EMBLA'S NEW PRESIDENT Carol Maxson Kemp

• Background – I was born in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho; early childhood in Spokane, WA; later in southern CA; BA in music from University of Redlands, CA; MA in music from CA State University; taught choral music in public and

private high schools for 20 years, during which time I also had my own performing company (Kemp Co. Performers) of professional adults who presented mini musicals as benefit fund raisers for charities; then owner and jewelry designer of The Alchemist Jewelry

Design Studio in San Anselmo, CA for 15 years; now retired. I live in Gig Harbor WA with my husband, Richard Kemp; we have one child, a married son, Marc, who teaches English at Fullerton College in CA. Hobbies: Composing, writing, Rosemaling, making costumes, and gardening.

• Heritage – My Scandinavian ancestors all immigrated in the mid 1800s. I am the third generation born in America. I am 1/4 Norwegian, 1/4 Danish on my mother's side and a tiny bit of Swedish on



my father's side that is primarily German and British Isles. My mother's mother, Marie Sjursdatter Fretheim, was Norwegian/American born in Minnesota. Her mother, my great grandmother, Anne Ericsdatter Kjørlie, was born on the

Jordet Farm in Gol, (Hallingdal) Buskerud, Norway. Anna's husband Sjur Alfsen Fretheim, was born on the Fretheim Farm in Flåm, which is at the end of the Aurland finger of the Sognefjord. Mother's father, Alfred Peterson, was Danish/American, born in Wisconsin. His mother,

my Danish great grandmother, Caroline Andersdatter Pederson, was born on "Dryerbakken," Langtved, in København Amt on the island of Sjæland. Caroline's husband, Anders Hanson Pederson, was born in Maglebrande on the island of Falster. I was named "Carol Ann" after my Scandinavian great grandmothers, Caroline and Anna. As a genealogist, I have made numerous research trips to ancestral homelands; seven trips to Norway, three to Denmark and one to Sweden. In addition, I hope to Carol Maxson Kemp continued visit Finland and Iceland next summer. Currently I am near publishing a book on my father's patriarchal family history. The colonist Richard Maxson arrived in Boston in '1634. One of the wives in this line had ancestors on the Mayflower. Upon completion of this book, I am ready to begin organizing my research and publishing the family history of my Norwegian/ Danish heritage.

• Sons of Norway - Olav #82 in San Rafael CA is my home lodge. I have served that lodge as president and delegate to several District #6 Conventions. During my terms as Youth Director on the District #6 Board, I was a delegate to the International convention in Minneapolis, MN and to honor my maternal Norwegian line, a Hesla cousin in Gol has a Hallingfest Bunad made for me to wear when I was a delegate to the International Convention in Trondheim, Norway in 1992. My aunt bought the jewelry and shoes for me that year for my birthday and I recently purchased the "finish touch" sølje from our own Florence Buck. "Queen Christine and Her Troll" is the name of the children's play I wrote and directed for S/N District #6 Kretsttevne at Alta. It,has been performed since at several S/N lodges.

• Norway Day – When Norway Day in San Francisco was first organized, I served on the founding committee.

• Daughters of Norway – Have served as Cultural Director and Vice President of Embla #2 in Tacoma.

• Danish Sisterhood – Member of the Olympia/Tacoma lodge.

• PLU Scandinavian Cultural Center – Currently, I am President and Program Chair. • Cultural Arts Commission of Gig Harbor and the Key Peninsula – currently President.

I treasure my heritage and am pleased to serve and help preserve the culture and traditions through my involvement with ethnic organizations such as Daughters of Norway. Thank you for the opportunity.
