### SIGMUND IS COMING

Sigmund Aarseth, well-known rosemaler from Norway, is coming to our area in February. Sigmund is coming to the U.S. under the auspices of the Norwegian-American Museum in Decorah, Iowa. He will be giving demonstrations and classes in various parts of our country, and we feel very fortunate that he has accepted the invitation from Western Rosemalers Association to come to our area to give demonstrations and conduct classes in rosemaling. # SGANDINAVIAN DAYS IN TACOMA

Scandinavian Days were held in the Bicentennial Pavilion from October 4 through October 8. Western Rosemalers were there! It was an exciting, interesting, and profitable experience for all of our members involved.

Nine artists contributed 94 rosemaled items and 60 pieces of unpainted woodenware. Sixty-five of the rosemaled items and about half of the unpainted items were sold for a total of \$592. Our commission contribution of \$88.82 to the Lief Erickson Society will go toward scholarships at Pacific Lutheran University and University of Puget Sound.

Special thanks go to <u>Marian Athow</u> and <u>Ragnhild Feroy</u> who served on the committee. Florence <u>Buck</u>, <u>Pat Morgan</u> and <u>Gudrun Berg gave</u> of their time to demonstrate rosemaling. In addition to Marian and Ragnhild, <u>Gloria Pederson</u>, <u>Karen Dahl</u>, <u>Audree Rush</u>, <u>Asta Oden</u>, <u>Emilie Pederson</u>, <u>Susan Elshaug</u>, <u>Bonnie Smith</u> and <u>Yyonne Martinec</u> worked in our booth. Thanks to all of you who helped make this such a successful venture.

One of the greatest benefits that derives from this type of activity is the opportunity to promote Western Rosemalers Association. We were able to talk to many people interested in rosemaling and in classes that we have to offer. About 40 potential rosemalers signed up for future classes. These people are all potential members of Western Rosemalers. It's a great way to build our membership and keep the association alive and growing.
