SYNOPSIS OF THE GENERAL MEETING - JAN. 20, 1990 - NORDIC HERITAGE MUSEUM

Betty Edwards presented a very interesting program about how to use the WRA library resources in our painting. She had painted samples and pictures in books or photographs which were the inspiration for the painting. She encouraged everyone to make use of the library for this purpose.

Marie Ganfield, President, presided. She welcomed guests and new members. She thanked Mary Ellerman and the hostesses for the refreshments.

The Treasurer reported a balance of \$3311.61. [1990 Financial Statement is included in this issue.]

Gurine Nordby showed some card designs from Vesterheim. She also showed the cloth cover for the history book which Naomi Price kindly painted for us.

Betty Edwards said progress is being made for a permanent display case at the museum. Members are urged to bring things for it and also for the gift shop.

<u>Juried Show</u> - Members are requested to send in by <u>March 15th</u> a description of their juried show items. The painted items are due to Marie Ganfield or Betty Edwards by <u>April 1st</u>. They will be on display at P.L.U. during April and May and at the Nordic Heritage Museum from July 18th through September 19th. A mailing will be sent to members.

A motion was made and passed that in the Intermediate and Advanced categories, a member may submit two rosemaled pieces to be judged; one of which must be an original design. Hopefully this will increase the number of people who enter item.


PLU YULE BOUTIQUE REPORT
