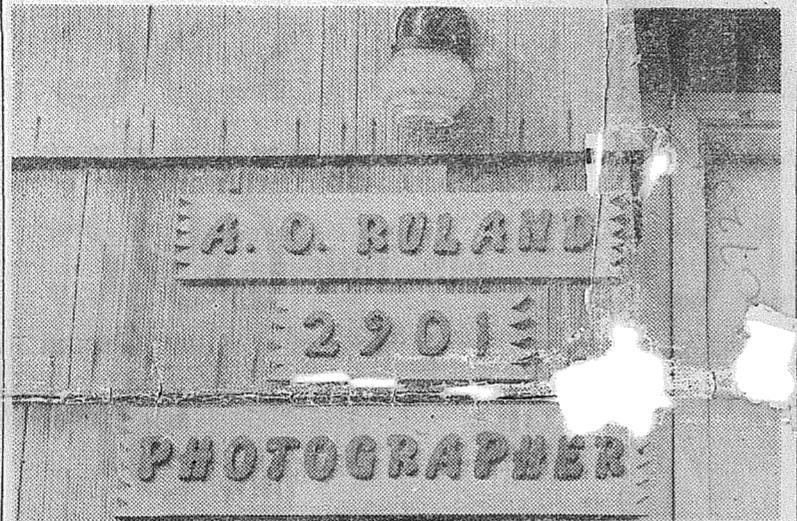

If you like sea foods you will certainly think this favorite of mine is delicious. We eat crabburgers at home, but they are splendid picnic food, too.

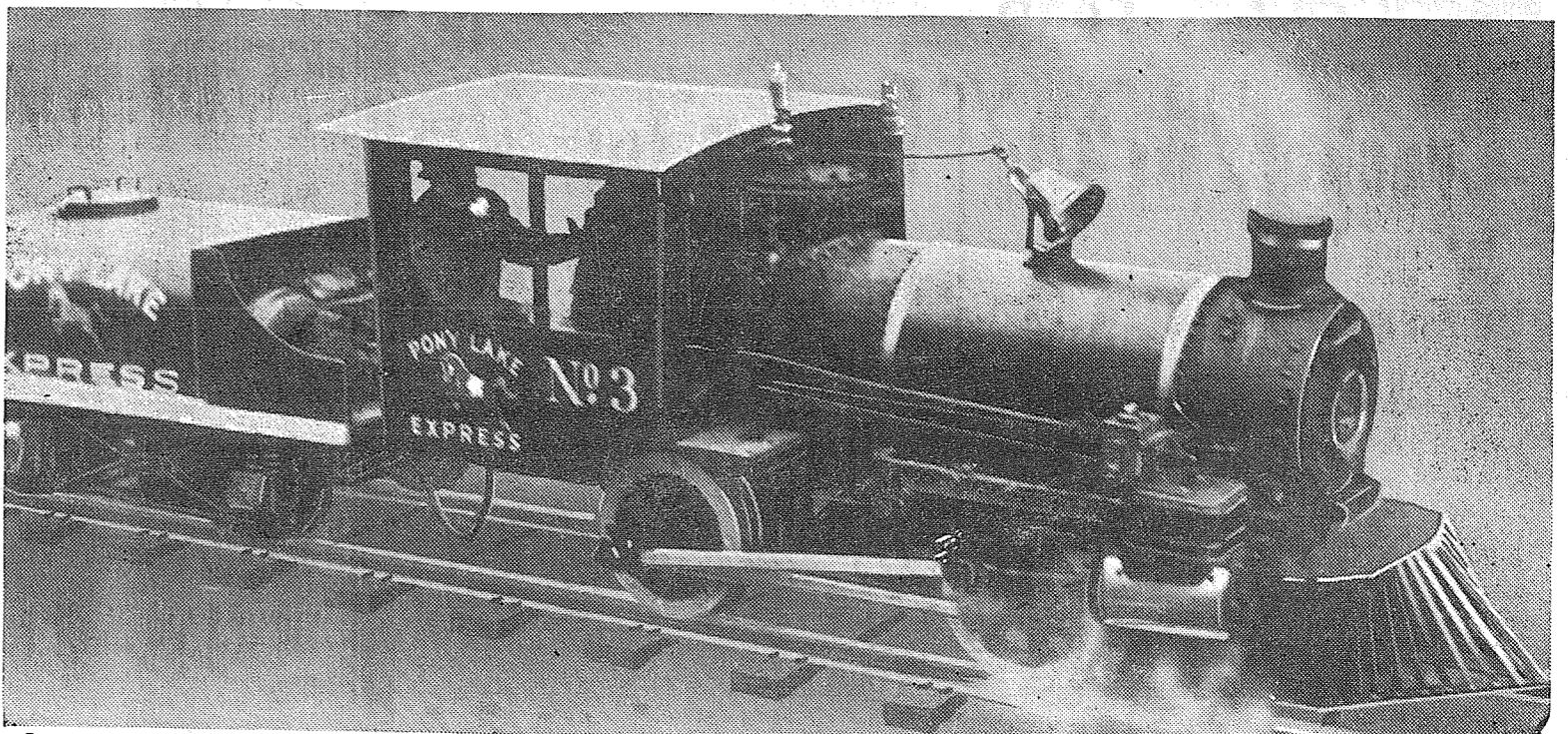

Boy Scouts of Troop 23 participated in the Annual District Camporee this last week end. It was a 2-day session at Little Spanaway.

Mrs. Lelia Robertson of Vickery Road will attend the State Grange Convention, opening June 12th at Everett, Wash. She is going as a delegate from the Waller Road Grange.

Herbert Berchman, eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. David Berchman is graduating from the College of Puget Sound with a B.A. degree. He and Mrs. Berchman are leaving next week for a four months bicycle tour of Europe. Their travels will take them through Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Ireland, England, Switzerland, Holland, Belgium and Germany, where they will take in the world famous Passion Play. Mr. Berchman has been admitted to Columbia University in New York City, and will resume his studies there, upon his return.

At the Waller Road Water Users meeting held May 24th at the Community Hall, the people present voted to purchase the Water Co. The meeting was well attended.

SCHOOL ELECTION ON CONSOLIDATION
 June 3rd, there will be a special election at the Waller Road Community Hall, for the purpose of voting on the consolidation of the Waller Road School District with the Puyallup School District. This election is called by, and is under the jurisdiction of the Election Dept. of the Pierce County Auditor's Office.

The purpose of the movement is for the welfare of the students of the Waller Road District. A small district does not have sufficient flexibility to give the boys and girls the advantages of many educational procedures that a large district can give. Many of the best phases of education are impossible to attain in a small school. Consolidation is not a new movement. It has been operating in this state for many years. Most sections of the state now are quite complete in this respect. The purpose of the consolidation laws, then, in this state is to extend to all smaller district the advantages that are possible when belonging to a

larger unit. It is the hope of the State Dept. of Education in Washington that every smaller district will become a part of a larger district. At present, all non-resident high school districts which comprise the smaller district group, pay nothing towards the capital outlay costs of the district where their high school students attend. Consolidation would require all such districts to carry their just share of such expenses.

Students attending grades one to six at the Waller Road School, now, would continue to go to the Waller Road District. The Jr. and Sr. High School students already attend the Puyallup Jr. - Sr. High School.

The Waller Road District would become a part of the Puyallup District and would be under the jurisdiction of the Puyallup School Board. The valuation would be added to that of Puyallup. They will participate the same as Puyallup in all current levees, special millage levees, and all bond levees, from the time of consolidation on.

There will be an election in each district. It is necessary for each district to vote favorably on the proposition, to have the plan put into operation.

Every registered voter of the Waller Road School District 13 and Puyallup District 3 are eligible. Waller Road residents showed their good will toward Puyallup at the special meeting called, when they voted favorably for the election to consolidate with Puyallup.

It is the hope of the Waller Road School Directors that the residents of the Waller Road District will consider the future welfare of their children and vote "YES" for consolidation.
