

ROSEMALING ON DISPLAY

A display of rosemaling, the Norwegian style of decorative painting charicterized by the use of vine trendil (sic) and flowers, is on view at the Nordic Heritage Museum in Ballard through Feb. 15.

The resemaling motifs may be painted either alone or in combination with figures and landscapes. Rosemaling flourished in the mid-1700's and became widespread as regional styles developed. These include Telemark, one of the most popular, using the colors red, blue and green. The Hallingdal style often uses red as as background and has a symmetrical design. The designs were painted on bowls, chests, trays, compotes and chairs and stools.

The museum is located at 3014 N.E. (sic) 67th St., and is open 11a.m.-3p.m. Tuesday through Thursday and 1-5p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

We need someone to bring the notecards, History of Rosemaling cards and WRA pins to Seattle, Tacoma and Bremerton meetings. If you would like to do this, please tell one of the Board members.


