#### LOIS CLAUSON - A SUMMARY OF HER PAINTING EXPERIENCE

"I began as a tole painter in 1975. My first rosemaling classes were taught by Florence Buck of Tacoma. I have been rosemaling for seven years. My other teachers have been: Norma Splitt, Addie Pittelkow, Vi Thode, Nils Ellingsgard, Gunnar Bo, Ingebjorg Loftsgarden and Eli Soelid.

Two visits to Norway have given me a better insight into rosemaling origin and traditional techniques. I had a great opportunity to photograph not only the earliest styles and designs, but some of the equally lovely work of the more contemporary painters.

My husband, LeRoy, and I had the opportunity to attend classes at Vesterheim, the Norwegian-American Museum in Decorah, Iowa. I took rosemaling classes from Norma Splitt and LeRoy took traditional Norwegian Bentwood box making from Johan Hopstad of Norway. We are pleased to be able to include Norwegian Tines, Laups and Smors in the woodenware we have for sale. White in Decorah we attended Nordic Fest, the National Rosemaling exhibition and of course, made several tours through the marvelous museum.

I am into my sixth year of teaching at the Sons' of Norway in Bremerton and my fourth year at the Sons' of Norway in Paulsbo. I have taught mini-workshops in Seattle and Tacoma. My membership in the Western Rosemaler's Association, of which I am currently serving as nd





Rosemaling had its beginning in Norway in 900-1000 AD. The two main symbols in all forms of rosemaling are the letters C and S. Rosemaling designs are made up by the use of these letters with variations. Rosemaling could be called "A Christian Folk Art" since the letter C stands for Christ and the letter S stands for Sovereign.

THE INTRODUCTION of Christianity to Norway was in a quite forceful manner. If you did not accept Christianity you were often killed. Ambulating artisans began to paint the letters C and S above the doorways of homes. This signified that the inhabitants of this home were Christians and it could mean that their life was saved. As the years and centuries have passed, Rosemaling has taken on quite artistic forms but the letters C and S are still the two main symbols of this art. Christ-Sovereign Christus-Suveren.

- 1. Any member of Western Rosemalers Association may enter the show.
- 2. Two to three articles may be entered. Due to the space in the room, the final decision on which items to be exhibited rests with the musuem staff. The musuem guarantees that at least one piece from every person will be on display.
- 3. Articles must have been painted within the last year & a half and must not have been entered in other exhibits at the musuem.
- 4. There is no size limit.
- 5. Entries must be painted on wood with oil paints.
- 6. Wet or sticky entries will not be accepted.
- 7. The artist's name and all information should be on the enclosed Identification labels. If to be mailed be sure to enclose money or check addressed to the musuem. Label should be attached to back
- 8. If the entry is to be hung, it must have a proper hanger.
- 9. If you mish to exhibit, send a copy of the items exhibited to the chairmen of the exhibit, Marvel Gordon or Betty Edwards.
- 10. Items can be taken to the musuem on March 10 thru the 14th (Monday thru Friday) between the hours 9-5, Thursday evening, March 13, 5-7 p.m. or Saturday, March 15, 1-3 p.m. This will give the musuem amble time to arrange an attractive display.
- ll. If your entry is to be sold, mark each piece with the price you wish to receive. Remember the museum takes a 20% mark up, so adjust your price to reflect this amount. If your piece is sold it will not be removed from the exhibit until after the exhibit is over. Your check will be sent to you after the exhibit ends June 8th.
- 12. After the exhibit is up loan forms will be mailed to you from the musuem. Please sign and mail back to musuem.
- 13. Items can be picked up after June 12th. Hours are: Monday thru Friday 9-5, June 14, 1-3, June 12th, 5-7 p.m.


