

Jesus, Justice and Jazz by The Rev. Wm Chris Boerger, Bishop



37000 youth and advisors gathered in New Orleans, LA, for the 2009 ELCA Youth Gathering under the theme, Jesus, Justice and Jazz. This was my third gathering since I have been in the office of bishop.

Each gathering is unique and each has many

common elements with previous gatherings. This one stood out in that the gathering was only one week rather than the attendees being split up in to two groups, during two different weeks. Seeing people sitting in the upper level of the Superdome was an amazing sight.

New Orleans and the surrounding areas were excited by the presence of these youth. Each group engaged in some type of direct service to the community. These experiences ranged from assembling backpacks for every student in the New Orleans school system, to planting grass in attempt to recover wet lands, to painting murals for the schools.

I was with the group from Holy Spirit, Kirkland as they participated in creating the mural on 2 by 4s that was used in the gathering's closing worship. (The mural will be distributed to Habitat for Humanity Housing projects.) The citizens of New Orleans knew that the Lutherans were present in the form of these orange shirted workers that were scattered over the city.

New Orleans is still recovering from Katrina and Rita. The lower ninth ward is still the symbol

that most of the world sees. I was privileged to be with the folks from Holy Spirit as we toured the 7th ward. This area suffered as much or more as the 9th ward. It is not in the headlines, but the destruction is still visible. Where they broke, the levies have been repaired, but the sections that did not collapse are still as weak as the sections that did. The potential for further damage in this area is very real.

The 207 members of the Northwest Washington Synod who attended the gathering had a variety of experiences. Like all youth gatherings there were moments of disorganization and youthful enthusiasm. It is also clear that those who attended were challenged by speakers, experiences and conversation to "do justice, love kindness and to walk humbly with God."

There is much that goes into getting a congregation's youth to such an event. Being with 37,000 other Lutherans is a unique experience. If you had youth who attended, talk with them about the gathering. If a neighboring congregation sent members to New Orleans, invite them to come and share their experience. This was the largest event in New Orleans since the hurricanes. We made headlines for coming to town and doing the work of God. We were the church.
