Opening Second Fire Hall Summit-Woodland-Collins

Sunday, Nov. 21, will be a big day in the Summit-Woodland-Collins area, marking the formal opening of the new second fire station at 73rd and Fairview. Ash Butler, fire chief for Pierce County Fire District No. 9, usually referred to as Summit-Woodland-Collins, announces that the new station will be open to the public from 1 to 4 Sunday afternoon and that the women of the Auxiliary will serve cake and coffee. There will be informal ceremonies at 2 o'clock to dedicate the station.

The new fire hall, 30 x 40 feet in area, will house one truck, formerly kept at Station No. 1 on Canyon road, one block south of Airport. There will be no "sleepers" at the new station, but several members of the Volunteer Fire Department live near and can be alerted within seconds by the siren and telephone.

The Summit-Woodland-Collins Volunteer Fire Department has 24 members, all working without pay and on call at any time of day or night. Two men are on duty at all times at Station No. 1 and the siren at Station No. 2 is controlled by radio from Station 1. Two-way communication systems have been installed on the fire trucks, allowing constant contact between the men and the stations. All firemen have phones in their homes so are immediately available in case of fire or other emergency.

The new fire hall was built almost entirely with volunteer labor, the allocated money being used for materials and equipment. Fire Chief Butler estimates that the second station in the 29 1/2-square-mile district will lower insurance rates at least 20%, a substantial saving to property owners in the community.

1/2 teaspoon cloves
1 1/2 cups canned pumpkin

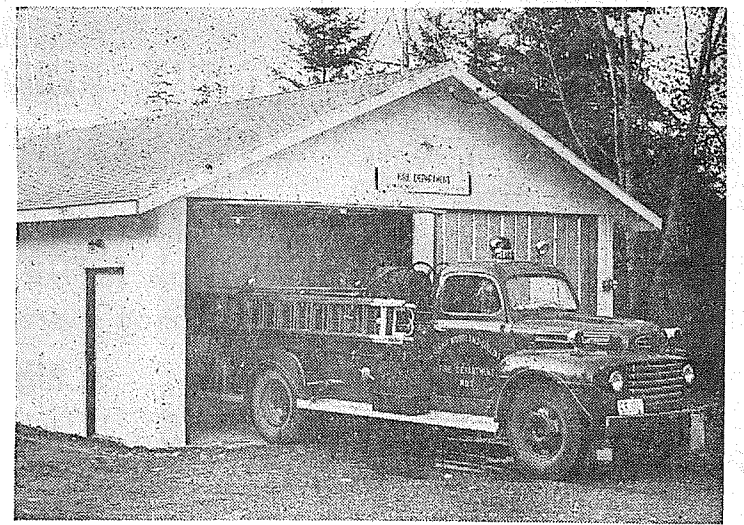
