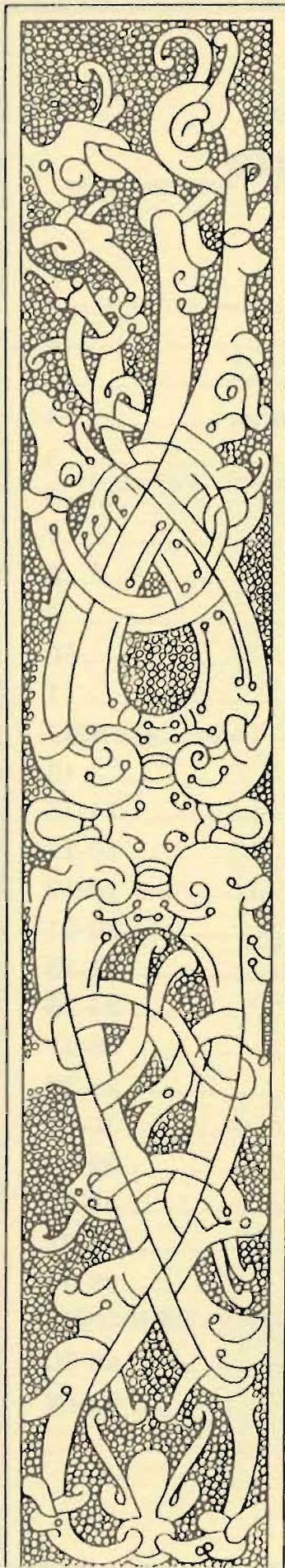
86th Sangerfest



On April 29, 1927 twenty four Norwegians gathered together and organized a Sons of Norway Lodge. They selected the name of Wergeland #21 in honor of Henrik Wergeland, the famous Norwegian poet and writer. The lodge prospered and grew. In 1927, the Lodge purchased a lot at 1419 Forest St. in Bellingham, Washington. The lodge formed a corporation called Norway Hall Incorporated. The board of Norway Hall Incorporated consists of twelve members elected by the Lodge. (See photo on right of the original twelve board members of Norway Hall Incorporated.) The Board authorized the building of Norway Hall where we are still meeting today. Our Lodge meets on the second and fourth Fridays of each month and we are happy to report that our Lodge is active and solvent and we invite one and all to come and visit with us.

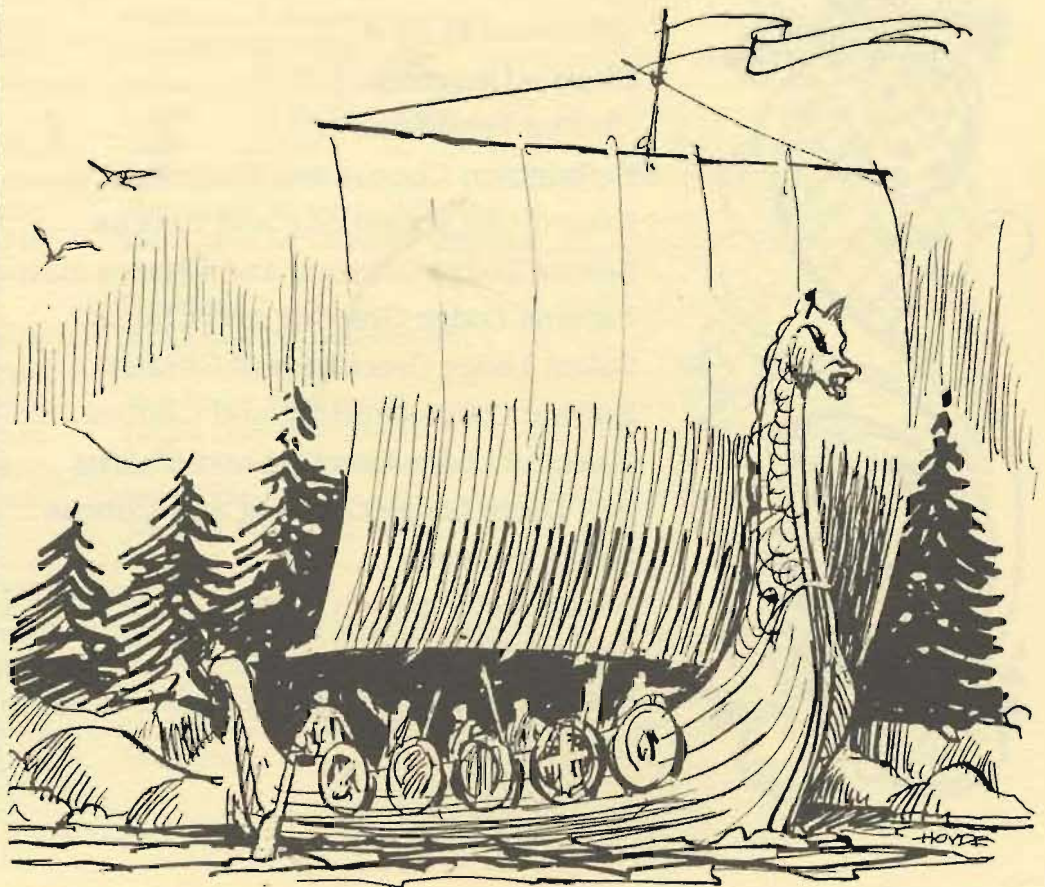


Music is a portrayal of a nation's culture and identity.

A TRADITION OF SINGING THAT GOES BACK TO 1903

Historical Sketch of the Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers' Association

SONG AND MUSIC are a birthright which has been entrusted to all nations in a greater or lesser degree.

That such a birthright has been richly entrusted to the Norwegian Nation is a well known fact. As music lovers, composers and performers the Norwegians have always been in the foremost ranks. Singing, and then in particular male chorus singing, has a very broad place in the daily musical life of the country. Virtually every little community has its singing societies which contribute much towards keeping the high standard of patriotism and love. Everybody takes part and the great Sangerfests with massed choruses numbering 5000 to 6000 men are realities.

Immortal composers like Grieg, Sinding, Svendsen, Ole Olsen, Kjerulf and numerous others have given us male chorus compositions of lasting beauty, compositions that rightfully belong among the finest the world has produced in this form of music.

The Norwegian sons and daughters who have emigrated to America have brought with them this great love for song and music, and have contributed honorably to make this country an outstanding musical nation. For over 100 years Norwegian singing societies have existed on the Pacific Coast, and in 1902, chiefly through the efforts of Mr. F. A. Tomte, Portland, Oregon, the Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers' Association was organized in Seattle, Washington. The first officers were John Norman (Everett), President; A. J. Thuland (Seattle), Secretary; Dr. O. A. Loe (Seattle), Treasurer, and Dr. Carlo A. Sperati, Director-in-Chief. The original founders of the Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers Association are as follows:

- Norwegian Glee Club, Portland, organized November 6, 1886
- Normanna Male Chorus, Tacoma, organized October 15, 1888
- Norwegian Male Chorus, Seattle, organized December 6, 1889
- Norden Sangforening, Ballard, WA, organized in 1901
- Everett Norwegian Male Chorus, organized August 5, 1902

The first Sangerfest was held in Everett, Washington, August 1-3, 1903. Since then Sangerfests have been held and celebrated in the principal cities of the Pacific Coast.

The present Sangerfest in Bellingham is the 86th in the history of the Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers' Association and the first in Bellingham since 1980.

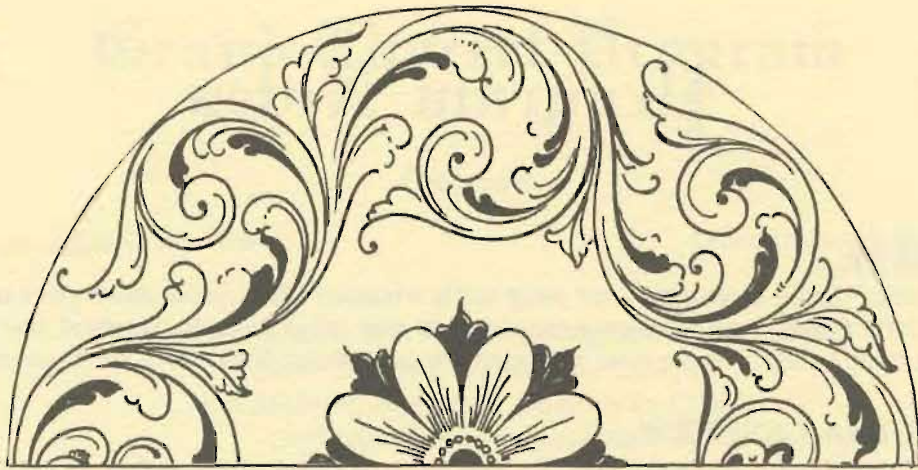

Program Notes

AFTENRØSTER...

...Evening Voices. "Green forest, let your song softly whisper! Wave, slow down your movement now, do not roar! Little flower, you bow your cup to rest! Bee, stop hurrying around the flower's home! Mountain and deep valley, receive your peace which now sinks down from the heavenly halls."

HJEMOVER FRA LANGREIS...

...Homeward Bound From a Long Voyage, depicts the eagerness of the sailors to get home and their stirring memories of Norway's coast. Their knuckles are white on the wheel, the storm fills the sails, the sea gushes over the bow, yet there is half a day left before they can run up the flag in their home port.

MORGENSANG AF "ELVERSKUD"

...Morning Song - is taken from Elverskud (The Elf King's daughter), a Ballad for solo, chorus and orchestra by Niels W. Gade, with the text based on Danish folk fairytales written by C.K.F. Molbech. ..."The sun rises in the east, spreads gold across the sky, moves over sea and mountain tops, and countryside and towns. It comes from the beautiful coast where Paradise once lay, it brings light and life, it carries life and joy to adult and child. And with God's sun a heavenly luster radiates from the east, a glimpse from the coast of Paradise where the apple tree of life grows.

NORGE, MIT NORGE...

...Norway, my Norway, Theodor Caspari's (1853-1948) most famous poem, actually entitled Vinter i Norge (Winter in Norway), very aptly describes the country sleeping during the winter months and the longing for a sunny spring. However, when summer and live depart, ..."then teach me to wither, oh Norway my mother, and prepare me a bed in your sacred soil." The poem was set to music in 1911 by Alfred Paulsen (1849-1936), Norwegian-born organist and choral director in Chicago, IL.

OLAV TRYGVASON...

...was a great grandson of Harald Fairhair. He was accepted as King of Norway in 995 by the people of the Trondheim area, and gradually by the rest of the nation. In his efforts to make the people adopt the Christian religion, he created many enemies. In the year 1000 his enemies joined forces with the Danish and Swedish kings and met Olav I (Trygvason) at Svolder. His fleet was hopelessly outnumbered, and when his Dragon Ship, Ormen Lange (Long serpent), was taken, and Olav wounded, he jumped overboard and disappeared. Most of the song deals with Olav's Earl, Erling Skjalgson and his men. With their 6 lighter warships they had outsailed the 11 heavier Dragon ships of the King and were unaware of his fate. As they lay waiting for the King, the message came "from the depth of the ocean, like a sigh, carried by the sobbing waves: Taken is the Long Serpent! Fallen is Olav Trygvason!"

LANDKJENNING (LAND SIGHTING)...

...The Poem is by Norway's great writer Bjornson and the music by the immortal Grieg. It is one to the most popular male chorus songs in the world, depicting the young Hero-King Olav Trygvason's return to his native Norway and the first impression of land he and his followers got from the gleaming mountain peaks and thundering waterfalls and they sailed in through the deep blue fjords in the simmering sunlit air. In the solo the King gives profound expression for his belief, that here was home and here he would raise the Cross which should lift his spirit high and strong like the mighty mountains! His men intone the prayer, carrying the song to a grand soul stirring finish.
