I also believe that people of faith have a responsibility to show respect for others of different views and to engage in respectful dialogue with them. Therefore, I pledge that, during the 2014 campaign season I will do my best to:

- *Pray regularly for myself, for others and for our political leaders that we might promote civility and show respect for those of different views*
- *Practice respectful dialogue by applying the Golden Rule in political discussions*

Please Note:

The ELCA social statement on "The Death Penalty" expresses ELCA opposition to the use of the death penalty because of the church's ministry with and to people affected by violent crime, even while recognizing that God entrusts the state with the power to take human life when failure to do so constitutes a clear danger to society.

The statement acknowledges the existence of different points of view within the church and society and the need for continued deliberation, but objects to the use of the death penalty because it is not used fairly and has failed to make society safer. Its practice undermines any possible alternate moral message since "the message conveyed by an execution, reflected in the attention it receives from the public, is one of brutality and violence."


