The kolrosing plate we purchased from Judy Ritger for our auction is gorgeous. Here is what she says about this technique on the North House Folk School website:

Kolrosing, or "painting with coal," has its roots in Viking traditions. To kolrose an object, students use a specially designed knife to incise a fine line onto wood, and then rub dust (traditionally coal, now coffee) into the line to bring out the design. This simple method can be used to add a folk flourish to any wood craft- plates, spoons, bowls, furniture, skis and more.
