Rev. J. R. Butler of the Summit church will take his vacation while

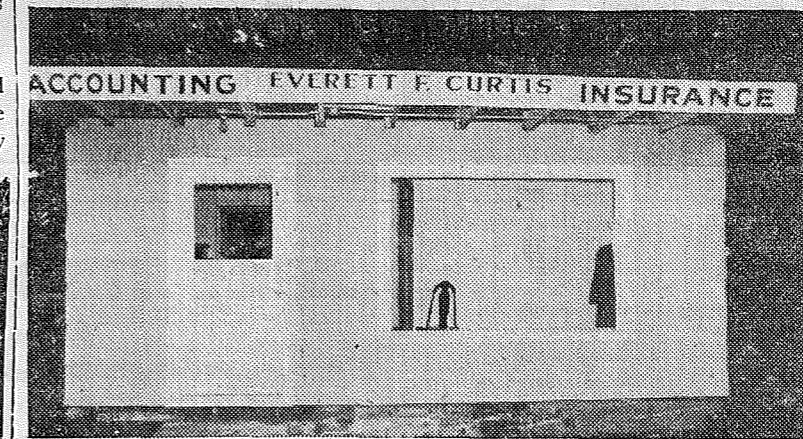

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Spaghetti with Frankfurter Sauce
Broadcast: August 18, 1951

2/3 cup finely cut onion	1/2 cup Pet Milk
2/3 cup finely cut green pepper	1 cup thinly sliced frankfurters
2 tablespoons shortening	1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup water	few grains pepper
1/4 cup condensed tomato soup	4 cups cooked spaghetti

Cook onion and green pepper slowly in hot shortening 5 min. Add water; cook slowly 5 min. longer. Then add soup, milk, frankfurters, salt and pepper. Cook and stir over low heat until steaming hot, but do not boil. Serve on drained, hot spaghetti. Sprinkle with dry, grated cheese if desired. Makes 4 servings.
