Honored for 75 years of Parish Ministry: **Pastor Norris Stoa**

On a warm, sunny afternoon in late June about 40 family members and friends gathered with Pastor Stoa in the chapel of Columbia Lutheran Home in Seattle to celebrate a rare occasion. It was the 75th Anniversary of Pastor Stoa's ordination to the ministry. Not many pastors have the privilege of marking this anniversary – if you do the math you can see that one must be almost 100 to reach such a milestone. Pastor Stoa turned 99 on February 22.

The service was simple and beautiful. We sang some songs, read Scripture, prayed and the Rev. Jan Nesse, Assistant to the Bishop, was on hand to present a beautifully framed certificate marking these 75 years. Randi Valdok and her hospitality team provided some of Pastor Stoa's favorite Norwegian cookies, along with coffee. He greatly

enjoyed the opportunity to visit with all three of his children, several grandchildren, greatgrandchildren and friends during the social time. And, on display were many pictures, certificates and memorabilia from his 99 years.

During the service, I read a letter about Norris Stoa's ordination service, which had been written by Norris' mother to her brother (a Chicago judge at the time). The letter gave great descriptions, which allowed all of us who attended the anniversary event an opportunity to re-live the actual service from 75 years ago.

As one would expect, Pastor Stoa joined in the leadership of the brief anniversary service by both offering a prayer of thanksgiving and blessing the congregation with the final benediction

A Word From The Bishop



Let no one despise your youth, but set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity. Until I arrive, give attention to the public reading of scripture, to exhorting, to teaching. Do not neglect the gift that is in you, which was given to you through prophecy with the laying on of hands by the council of elders.

1Timothy 4:12-14 NRSV

The importance of gathering for worship and study is key to our life together. The development and use of the gifts in us is also essential to the work God has called the

church to do. Paul's admonitions to Timothy remind us of this. It also reminds us of the fact that there are young people who have these gifts and who will serve as leaders in Christ's church now.

I notice in the synod calendar on our website that our campus pastors are again asking us to let them know of the members of our congregations who will be attending college next fall. I will confess that I had a spotty track record of filling out the information cards when I was in the parish. Things have changed. From this office I see the remarkable work being in campus ministry. The relationships that are developed will continue after the campus experiences are history.

Names are now emailed to the campus ministry. I want to encourage you to do this. Let the campus ministry at the school your members will attend know about their arrival. Ask your students if they are connected with the campus ministry at school. Be in conversation with the campus pastors about how they and you can build on this mutual ministry.

We are connected to and financially support all of the campus ministries in Region 1 (Washington, Alaska, Oregon, Idaho and Montana). We have two campus ministries on the territory of this synod and a third is being established (Covenant House at the University of Washington and Shalom Center at Western Washington University and a new Chinese campus ministry at the University of Washington). These are places where the leaders of the church are being formed and already leading.

A Word From The Bishop

So, I encourage you to let the campus ministries know that your young people are coming to the campus. The students can be encouraged, like Timothy, to develop the gifts that are in them through the gathering around word and sacrament and in the fellowship of one another.

This is a ministry with students, not a ministry to students.

The Year With Luke: Lectionary Series C

Eye Witnesses and Servants of the Word

Luke's account of "the things about which you have been instructed" (Luke 1:4) will be the Gospel reading each week beginning with Advent 1 on November 29th. We begin the church year as Luke presents himself as a writer who conveys to us "an orderly narrative of the things that have been accomplished among us."

In order to be more familiar with

Luke's story and to help us understand the writer's intentions, the Northwest Washington Synod Bible Book of Faith work group is hosting a series of educational opportunities on the Gospel of Luke. These opportunities will provide helps for us to better understand the background, structure, and special emphases of this writing, from which he have much to learn.

Rev. Dr. George W. E. Nickelsburg, professor emeritus of Religion at the University of Iowa and internationally known New Testament scholar, will lead a three-week series on the Gospel of Luke. Each series will be the same, but will be offered at different locations throughout the Synod.
