### SPECIAL K COOKIES

### Heritage Festival -- Marymoor Park July 3,4,5, 1982

Crowds were good sized each day of the festival, especially on the 4th. Total income from the three days was \$725.20. We had not participated in this festival for the past two years, but in 1979 we had sales of \$286.92 for the one day we took part and in 1978 we had income of \$496.43 for four days participation. Many people showed an interest in classes by signing up to be contacted.

The location for the festival is very pleasant and there is a great deal of entertainment going on all the time in different areas of the park -- all kinds of folk dancing, music groups and performing arts of various sorts. The publicity was very good this year and the size of the crowds reflected that.

A different group of people comprise this crowd than those we see at the Norwegian or Scandinavian affairs and they are interested in what we are showing and doing. Therefore, we are able to accomplish something toward our goal of educating others about rosemaling.

### PACIFIC LUTHERAN UNIVERSITY MAYFEST May 1, 1982

This was another fun day, as usual. There was a great variety of delicious Scandinavian foods available. The entertainment was enjoyed by all and the atmosphere of the day was gaity.

Our WRA booth attracted a lot of attention, but sales were not particularly brisk. Thirteen artists displayed 177 rosemaled items with a value of \$2350. Total receipts for the day were over \$500 with \$464 in artists sales.

Thanks to all the helpers, Karla Hutchison, Myrt Ronning, Eva Clark, Ragnhild Feroy, Dorothy Nichols, Eva Wederspahn, Marilyn Hansen, Betty Edwards and Barbara Hazen. And a special "Thank You" to Betty's and Barbara's husbands who helped with the properties at the end of the day.

Sales totaled \$919.58!!! Chairman, Lois Clauson reported that the sale went very well and that we had lots of painted items. There are still large bowls and plates being sent to sales without hangers - this creates a problem where the booth is small as they take up so much room on the table.

ASTORIA SCANDINAVIAN MID -SUMMER FESTIVAL June 19th Sales totaled \$920.55.....This was our "first" for an out-of-state sale. It was a fun day and sales were great. This festival was made to order for a Western Rosemaler's sale. Two of our Oregon members came and helped giving us an opportunity to become better acquainted. Co-chairman Dena Iverson and Ida Mae Swedberg are looking forward to being in Astoria for this event again next year.

FOLKLIFE FESTIVAL -- Seattle Center May 29,30 & 31 1982. Co-chairmen Celia Hendrix and Betty Edwards reported a total sale of \$466.62 for the three days. This was not as large in sales as some other events but did provide the opportunity for many people to see Rosemaling and Rosemalers in action. The Viking ship booth was used making a very attractive booth. The sales was an increase over previous Folklife Festivals.


