Mayfair Market Opens Wednesday

The new Mayfair Market doors at 9820 Pacific Avenue in a grand opening Wednesday.

The new design, marketed earlier, stated early in the ultra-stands have been installed, insuring fast customer service.

Mayfair customers will find the new market area greatly expanded over the old Park 'N Shop building, soon to be torn down in favor of a new chain drug store. The drug store will be built south of the new structure with the buildings joined by a common concourse.

One of the highlights of the new store will be an in-store bakery capable of producing 3000 loaves of bread per shift. The bakery will supply other Mayfair Markets in Pierce

County, Keeler said. "We'll have over 52 feet of dairy and delicatessen display, over 68 feet of fresh meat display, and over 60 feet of refrigerated produce," he explained. Employees and workers have been frantically stocking shelves and putting the last minute finishing touches on the new facility, he told the Herald. "We'll be ready for the grand opening Wednesday," he stated.

Daffodil Royalty To Visit Bremerton

The Daffodil royal court will keep St. Patrick's day Friday at Bremerton, where the city and Navy Yard will host the nine princesses for the annual visitation.

The queen candidates will invite the cross-sound residents to the 34th Annual Daffodil Festival April 1 to 9.

Mayor Glenn Jarstad will receive the court and chaparrones. Following lunch they will visit the Naval hospital, tour the city and visit press, radio and telecable.

Word of the coming festival will be carried to the Rose City of Portland Monday by the festival. Princesses from Puyallup, Orting, Sumner, Fife and Tacoma will make a one-day trip to Portland, where they will attend the weekly Chamber of Commerce luncheon, Hotel Benson.

While in Portland they will also visit the Shrine Crippled Children's hospital, the newspapers, radio and television stations.

News of the "Fun'n Fantasy" spectacle to open soon in Puy-

allup, Sumner, Orting and Tacoma is being spread throughout the nation while the court and Daffodil Festival officials are busy at home.

Distribution of the area's first spring flowers is being handled by Festival Director Gordon Keller at the 16-county convention of the National Electrical Sign Association in Chicago, in session this week.

Further east Tacoma's Mayor Harold M. Tollefson is taking personal supervision of distributing daffodils to the National Legislative Conference of the National League of Cities being held in Washington, D.C.

Daffodils will also be flown north to Fairbanks, Anchorage, Juneau and Ketchikan, south to Salt Lake City and east to Congress. The first day of spring will be celebrated on Arthur Godfrey's national radio network by the arrival of daffodils from the Daffodil Festival.

Every governor and mayor in major cities of the nation will also receive "first day of spring" shipments of Puyallup Valley Daffodil Festival blooms, along with an invitation to attend the 34th fete here .. the "birthplace of spring."

Salmon License Bill To Produce Hot Discussion

CONFUSION over HB 103, the proposed salmon fishing license, is sure to be a subject of hot discussion when the Washington State Sportsmen's Council meets this weekend in Olympia.

The Council has long said that if a salmon fishing license is passed, it should have some strings attached. One is that the license money must be spent for salmon. Another condition the Council went on record officially with last fall, was that a part of any such law should be the formation of a Fisheries Commission, similar to the state's highly successful Game Commission, to give continuity to the management of salmon and other so-called food fish.

So what happened? HB103, a proposal for a \$2 license, with none of these provisions, was entered in the Legislature. Involved in the introduction of the bill were members of the Council's own Salmon Committee.

Three regular resolutions are up for consideration also. They have to do with lake rehabilitation, overlapping of deer and elk seasons, and waterfowl conservation. The meeting is at the Tyee Motor Inn, just south of Olympia, Friday and Saturday.
