**RECIPE OF THE WEEK**

**Tomato Rarebit**

Broadcast: April 10, 1954

- 1/2 cup finely cut celery
- 1/2 cup finely cut green pepper
- 2 Tablespoons finely cut onion
- 3 Tablespoons hot fat
- 2 Tablespoons flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup Fat Evaporated Milk
- 1/4 cup water
- 1 1/2 cups diced American cheese
- 1 cup undrained, canned tomatoes, cut into small pieces

Cook celery, green pepper and onion in a saucepan in hot fat until tender, or about 7 minutes. Blend in flour and salt. Stir in a mixture of milk and water. Bring to a boil over medium heat, stirring all the time. Then cook and stir until thickened, or about 2 minutes. Add cheese. Stir over low heat until cheese melts. Stir in tomatoes gradually. Cook and stir over low heat until steaming hot; do not boil. Spoon hot rarebit over crisp toast or canned chow mein noodles. Makes 4 servings.

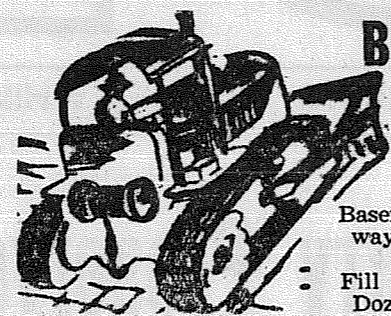

**Citizens' Group Asks Help On Spanaway Debt**

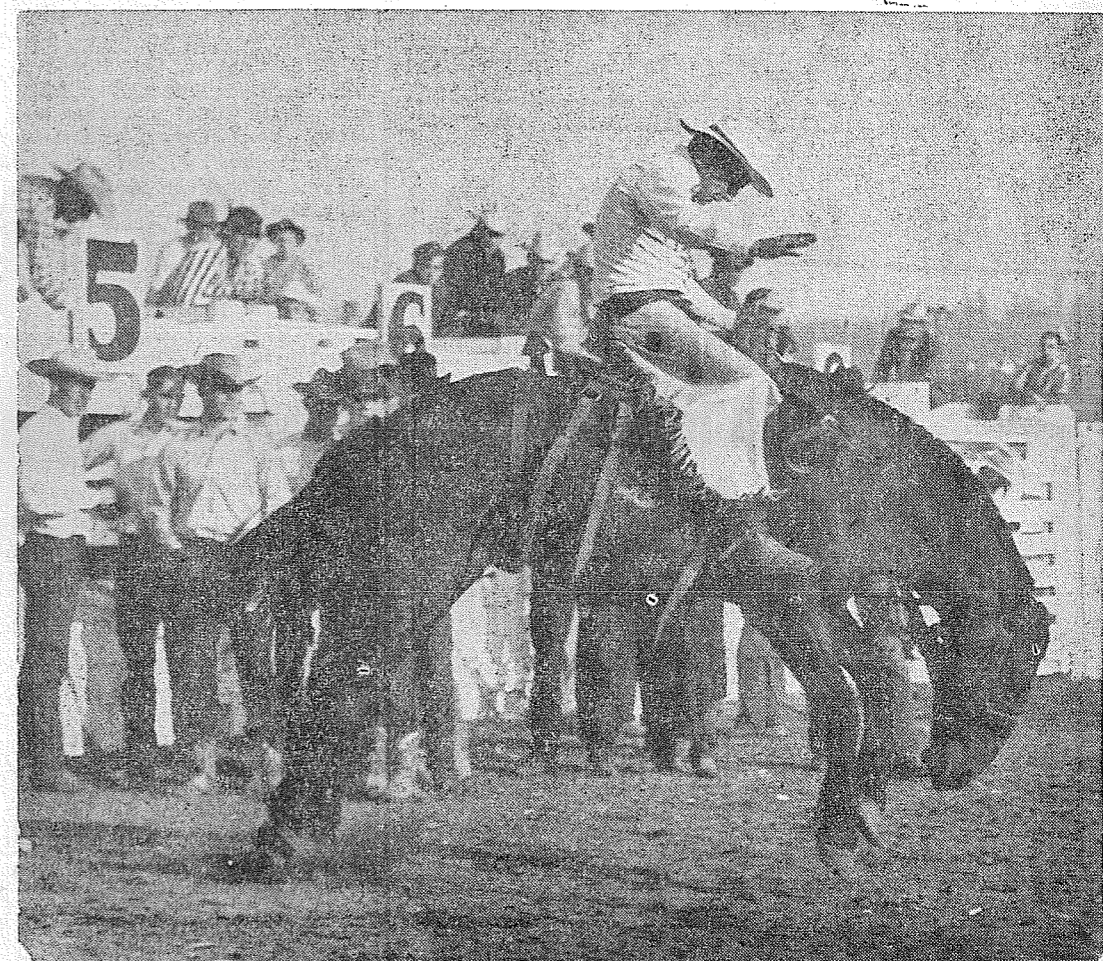
At the closing of the old Spanaway Water District in 1951, there were election, printing, legal expenses, etc. totaling approximately \$2200 to close the affairs and meet obligations of the defunct district. These were loaded on Spanaway to be collected in the form of taxation. This took a large part of the two mills allowed for junior districts such as fire, weed, sewer, library and water. As no district can be taxed unequally for libraries or part of a district for water, this tax situation left a problem where neither the county library nor fire districts could operate properly.

To clear this situation, our county wide organization checked with county officials and lawyers on the validity of the \$2200 debt, finding most of these obligations subject to taxation.

Through friends, businesses and people particularly interested in our library and fire districts, we have reduced the obligation to about \$550. Friends throughout the county are still cooperating in raising funds and we solicit your aid in wiping the slate clean of this indebtedness.

To the many enterprising citizens of Spanaway who are now well on the way to establishing a practical, workable mutual water system for the community, we wish to point out that the debts incurred by the 1949 action to form a water district are not, and never can be, assessed against their new venture. Nor, at any time in the future, can their mutual company be made liable for any
