A Word From The Bishop by The Rev. Wm Chris Boerger, Bishop

First, I want to thank this Synod for allowing me to take three months as a sabbatical. I return to work rested and 15 pounds lighter. It was a time for reading, working around the house, playing with grandchildren and learning from our sisters and brothers in South Africa. I have much to share as time and opportunities allow.

I return to a church and synod that is facing the realities of the financial crisis.

Literally my first meeting back at work was the Conference of Bishops in executive session learning of the then proposed, now adopted, staffing proposals and redesign of the churchwide expression of this church.

Sixty-five people, or 60 full-time equivalent positions, will be gone from the Chicago office by February 1, 2011. This includes three

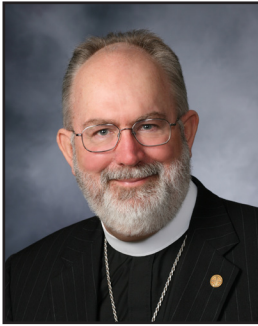

executive directors, program people and support staff.

The various units of the church have been restructured into three. Congregational and Synodical Mission will be responsible for the domestic work of this church. Global Mission will be responsible for the global work of this church. Mission Advancement will be responsible for developing the resources needed to do this work.

The reality is that we have cut the staff of the churchwide organization to bare bones. Fewer people will try to keep our common work going, but some of that work will not get done or get done as quickly as we have come to expect.

On returning to the synod office it is clear that we will have to make additional cuts as well. We are still projecting what 2010 will mean. It is clear that we will be doing additional across the board cuts in salaries and in partnership grants. I am inclined to look at reducing the hours worked by synod staff rather than looking at position reductions. This may affect the way we answer the phone in the office or the speed by which we send out the e-alerts.

I hear that congregations are cutting budgets and that staff positions are being lost at the congregational expression of the church. These are most interesting and difficult times.

And yet God has called us to be the church in this time. The grace of God given us in Baptism is not in recession. The power of God given us at the Lord's Supper is not being reduced. The breathing of the Spirit through the Word of God is what gives us life and breath even in

our laments.

I am confident that God is calling us to faithful witness in these times. It may be a different witness than I expected to give, but it is still a witness to the healing and transforming power of Jesus Christ.

God's church is not my possession or mine to control. God's church will speak the Gospel and share God's compassion to those in pain. God's church will care for this creation as if it belonged to God. We will be different when this time has changed. We will still be the church of Jesus Christ. Thanks be to God.

Dedication of the new Wech Pipe Organ at Queen Anne Lutheran will take place at both worship services (8 and 10:30 a.m.) on the Second Sunday of Advent, December 5. A Dedicatory Concert will be held at 3 p.m. David Dahl, Pacific Lutheran University's Professor of Music and University Organist Emeritus, will be the recitalist at the afternoon concert. David Dahl was consultant to the congregation's New Pipe Organ Committee. The instrument was built by Robert Wech in Buchloe, Germany, disassembled and shipped by container to Seattle, arriving on September 1. The installation at Queen Anne by Wech and his crew was completed on October 29.

The next *Come to the Water* Ecumenical Catechumenal Process Training Event will be held February 18-19, 2011 at St. Andrew Lutheran Church in Vancouver, Washington.

Speakers for the event are Bishop Rob Hofstad, Southwestern Washington Synod and Ann McElligott, Episcopalian and author of *The Catechumenal Process: Adult Initiation and Formation for Christian Life and Ministry*.

Other leadership will be provided by pastors and lay leaders from the Episcopal Diocese of Oregon and the Oregon and Southwest Washington Synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

This training event is recommended for congregation teams of two or more and will provide participants with the background and resources they need to begin a catechumenal process in their congregation.

At Wooden Cross Lutheran

Wooden Cross Lutheran in Woodinville became the first church in the nation to install the fast electric vehicle charging station, compatible with all the electric cars arriving in North America this year. The recent Chevy Volt National Tour kicked-off at Wooden Cross, charging for the first time ever at a publicly available charging station. This charging station is part of a larger “greening program” at Wooden Cross which includes state of the art low energy lighting, recycling, composting, the use of post-consumer waste products, a youth environmental education study focused on the National Wildlife Certification program, and many more practices.

40th Anniversary

The year 2010 marked the 40th anniversary of the ordination of women among North American Lutherans. What seems fairly routine in this century was big news in 1970.

The Lutheran Church in America voted in June of 1970 and thereafter ordained Elizabeth Platz; and The American Lutheran Church voted in October and ordained Barbara Andrews. Now almost 20 percent of the ELCA clergy roster are women, and half of all ELCA seminary students. In our synod women are represented on all four rosters of the ELCA: Ordained, Associate in Ministry, Diaconal Ministry and Deaconess. Say thanks to one of these women when you see them, and give thanks for the ongoing witness of God's good news in Christ among all God's people.

Here are some thoughts from the Rev. Carol Jensen, St. John United in Seattle. Carol was ordained in 1990.

I had just graduated from college in 1970, the year the ALC and LCA voted to allow the ordination of women. That sense of calling had not yet come to me, but that year I met several women who had begun the path to ordained ministry. They included Karen Bloomquist and Robin Mattison, both went on to become not only pastors but also scholars. I also knew of Nancy Winder, a daughter of Phinney Ridge Lutheran in Seattle, where I attended, who began seminary shortly after. All three of these women have made an enormous contribution to the life of the church over the past 40 years. While many of us take women's ordination for granted, it has not been an easy road for women in ministry. I am grateful, though, for the gifts that women have brought to ordained leadership in God's church. This 40th anniversary of women's ordination in the ELCA, and its predecessor churches, remind me again that the Spirit moves as it will. God's gifts are sometimes bestowed in a manner that confounds our assumptions and pre-dispositions so the gospel can be proclaimed to the world.
