- 1. Brush Lettering (2 days preferred can be finished in one day.)

 - 3. Brush strokes
- 4. Backgrounds preparing and colors, oils/acrylics.
- 5. "Glossies" acrylics for slick and unusual surfaces.

"I enjoy assisting the beginner and bringing new information to the more experienced." **Betty Edwards** - In October or later, Betty would be happy to teach:

Beginning Telemark - A beginning class with basic strokes with the glat brush, simple detial with a round brush, simple Telemark design, on a typical Norwegian background. The pattern will fit a 10" plate or a 12" plate.

Beginning Hallingdal - Beginning basic strokes with a round or filbert brush, and a simple Hallingdal design for a 12" plate, on a typical Norwegian background. The pattern will fit a 10" plate or a 12" plate.

The Telemark class technique, color and basics are from classes I have taken from Eldred Arntzen, Addie Pittlekow and Norma Splitt. The Hallingdal class technique, color and basics are from classes I have taken from Judith Nelson Miner, Barbara Wolters and Dorothy Peterson. I teach in oils, but acrylic rosemalers are welcome.

A large tagboard sign, 28" x 22" with information about some of the characteristics of Hallingdal design is on the left in the case. Some photo samples of Hallingdal done by Sheila Stillin and Dorothy Peterson are placed on and near the sign for study.

Some characteristics of Hallingdal are usually:

Bold bright colors
Symmetrical or balanced design
Background color often red

Well defined center - sometimes geometrical

Round scrolls Black or yellow ochre for details Parts of design are not always connected

For future information, check out a book from our library or take a class from one of our teachers.

Those who contributed pieces are: Mickey Buchanan, Marilyn Hanson, Marie Ganfield, Betty Edwards, and Dena Iverson. A big *thank you* for your involvement. The volunteers working at the museum assure me that the display case is admired–students who study rosemaling at the museum find it interesting as well.

Pam Rucinski will be in the Seattle area this summer. Anita Boren and Gurine Nordby are hoping to plan a 3-day worshop July 25-26-27 with her teaching Gudbrandsdal. If you are interested, you may contact them for more information about location and cost. (not WRA sponsored).

The program centered around WRA sales and the opportunities they present to promote rosemaling. Members offered the following ideas: Cards can be displayed in a large plexiglass frame for eye appeal and color. Display printed plaques telling about rosemaling. Have a special display rack for jewelry. Hang holiday ornaments on a fake tree. Stack small, inexpensive boxes on which to display painted items, to add height. Use baskets and plexiglass shelves for display interest. Display like items together for selection. Color-code pegboards showing top and bottom. Have a WRA banner hung above display. Have some type of rolling vehicle to move booth items. Be sure all painted items are professionally finished, front and back. Use red or white fabric drapes for background. Encourage more members to participate in sales.

Naomi opened the general meeting. Minutes of the January meeting were approved as printed. Kelly Sooter thanked members from the North End and Bellevue areas for supplying refreshments.

Treasurer's report as submitted by Nancy Johnson reflected Jan. 1 to Feb. 20th income at \$707.51, expenses as \$1188.09, with an ending balance of \$2,704.20. Five guests were introduced. Three individuals were attending for the first time and joined: Laurie Medill, Aasta Erlandsen and An-Magrith Erlandsen. All were warmly welcomed.

On behalf of the Board, Lois Clauson recommended to the membership that \$200 be budgeted for the upcoming juried show committee expenses. \$150 goes to pay the judges, and other expenses have not yet been specifically identified. Following discussion Lois made a motion to table the above motion; motion seconded and carried.

Barbara Claboe stated approximately 145 members have paid their 1994 dues, and the directory will be at the printers in a couple weeks.

Barbara Hazen stated that Sunshine Committee has sent cards to Gudrun Berg, Anita Boren, Lila Granaas and Roshelle Gamman.

Regarding major workshops, Gurine Nordby reported that an Elaine Schmidt Rogaland and Hallingdal workshop is set for May in Burien, in July Pam Razinski will give a 3-day workshop on Gudbransdal, details yet to be worked out, and in the fall Sally DeRose will give a workshop on Hallingdal at Trollhaugen, and free-hand Telemark in Seattle or Tacoma.

Marie Ganfield reported wonderful results from the WRA displays in the NHM case. Hallingdal pieces are being featured in March.

Regarding mini-workshops, Ranghild Feroy stated no teachers have contacted her as yet. Members were urged to let her know what types of classes they would like to have so teachers know what members are interested in.

New member Laurie Medill volunteered to serve as WRA librarian. Luella Hilby volunteered to serve as sales director. Wilda Snyder will hold a costume workshop in May. Dorothy Nichols said note cards by Nils and Sigmund will be ordered. She made a motion to send WRA cards to Kathy Anderson so she can place one in each 'Vine' next mailing and include an article about promoting and selling cards. Motion was seconded & carried.

Gurine Nordby offered a motion to reinstate the policy of buying patterns, taking photos and getting a color palet from each of two major workshop teachers each year, to be put in a book for the WRA library. She amended the motion to read \$60 paid for each teacher. Motion seconded & carried.

Gurine presented the idea of coming up with a possible new copyrighted logo. She said that other organizations have used the WRA logo without permission. She will write up an article for the 'Vine.'

Kelly Sooter made a motion that WRA have the option of having a booth at an East County festival. Motion seconded. WRA would share an equal portion of the rent and insurance with other vendors, estimated at \$50. Members who sell through the WRA booth would pay 20% commission to WRA. Motion carried by counted show of hands.

Bo Freeman thanked everyone who participated in the sale of Ann's woodenware. He will be informing Lois Clauson of the total proceeds and to which charities they go.

Gurine suggested having a general meeting next year at Glendale Lutheran Church so everyone can see the rosemaling completed there.

Door prizes were won by Nina Kurrle and Judy Tenggren.

33 members and 5 guests attended.
