"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult." Psalm 46:1-3

One year ago today (written on Jan. 12), a catastrophic earthquake struck the nation of Haiti, killing nearly 250,000 people and leaving more than one million homeless.

Many of us remember hearing the news and seeing images of the devastation for the first time. We lifted up the people of Haiti in our prayers. We gave generously.

A Word From The Bishop

"The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it." Genesis 2:15 NRSV

I am very aware that as I have gotten involved with the *Care of Creation* activities of the Conference of Bishops and in local activities there are those in the synod who question the reality of global warming. I base my actions on the science that I have read. I also believe that such action is good stewardship.

Recently I was at a meeting with leaders of the Environmental Protection Agency EPA) in Washington DC. One of the people at that meeting was responsible for the *Energy*

Star Churches program. I was unaware, until then, that the EPA has an Energy Star Certification for church buildings. A significant benefit of this certification is the resulting dollar savings in heat and light costs.

One might argue that we should not base decisions about become more environmentally friendly based on the cost savings. The fact remains that having these concerns does save money over the long term. In these times of reduced budgets and limited resources a program that saves money while taking care of creation makes sense.

The EPA has a website, www.energystar.gov/index. cfm?c=small_business.sb_congregations, that explains the way in which this program works.

Even if the end result is not full-fledged certification for your church building, the process can identify potential savings that could be implemented. There are other websites that give good information on "green congregations". Earth Ministry, www.earthministry.org, is an excellent resource. Dr. David Rhoads, Emeritus Professor at LSTC, has written a green congregation manual, www.webofcreation.org.

Your gifts have:

† Provided food and shelter to approximately 57,700 people living in camps coordinated by The Lutheran World Federation and more than 6,000 people who gathered on the grounds of the Lutheran Church in Haiti.

- † Delivered more than 14,000 quilts and 13,000 health kits.
- † Distributed 3,200 gallons of safe, clean drinking water to approximately 2,000 families.
- † Shipped four convoys of medical supplies, hygiene and baby kits, tents, food packages and other necessities.
- † Funded housing placement and crisis counseling to Haitian refugees and medical evacuees seeking asylum in Florida and Georgia.

And yet our work is far from over. Our long-term goal in Haiti is to help renew hope and rebuild lives and livelihoods, seeking to end the cycle of poverty and injustice.

News From Gethsemane Lutheran Groundbreaking

Groundbreaking for the new construction project, including The Compass Housing Alliance's 50 units of affordable housing, Gethsemane's new fellowship area and offices, and the Hope Center was held on January 14. More than 100 people attended including members of Gethsemane, and members of

the faith community at large. It was a day to celebrate the dream Gethsemane has had for years...to build affordable housing for poeple who desperately need it.

Bea's husband, the Rev. Everett Jensen was the pastor at Gethsemane when the congregation purchased the land where the parking lot was located. His vision was bigger. He wanted to buy the whole city block, but the congregation didn't have the money. The parking lot was used for many years by Gethsemane.

Gethsemane sold the property for a high-rise apartment building next to the church so that the funds from the sale could be used in ministry in that downtown neighborhood. The bricks Elizabeth and Margaret are holding are from the demolition of the old Gethsemane as the congregation begins a 13-month remodel.

"As a person of faith I understand that you will be making deep cuts and eliminating critical programs that serve the poor and vulnerable and that protect our environment during the 2011 session.
