MINUTES OF THE WRA GENERAL MEETING MARCH 15, 1992

President Marilyn Hansen called the meeting to order. Vice President Connie Sullivan announced the program topic and introduced our speaker, Vesla Harris. Vesla spoke and answered questions about the things a judge looks for when considering a piece in a juried show.

Correspondence: WRA received a thank you note from PLU and from Vesterheim for donations made. We also received an invitation from PLU to attend their NORDIC NIGHT to be held Saturday, April 11, at St. Helens Plaza Roof Garden, 47 St. Helens Avenue, Tacoma, WA. The cost if \$40.00 per person. Reservations must be made by April 4th.

Treasurer Judith Tenggren gave a report of deposits, \$962.00, with a balance as of the 15th of March of \$3,360.80. She also submitted a letter from the auditor approving the financial records.

Sales:

Connie Sullivan, chairman of the exhibit at the Nordic Heritage Museum, asked that workers please wear costumes. She asked for demonstrators and items to sell on April 25th. Dorothy Nichols and Delores Bennett asked for donations for drawings to be held every hour.

June 19, 20, 21 in Astoria - If our booth is upstairs, we want signs at the stairs regarding booths upstairs. Also check on availability of electricity and insurance. Betty Edwards wants demonstrations and is optional as to medium (oil or acrylics). +The board should discuss changing rules of juried shows.+

June 28 in Poulsbo - There is a \$20.00 booth fee.

July 3,4,5 Marymoor Park in Redmond - Anita Boren moved to participate in Festival at Marymoor as a vendor. The motion was seconded and passed. Check on insurance. +

August 15,16 Canterbury Faire at Kent - Dorothy Nichols moved to participate as observers only. The motion was seconded and passed.

October 9-12 NW Tole Liners Convention - Mary Ellerman reported approximately 500 attend and there are 70 to 80 booths with a flat fee of \$250.00. This is held at the Sea Tac Red Lion Inn. Leroy Clauson agreed to sell woodenware to WRA at wholesale prices so that we could resell. Small items sell best and Vesta Harris and Florence Buck promised to donate patterns. Vesla suggested adding a sign to booth stating, "Interiors by Appointment". Charlotte Kelly volunteered to chair this sale.

March 27,38 Hoquiam Ethnic Festival

Classes/Workshops:

Mary Ellerman and Sharon Engelbert's acrylics workshops are almost full. Remember that paints will be provided. Gayle Oram's classes in July will be on detailing, figures and borders. Bjorg Kelivi is not available to commit to WRA for classes.

Anita Boren moved to waive the workshop fee for any hostess who has a visiting artist stay in her home; and, she moved the chair of any major or minor workshop received her fee at a 50 percent discount. The motion was seconded. Florence Buck moved to amend to split the motion into two parts. Her amendment was seconded and passed. The portion of the original motion waiving the workshop fee for any hostess who has a visiting artist stay in her home was passed. No action was taken on the second part.

Sales guidelines were discussed and Wilda Snyder moved to make no tax free sales. The motion was seconded and passed.

Betty Edwards passed out a flyer regarding the 1992 juried show to be held Oct. 6 thru December 31st. She also passed out copies of suggested changes in the rules for category placement. Florence Buck suggested we take the sheet home and give serious thought to the changes before further discussion. There was general agreement. Suggestions were made to have a program after the judging with judges discussing critique of winning pieces. Also have judges available for questions.

Marilyn reported on efforts by the board to investigate the plausibility of producing our own note cards. She asked members to work on designs.

Announcements:

Greenbay Farm will hold a Loganberry Festival on July 18 and 19.

Hostesses for the May General Meeting at PLU will be members from Tacoma to Olympia.

Florence Buck donated many items from her files to the historian and to interested members.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:10 PM.

- 1. Save the plastic pieces used to hold up the delivery pizzas and use for setting your pieces on when base coating or varnishing.
- 2. Save the clear plastic used for cakes. The bottoms for base coating or varnishing, and if the piece is small, use the top to keep piece dust free.
- 3. Save plastic sheet found in some packages of bacon for mixing paints (wash well).




Seattle (NORDIC HERITAGE MUSEUM) July 18th






This was a new location for a WRA class and was very comfortable and easier for us who come up from the south to Seattle.

JURIED SHOW AND EXHIBIT ** October 6 throught December 31, 1992

Besides Juried Show pieces, we would also like pieces for the Exhibit part of the show, perhaps a piece you did in a class or a special piece that you did some time ago. We have a beautiful Gallery to display them so paint, paint,

Classifications:

Beginner

Any member who has painted 2 years or less may use a pattern or original design. Beginners who win 2 blue ribbons in this catagory would then progress to the next category.

Novice

Any member who considers themselves a beginner, has painted more than 2 years, may use a pattern or original design. Novices who win 2 blue ribbons in this category would then progress to the next catagory.

Intermediate with pattern

Must give credit to the original artist or mark "designer unknown". Intermediates with pattern who win 2 blue ribbons in this catagory would then progress to the next category.

Intermediate Original

Design must be the original work of the artist. Intermediates who win two Blue Ribbons in this catagory would then progress to the next catagory.

Advanced with pattern

Must give credit to the original designer or mark "designer unknown". Advanced with pattern who win two Elue Ribbons in this catagory would then progress to the next catagory.

Advanced Original

Design must be the original work of the artist and no part of the design may be copied from another. After two Blue Ribbons must move to Professional catagory.

Professional:

Those who do Rosemaling primarily for sale, or who teach. Design must be original. Design may not be copied from a pattern prepared by another artist. Rearrangement of pattern or of flowers and scrolls of another artist is not an original design. Working out your own design on paner and transferring to woodenware is considered an original design.

ENTRY RULES: (for the Juried part of the show)

- 1. Any member of Western Rosemaler's Association may participate in the Juried Show.
- 2. Only 2 items may be entered in the Juried Show. The second itme MUST be an original.
- 3. Articles must have been painted within the last three years and must not have been entered in another Juried Show.
- 4. There is no size limit, however the painted design should be large enough to allow the Judges to appraise technique, design and color.
- 5. No monochromatic or analogous colors.
- 6. Entries must be painted on wood.
- 7. Wet or sticky entries will not be accepted.
- 8. The artist should not sign his/her name to the item being entered.
- 9. If the entry is to be hung, it must have a proper hanger.

W.R.A. Notecard Competition

We are sponsoring a competition for original designs for WRA notecards. Designs may be painted on painted cardboard, tagboard, gift box cardboard (shiny gift box) or canvas paper (buy at art store) - on white or light shades of color. Size: 6° x 7° which can be reduced by copier so that two designs will fit on 8 1/2 x 11 paper. Strong contrasting colors for design are suggested so the design will copy well. Water base paints do not copy well, but if you paint in acrylics, we will try them and see if colors do remain in the copy. Please sign your design. Deadline for submission - July 15.

Everyone, including out-of-town members, are urged to submit one design. Up to 8 designs will be chosen. [This will be voted upon at the May meeting. Time limits required that we put in this announcement before the vote -you know the cart before the horse syndrome!]
