



If you can't make it to the general meeting, let me know and I will send it to you.

Kathy Anderson will be traveling from Portland, Oregon to teach us American Rogaland - using traditional colors. Details on what to bring will be in the next newsletter.

She is an accomplished painter and a wonderful teacher. This workshop will fill up fast, so get your name and money in early. This workshop will be geared for the beginner to intermediate painter, but I know that several advanced painters will be attending.

We are trying a new location for the south-end workshops. With a workshop in Seattle and one in Tacoma, we found that Tacoma averaged about 7-8 people and Seattle was overloaded with 12-15 people. There are quite a few south Seattle members that have stated that a workshop in Burien would be easier to get to. Some members from Tacoma have indicated that a drive to Burien wouldn't be too excessive. This should even-out the number of people attending workshops at both facilities.

DIRECTIONS TO THE NORDIC HERITAGE MUSEUM: Take the N. 85th exit off of I-5 and go west toward the water. Stay on N. 85th all the way to 32nd W. Between I-5 and 32nd W. you will cross Aurora Ave. N, Greenwood, and 15th before you get to 32nd.

At 32nd take a normal left (rather than the hard left). Follow 32nd to 67th. Turn left on 67th and you will see a parking lot with a chain-link fence. Park in the fenced area. The class is on the lower level (the same level as the entrance. Once inside the door, go straight down the hall until you can't go any farther. Turn right and go the end of the hall.

Marilyn opened the meeting at 9:30 am and thanked Connie for hosting the meeting.

Judy gave the treasurer's report reflecting an end of Dec. bank balance of 2534.11. She said the books need audited before going to the new treasurer and will contact Mr. Boren that regard.

Sales need to be broken down as to location because of differing tax rates in areas, and taxes need to be reported reflecting this. Anyone buying to resell must show their resale certificate or pay the sales tax. Lois will type out this information to be pasted in the cash box. Funds forwarded to the financial secretary need to be totalled, and tax collected listed separately.

Barbara Laskowski photographed the juried show items with Connie, Betty and Marie assisting. Film cost was \$22. Barbara will get a double set of 5x7s, cost \$40 for 120 pictures. Instead of being paid her travel fee, she would like to have a set of pictures. She suggested making up sets for sale--25 in a set for \$10; 15 for \$6.50, size 4x6. Before the Jan. general meeting Board will help her choose the sets.

Betty said the juried show cost was \$289, which includes ribbons, postage, judging fees, letters, etc. The 20% earned is \$149 at this time. It was discussed having 30% added in the future--20% for the museum and WRA 10%. Board expressed appreciation to Betty who handled the entire show when committee members Nancy Johnson moved, and Vanessa Strand passed away. Items to consider for future shows: Judging forms need to define the percentages better; entry categories need to be better defined; explore the possibility of a juried show in the Everett area; every Vine carry a paragraph encouraging painting entries.

Regarding the wedding bowl raffle: In the future drawings need to be done at regular public meetings.

WRA needs a list and photographs of all the painted items purchased from artists, and have one person in charge keeping them all in one place so they are available for members to check out. This information needs to be listed in the annual directory. Betty Edwards has the display plates at her home.

Kelly reported on mini-workshops. The next one is set for Feb. 6 with Vesla Harris 18 have signed up. Gudrun Bery's workshop will be March 27, boxes to be painted will be at the Jan. general meeting.

Major workshops: Dorothy Peterson in March. A hostess is needed for her stay in Seattle. Marilyn Olin is set for September. Workshop announcements will be sent to the Scandinavian Hour for additional publicity. Kelly suggested perhaps a summer class on acrylic colors equivalent to oil colors.

Connie Sullivan will present the program in Jan. and new officers installed. Mary Ellerman will be contacted for the March program about folk arts in different countries and how rosemaling is unique.

Betty said that 1993 is the Year of the American Artist. There is currently an exhibit of Blue Ribbon Winners in the Smith Tower, sponsored by the King County Arts Commission. Board thanked Betty for entering Naomi Price's blue ribbon entry from the juried show, and for preparing a printed brochure for this show, which tells about rosemaling and WRA. This information will be in the next Vine.

Gurine has volunteered to continue doing workshops, note cards and the raffle. Louise Friar will take over as Historian. Cards need to be available at 3 locations for easier sales.

Items for new Board: Telephone committee, review standing rules, set up sales calendar, list of WRA painted items & chairperson, set up juried show committee, possibly a budget committee.

Marilyn closed the meeting by expressing thanks to everyone for helping the past two years.




