- 3/4 cup undiluted Carnation Evaporated Milk

- 1 1/2 pounds ground beef
- 1 tablespoon catsup
- 2 tablespoons chopped onion
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 tablespoon dry mustard
- 3 cups (2 1-pound cans) kidney beans
- 3/4 cup coarsely chopped onion
- 1 cup grated sharp cheese
- Shortening for frying

Mix Carnation, egg, cracker crumbs, ground beef, catsup, 2 tablespoons onion, salt, pepper and mustard until smooth. Form into 12 flat, thin cakes. Pan fry in hot shortening. To serve, place meat cake on plate, heap with hot beans, top with second meat cake, then garnish with 3/4 cup chopped onion and grated cheese.

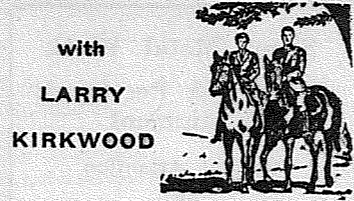

Members of Parkland Unit and Post No. 228, The American Legion, will take part in the local observance of Memorial Day, James Linder and Phyllis Blackstone, Memorial Chairmen, announced today.

The American Legion's plans for the observance include a Memorial service at the Parkland War Memorial across from the Parkland Grade school. Services begin at 10:30 a.m., Monday, May 31. The public is invited.

Memorial Day, the day when the nation honors its war dead, dates from 1868, the chairmen pointed out. General John A. Logan, then Commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, issued the order designating May 30th as a day for "strewing flowers or otherwise decorating the graves of soldiers who died in the defense of their country."

World War I and II, gave Memorial Day an added significance. The Korean Conflict added still more in its struggle against Communist domination. Now Memorial Day means more than just honoring the war dead. It means that the men and women on the battlefield are not the only ones responsible for protecting the country

and the free world.

"If we are to keep faith with those valiant soldiers who have given their lives that our nation would remain free and that our God-given rights would be preserved, then we as a people must prepare ourselves to obliterate the subversive elements at work within our shores," Mr. Linder and Mrs. Blackstone said. "Therefore, on this Memorial Day let us all as citizens of Parkland join in the observance and renew faith with our beloved dead to rededicate our lives to freedom and eternal peace."
