Synopsis of Last Meeting, May 18, 1980, in Tacoma

Minutes of the March meeting in Seattle were corrected and approved. Treasurer's books were at H. R. Block for required tax report so she was unable to give full report, but noted we took in \$905 from Mayfest at Pacific Lutheran University, and \$110 in memberships since last meeting.

Loretta Pullis reported that we tripled previous sales (\$771.75) at the PLU Norwegian Mayfest and were represented by 9 artists, including Mimi Schuster, a new member. Yoted to donate \$25 to PLU to help offset costs of posters, etc.

Carole Ramstad reported on the Nordic Heritage Museum opening with Mayor Royer and other politicians present. Very small now, but quality is outstanding, will expand in time. Voted to send \$200 in support.

A sign-up slip for assistance and/or demonstration at Folk Life Festival at Seattle Center May 24-26 was circulated, and another for same at Gig Harbor Midsommarfest June 15. A chairman for the Heritage Festival at Marymoor over the 4th of July holidays was asked for, with no response, so it was moved, seconded and carried that we not participate this year.

It was suggested that in the future we hold our May meeting in Seattle as summer events are in that area and not many Greater Seattle members were in Tacoma to volunteer.

Gudrun Berg volunteered to serve as one co-chairman for October Scandinavian Days in Tacoma. We need another.

We depleted our supply of Norma Splitt notecards so it was voted to purchase 200 more at \$165/100.

Pat Barnes suggested our 5th meeting, Nov. 16, be held in Bremerton this year only, contingent on availability of Sons of Norway Hall, as members from Vashon, Port Orchard, Port Angeles, Sequim, Poulsbo, Silverdale, etc. always have to travel so far to either Seattle or Tacoma now. Moved, seconded and carried.

Door prize was a beautiful big korg. Dena Iverson was the lucky winner....

The program was a most informative presentation by Pat Morgan offering numerous suggestions in preparing for a juried show, most timely since we'll be honored with one early next year. So hold on to your very best work and save it for that show? Submit your "next bests" for sales...

We should enter even after only 1 year of painting, in order to improve. Each entry receives a critique. Bring a tape recorder to learn. Make sure your item is painted, not stained or raw wood, have at least 2 good coats, oils only (not acrylics), have a good hanger (screws and wire, not a sawtooth—disqualified if poor hanger). Pay attention to base coat, back, finishing, so they'll notice your design and not throw out due to the above!

Now that fall discipline is returning, let's get painting....

REPORTS ON RECENT SHOWS AND SALES

May 24-26, 1980 - Northwest Regional Folklife Fesitval '80 at Seattle Center 10% commission, hours 12 noon to 6 p.m. Artists' sales were \$222.25 for 3 days, total receipts \$252.54 There were many people interested in our artwork, and many prospective students who signed up for classes (their names and addresses were mailed to teachers in their respective areas). This event was good exposure for WRA as visitors from the entire West Coast attended. Rain and Mt. St. Helens' eruption probably affected the last day of the Festival. Our exhibit place was good, lighting was good, and security was provided so we didn't have to take everything down each night as at some shows. Our thanks to Celia Hendrix, Barbara Hazen, Lila Granaas, Karen Newbill, and Jean Alfsen for their help, and also to Celia, Karen, Jean, Mary Ellerman and Inger Svendsen for demonstrating -- this really stimulates increased interest and aids sales. Al and Don Edwards for their assistance in setting up and dismantling the booth, and our appreciation to those volunteers who had to withdraw due to illness and notified us in ample time to make arrangements to man their vacancies.
