It was fun trying to learn some Norwegian and teaching them a little English. Kari was even willing to sing a few Norwegian folk songs. Everyone went home enthusiastic and inspired and cherishing a piece of their work to call their own.

DESIGN WORKSHOP AT TROLLHAUGEN.....

A design workshop taught by Florence Buck, will be held at Trollhaugen October 29 through November 2, 1990, Monday through Friday. Students will live at the lodge which provides an ideal atmosphere in which to concentrate on the class.

Students from a variety of painting levels can benefit equally from the class. 
NEW COSTUME FABRIC
