Perhaps it is easier to serve a second year when things have become a little more familiar, but things could also become stagnant and narrow-minded without the input of new and fresh ideas. Therefore, in addition to the other goals of expanding our organization both in numbers and activities in different areas, more participation of members in decision making, and more response from our far-away members, I would like to add a new one.

That goal is to involve as many members of our organization as possible in our acitivities so there will be a very real desire on the parts of many to see our organization live and grow and that next fall when the nomination committee sets out to find officers, they will be met a little more enthusiastically. Please give this goal real consideration and if our association is important to you, please be willing to help where possible.

With your help, 1978 will be a truly rewarding, successful and important year for Western Rosemalers. Together lets spread the word to more and more people what rosemaling is and impress them with its worth.

## RX FOR "GOOFS

If you have ever completed a painting only to discover a "goof" somewhere -- and the paint is dry, you may take a Q-tip and DUO-SOL (A Pratt & Lambert product), rub gently and lo--it will usually take the design off, but not the base coat. Just clean the surgace good with paint thinner and you may repair the painting. Usually works even if the work is varnished.
