Major Workshop Update - From Gurine Nordby

1992 WORKSHOPS

We still have openings for our Spring workshop with Barbara Wolters in Portland and South King County. NOTE! The Bremerton location had to be changed to South King County because there were not enough signing up in the Bremerton area. Call me if you are interested. I also have openings in all the fall classes with Eldrid Arntzen. This is an excellent opportunity for new rosemalers to learn from a Gold Medal teacher. We all started sometime. I took my first folk art workshop after I had been painting only a few weeks. My line work was a bit thick but I sold the piece for \$50. Be brave and give it a try. My address was wrong on the last application, but is correct now. I'll be looking for more registrations to come in soon.

I have been trying to think up a solution to how all the people at the workshops can have access to photos of the pieces the teacher may bring with her for sale. With the classes held in different locations, there won't be equal access for everyone. I am looking into the possibility of having the pieces shipped to me early so I could photograph each piece plus closeups of the details.

Some of you have seen or bought my photos before. I can only hope these will turn out as those I have taken in the past. This would be the only way I can think that we all could have pictures to study from. The catch is, I would need to know how many sets to order when I take them for developing in order to get the best price. I have been quoted approx. \$5 for 4"x6" prints/24 exposures and \$6 for 4"x6" prints/36 exp. If I don't have enough lead time, they might not be done before all the classes. Then there would also be a charge for postage. Last year I took 3 rolls (2-24's and 1-36) of pieces done by Kari and Bjorg so this year I would probably take 2 rolls - maybe 3. If you are interested in this solution, write or call me before March 25th. Reprints ordered later would cost more. Anyone can order sets.

BJORG KLEIVI TO RETURN

Bjorg Kleivi will be back in America this Spring. She will be here from April 15 to April 30 to learn more about painting with Jo Sonja acrylics and the use of the mediums from me. During her stay I may try to organize an informal class (2 or 3 days) during April 26th to 29th. If anyone is interested, please call me. ELDRID ARNTZEN COMING IN SEPT.

Our thanks to Eldrid for the lovely rosemaling design in this issue. We are looking forward to having her come this fall. Openings are still available. (See registration form this issue.)

"A resident of Windsor, Connecticut, married to Arnt Norman Arntzen, mother of three and grandmother. I was born and reared in a Norwegian community in the Bay Ridge section of Brooklyn, New York. My parents were immigrants from the west coast of Norway, so I was always exposed to the Norwegian language and my Norwegian cultural heritage.

After moving to Connecticut in the 1960's, I copied a rosemaling design from a card printed by Vesterheim. Sometime later I was invited to participate in a local arts and crafts show. I struggled to design and prepare a variety of rosemaled articles for that event. I was self taught until approximately 1971 when I began studying with Audrey Shine and Diana Boehnert.

In 1979 we (Eldrid and her husband) made our first trip to Decorah to experience the Nordic Fest. The big attraction for me was the Annual Rosemalers' Banquet and the National Rosemaling Exhibit. The exhibit was awe-inspiring, and the rosemaling bug really bit. I travelled to Telemark, Norway, in 1980 to study the Old Telemark style of rosemaling with Olav Fossli at the "Akadamiet".

I was awarded the Gold medal in 1987. Since 1981 I have travelled to Vesterheim at least once a year to study with visiting Norwegian rosemaling teachers.

Rosemaling is and continues to be a learning experience for me. It is an art form that allows me freedom of expression and creativity. I have learned to love rosemaling and I enjoy sharing it."
