

A Word From The Bishop

"Beloved, I pray that all may go well with you and that you may be in good health, just as it is well with your soul."

3 John 1:2 NRSV



Several years ago the ELCA and the Lutheran Church — Missouri Synod and their respective health insurance plans produced the "wellness wheel" as part of their emphasis on healthy leaders. The Board of Pensions is actively seeking to make wellness part of our thinking. How we care for our physical health, mental health and spiritual health is part of our life together.

For the past two years the health plan from the Board of Pensions has challenged the synods and the units of this church to take the Health Risk Assessment produced by the Mayo Clinic. If 65% of the plan participants in the Northwest Washington Synod were to take this assessment by April 1, there will be a 2% reduction in the premium costs to the congregation or sponsoring agencies. Across the ELCA this would be a \$2 million savings in these difficult economic times. There are also individual dollars that each plan participant will earn for taking the assessment.

I am confused as to why the Northwest Washington Synod congregations have not been able to receive this reduction in the past two years. I want to encourage those of you covered by this plan to take this assessment by the end of March. Several of our congregations have experienced drops in their incomes over the past years. This would be a small but significant reduction in expenses that only requires taking a survey.

Some leaders have not taken this survey because they do not have current medical data that will be requested on the survey. I would encourage you to have a physical, but you can still take the survey with old data. The results will encourage you to have a physical. That is part of taking wellness seriously.

A Word From The Bishop

Just as you hear me remind you to file your annual reports to the Bishop and your annual parochial report, now you hear me reminding you to take the health risk assessment. The first two reports give us a record and a check in on the health of your ministry. The risk assessment gives you some good feedback and gives the potential of financial savings to your congregation and financial support toward meeting your medical deductible. Now is the time to log on and take the assessment. It will be good for you.

Now More Than One

by Margit Peiffle, Synod Communications Administrator Help from the ELCA Disaster Relief and other agencies continues to help people in Haiti and other countries.

In recent weeks an 8.8 magnitude earthquake hit Chile. Lutheran Disaster Relief, Lutheran World Relief, the Lutheran World Federation and the ELCA's other partners are there. In fact, we and our partners were there even before the earthquakes hit.

I visited the websites of the ELCA Disaster Response, Lutheran World Relief (LWR) and

Lutheran World Federation (LWF) to see where we are helping:

- We are responding to earthquakes and a cyclone that hit Malawi in November and December. More than 16,000 lost their homes, many died and many more are injured. We are there.
- We are in the Philippines because Typhoon Mirinae hit the island of Luzon on October 31, causing more flooding to areas still recovering from the effects of Typhoons Ketsana and Parma which struck on September 26 and October 3 respectively. We are there.
- We are in East Africa as they are experiencing a drought that has caused successive crop failures and depletion of livestock, creating a food crisis. Countries affected are Uganda, Kenya, Sudan and Tanzania. We are there.

For the first time, the ELCA Youth Gathering will be going back to New Orleans for the 2012 Youth Gathering. In 2009 more than 37,000 youth showed in New Orleans to help rebuild the city. They finished their projects, but the youth also made a human connection, they learned how people were able to overcome anxiety with unwavering faith. There is work that still needs to be done in New Orleans. So the youth of the ELCA are headed back.

The 2010 Ecumenical Journey of the ELCA was an apostolic journey as much as it was an ecumenical journey. We were fortunate in Rome to be able to visit sites dedicated to the ministry and witness of saints Peter, Paul, and Bartholomew.

In a visit to the catacombs, our hosts prepared a place where we could celebrate Holy Communion in a deep room where so many witnesses to the faith had been laid to rest. In Istanbul we traveled by ferry to an Orthodox seminary that has been closed by the Turkish government for nearly 40 years, but is faithfully maintained by two spirited priests who are full of hope that the doors of the school will soon be open again to train future generations in the faith handed down to us by the apostles.

The first ferry stop on the way was a suburban neighborhood in Istanbul called Kadikoy, which in former times was knows as the town of Chalcedon, the site of that great Council that wrestled with the controversy of its day regarding the humanity and divinity of Jesus. Indeed this was an apostolic journey.

In pursuing her interests in the history of Christianity and hospitality, she has recently finished a book project entitled God's *Welcome: Hospitality for a Gospel-Hungry World*.

Duran, Director for New Congregational Development in the Evangelical Outreach and Congregational Mission unit of the ELCA.



The 2010 Washington State legislative session ended on Thursday, March 11, with our state having dealt with a deficit of nearly 2.8 billion dollars, a gap requiring drastic cuts in spending to balance the budget.

Over the course of the session, Legislators had to decide how much revenue they were willing to raise to mitigate these cuts to vital programs and services, such as the Basic

Health Plan, General Assistance – Unemployable, and the Housing Trust Fund.

LPPO and our partner organizations, including the Rebuilding Our Economic Future Coalition, worked hard to let legislators know that cuts have a very real impact on the most vulnerable in our state—our neighbors in need. We advocated for raising substantial revenue to protect these programs through closing tax loopholes, increasing 'sin' taxes, and finding other sources of revenue. In the end, the legislature did raise revenue, but many programs were subject to significant cuts.

Although battling cuts made for a tough session, Interfaith Advocacy Day was a great beacon of fellowship and advocacy witness. On February 16 more than 200 advocates from around Washington gathered at the State Capitol in Olympia. The day was a great success as people of faith worshiped together, heard from experts about policy and budget issues, were addressed by Gov. Chris Gregoire, and met with their elected representatives.

"Supporting Revenue to Protect Services" was the day's slogan as attendees advocated for the new revenue necessary to prevent an all cuts budget. Gov. Gregoire urged the gathering to help legislators put a human face on services at risk, such as the Basic Health Plan and Apple Health. A big "Thank You!" to the religious partners, organizations, and advocates who made Interfaith Advocacy Day 2010 possible.
