CHERRY FRUIT CAKE

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ c. flour

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ c. sugar 1 t. baking powder

1 to salt

2 pkg. (7½ oz.) pitted dates

1 lb. diced candied pineaplle

2 jars (16 oz. each) red maraschino cherries (drained)

 $5\frac{1}{2}$ c. pecans

6 eggs

1/3 c. dark Rum

½ c. light corn syrup

Grease 2 loaf pans. Line with foil allowing a 2" overhang and grease again. Sift flour, sugar, baking powder and salt into a large mixing bowl. Add fruit and pecans — toss until combined. Turn mixture into pans, pressing & packing with spatula.

Bake at 300 for 1 hour and 45 minutes.

April 7th Paint-In -

Lois Clauson gave many ideas for those interested in teaching and starting classes. Thanks to Betty Edwards for sending along her notes for reprinting for those unable to attend.

1. Notify students:

Ad in paper for first classes - bulletin boards at Nordic Museum, Sons of Norway, etc. \$30.00 for 6 weeks (3 hour classes or 3 days - 6 hours.

Workshop or sessions payment due first day of classes.

Do not get involved with make-up classes.

Keep class size manageable (11 - 12) 15 too many. Better to have a waiting list.

Beginners easier to teach in larger class than intermediate or advanced.

Prepare a list of needed supplies.

Locate where supplies are available - possibly 10% discount.

Ask stores about student discounts.

Teacher carry brushes for class. Suggested brushes:

#4 Flat # 7300 series

#8 Flat

#2 7050 Long Liner

#2 7350 Detail

#5 7000 Round

2. First class:

Explain Rosemaling and have samples of styles

Explain & demonstrate care of brushes

Explain about safety (Eric Silk's 10 rules for artists)
Demonstrate basic "C" & "S" strokes

Entire session spent learning using all 5 brushes.

Also practice liner and tear drops. Teacher supplies paper for stroke practice.

3. Second class:

More stroke work on practice board. Simple Hallingdal strokes which teacher has traced on poster board.

Explain the mixing of paints.

Third Class:

More stroke work; trace more difficult Hallingdal designs; add more color combinations

for students to paint.

Have broader samples ready to paint on tracing paper for speedy workers - good practice.

5. Fourth Class:

Discuss color as it pertains to Rosemaling.

Make color chart. Recipies & color combinations.

6. Fifth class:

Explain how woodenware is prepared and backgrounded.

Discuss appropriate background colors and where to purchase.

First Telemark design on wooden paddle.

7. Sixth class:

More involved Telemark design with more colors.

Include border.

"Do You Want To Teach?" by Priscilla Hauser from Tole World, March 1984

Do you want to teach? Don't be afraid to teach if this is something you have always dreamed of doing. If you want to teach, do it. And if you are teaching, are you stale and rusty? If so, clean up your act! Go in with some refreshing new ideas. Get with it! Paint is happy, and it is happy because of our teachers. Be a good teacher! (Priscilla Hauser teaches seminars for everyone throughout the United States.

Priscilla Hauser article (cont.)

1. Be hones with your students.

2. If you want to teach, share everything you know.

3. Have patience.

4. Dont do a student's painting for them, but encourage them.

5. A good teacher is always happy.

6. You need a lesson plan.

7. The basics are extremely important.

8. Above all, have fun.

9. Do you lack self-confidence?

If you do, ask yourself why? Make a list of the reasons you lack self-confidence and then make a list of the things in this article that I have said to do. Write me. I can help you with your self-confidence problems. I still have butterflies any time I get ready to teach any kind of a workshop. But, I know I can do a good job and I will get in there and get the job done. I have always believed that when the Lord shuts a door, He opens a window. I have climbed in a lot of windows and will continue to.

In my seminars, I encourage all the people who want to teach to work with a lesson plan. Know what you are going to teach; have a format. I feel a good way to teach painting is in six week sessions. Six weeks isn't too long a period of time for a person to make a commitment. I feel classes should be three hours long. Design your teaching format round the length of time that is given to you for that particular class.

Begin a new class with the basics. If you really want the students to paint well, those basics are absolutely essential.

Go into that classroom with a big smile on your face and have fun with the students. Enjoy what you are doing and they will enjoy you as a teacher and they will enjoy their painting.
