Here is a workshop that you won't want to miss. It's been some time since we have been fortunate enough to have a visiting rosemaler from Norway teach a workshop. This time we not only have one, but TWO! KARI SIGNE BRATHEN and BJØRG KLEIVI, from the county of Tinn in Telemark, are two very talented rosemalers who have agreed to come here and teach.

Kari lives in Rjukan, where she has a small shop and teaches rosemaling. She has been painting for 20years and teaching the last 15 years. Kari has won 5 Frist prizes for her rosemaling.

She has three grown children and two grandchildren. Last August Kari made her first trip to America. Those of us who were lucky enough to meet her and see her work, will agree that she is indeed very fine rosemaler.

Bjørg has been rosemaling for 10years. She says that she learned to paint in Amotsdal where she lives. She has her own style, but is typical Telemark, paints everyday and has painted many log chairs. Bjørg has three daughters, ages 21,11 and 8 years, and two grandchildren. This will be her first visit to the west coast of America.

Kari and Bjørg have taught workshops together in Drammen and Oslo, so teaching here together will not be a new experience for them.

In order to have the workshop in a central location that will accommodate all of our members, I scheduled the class in Federal Way.. Those of you who live some distance may want to form car pools. Anyone coming from out of town let me know and will provide you with a list on motels in the area.

NEW ADDITIONS TO THE LIBRARY.....


Since February 1989 we have added a few new books to out WRA Library.
