Conversation About Immigration Reformby The Rev. Wm Chris Boerger, Bishop



Regardless of your political perspective it is clear that our immigration system in this country is broken. I recognize this is a very emotional topic. I can hear the voices saying that in this time of uncertainty and division in our church and

our culture I would do us all a favor by not bringing the subject up. I bring it up not to push a particular point of view which I do have. I bring it up because the status quo is not working.

As we have begun working with immigrant populations in our new ministries the stories of the failure of our current system are increasing. I spent Good Friday evening two years ago with a group of Indonesian Lutherans saying good bye to one of their group who was being deported because an American attorney had missed a hearing on her in-laws' asylum request. I have written about how this experience gave new meaning to the Good Friday story.

With our global connections in the church we are learning that we have much to learn from other Lutheran Christians from around the world. The ability of this church to engage these important leaders is limited by our maze of immigration issues.

I had the opportunity to tour the Northwest Detention Center in Tacoma. This prison run by a for-profit corporation is where those detained by Immigration and Customs Enforcement are housed. It is an amazing experience to hear how persons about to face deportation are treated and how a private company profits from building prison space on the speculation that they will be filled.

I know of no one who believes that the immigration system as we now have it is working. We need to have the debate about how it should be reformed. It is a political hot potato. I want to encourage you to be involved in this debate. We will have different ideas about how this should be resolved. I know that. Our silence on the issue is only perpetuating the current confusion. Most of us can still tell stories of our immigrant ancestors. We need to be involved in how the current stories are being created by our new immigrants.
