





NOW, THEREFORE, I, Booth Gardner, Governor of the State of Washington, do hereby proclaim June 29-July 4, 1989, as





NORWEGIAN MALE CHORUS OF SEATTLE HELPMATES



It has been said that the success of the Norwegian Male Chorus of Seattle was assured when Rudolf Moller took over as director in 1906. Another, and many think equally contributing factor, was the founding of the Singers' Helpmates. This organization was founded in 1909, the year of the Alaska-Yukon Exposition and twenty years after the Male Chorus was founded.

As the name implies, the purpose of the Helpmates organization is to assist the Singers in all their activities. They have been an excellent support group. Whenever an especially high hurdle confronted the Singers, the Helpmates assisted them in clearing it.

The Helpmates meet every second Monday, from September through May. During the year they serve refreshments at concerts and other functions put on by the Singers. They also have an annual luncheon and serve cookies to Saliard merchants at the 17th of May celebration, the proceeds of which are periodically donated to the Singers.

DR. ALF LUNDER KNUDSEN, Director-in-Chief of the Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers Association and 1989 Sangerfest Co-Chairman, has a wide musical background both in Norway and the United States, performing in Symphony Orchestras, professional and amateur bands and choruses. He earned his Doctor of Philosophy In Scandinavian Languages and Literature from the University of Washington in April, 1989. Dr. Knudsen is a past conductor of the Seattle All-City Band and assistant conductor of the All-City Orchestra. In 1968 he organized the Ballard Youth Band and served as its Musical Director for 15 years. He directed the Swiss Chorus Alpenroesli for a number of years. Since 1974 he has been director of the Norwegian Male Chorus of Seattle. In 1975 he organized the first "Scandinavian Celebration" in Seattle, conducting both the Seattle Symphony Orchestra and the Norwegian Male Chorus with Olav Eriksen as soloist. Dr. Knudsen also organized the "Bicentennial Ethnic Song Festival of Seattle" in 1976 and served as Festival Director. In 1979 he was appointed by Seattle Mayor Charles Royer as Chairman of Music for the Seattle-Bergen Sister City Association. With the exception of the year 1988, he has served as Assistant- or Director-in-Chief for the Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers Association since 1974. Dr. Knudsen, who recently wrote a History of the Norweglan Male Chorus Movement in America, Ilves in Mukilteo, Washington with his wife of 30 years, Alma, and their three children.





PETER BUTLER, Assistant Director-in-Chief of the Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers Association, earned his Bachelor of Music Degree at Lewis and Clark College, and has done extensive graduate work over the entire West Coast. He currently teaches vocal music at Lebanon Union High School and Middle School in Lebanon, Oregon, a position he has held for the past 17 years. He has appeared as soloist in J.S.Bach's Mass in B minor, Brahms' Requiem, and Bernstein's Chichester Psalms. He has also performed solos in Handel's Messiah, Acis and Galatea, Mozart's Marriage of Figaro, and Mendohlsson's Elijah. Mr. Butler enjoys musical theater and has performed in the ever-popular Fiddler on the Roof and My Fair Lady, many times alongside his equally talented and charming wife Anna Marie. He has been directing The Thorsman Male Chorus of Salem, Oregon since 1980.


PROFESSOR GUNNAR J. MALMIN, Director-In-Chief Emeritus of the Pacific Coast Norweglan Singers Association, earned his Bachelor of Music Degree at St. Olaf College, Northfield, Minnesota and a Master of Music at the University of Michigan. He taught in Iowa, Nebraska and from 1937 to 1969 at Pacific Lutheran University where he directed the well-known Choir of the West for a number of years. Professor Malmin served as Director for the Normanna Male Chorus of Tacoma for 32 years, Assistant- 10 years and Director-in-Chief 8 years for the Pacific Coast Norweglan Singers Association at various times from 1948 to 1978, and since 1983 he has been Director-in-Chief Emeritus. Since his retirement on the West Coast, Professor Malmin has directed several Norweglan Male Choruses in the Midwest and served as Director-in-Chief for the Sioux Valley Singers Association as well as Director of the Veterans' Chorus of the Norweglan Singers Association of America. In recognition of all his work for the Norwegian Cause, Gunnar J. Malmin was decorated by His Majesty King Olav V of Norway with the St. Olav Medal, which was awarded him at the 1970 Sangerfest in Seattle.

TO BRUNE OINE ...

... Two Brown Eyes.
Two beautiful brown eyes I saw,
In them I saw my heaven on earth;
In them I saw gentle flames and a childlike peace,
I shall never forget them for all eternity.

JEG ELSKER DIG ...

... I Love You.

You alone have become the thought of my thoughts, You are my heart's first love; I love you as no one on this earth, I love you for all time and eternity.

VAREN ...

... Spring.

Once again I saw winter flee before the spring; again I saw the wild cherry in bloom.

Once again I saw the ice float out from the shore, the snow melt, and the falls in the river roar and break. The green grass I saw once again dotted with flowers; once again I heard the birds of spring herald the sun and the summer.

Once again I saw the spring mist dancing on the vernal hillside the butterfly flitting among the garland of flowers. All this spring life I saw once again before I lost it, but I am heavy in my mind, and I ask myself: could this be the last time?

So be it! I have enjoyed much of beauty in my life, I have gotten more than I deserved, and everything must end.

TAKK FOR DIT RAD ...

... Thanks for your advice.

Thanks for your advice but I must steer my boat into this roaring, foamy sea which beckons me. If I take this venture, It is the last voyage I will take; but I must prove to myself

What I have never been able to prove before.

I must yield to the temptation while I forgive the rugged shoreline.

I must experience the power, the stress, and the strain of the ocean,

I must see my keel near the perilous shore, and I must tempt myself to see how long I may bear It!

MORGENSANG ...

... Morning Song - Is taken from Elverskud (The Elf King's Daughter), a Ballad for solo, chorus and orchestra by Niels W. Gade, with the text based on Danish folk-fairytales written by C.K.F. Molbech. "The sun rises in the east, spreads gold across the sky, moves over sea and mountain tops, and countryside and towns. It comes from the beautiful coast where Paradise once lay, it brings light and life, it carries life and joy to grown and child. And with God's sun a heavenly luster radiates from the east, a glimpse from the coast of Paradise where the apple tree of life grows.

HOR OSS SVEA ...

... A fine example from the Swedish male chorus repertoire, not unlike the Norwegian, reflecting the nationalistic sentiment, the romantic glorification of the homeland, so prevalent in Europe during the 19th century. "Hear us Sweden - mother of us all, hear us! Bicl us to fight and fall for your well-being, bid us! Never should we fail you, never! Take our oath for all eventualities, take it! With life and blood our still free soll, each little bit of heritage you gave in saga and in song we shall defend. And if you stand threatened by deceit, treason, division and assault, then we have faith, like our fathers, in the Lord's name. Our Lord is an immense fortress for us, He is our safest weapon! In Him we will build our hopes during trouble and sorrow. Then it will be wonderful to stand in victory, yet, even more glorious to die for you, oh Mother!"







LANDKJENNING ...

... Landsighting. Bjornstjerne Bjornson's colaboration with Edvard Grieg was to include an opera, Olav Trygvason, the Viking king; however, it was never completed and only one piece still remains alive, Landkanning/Landkjenning/ Landerkennung. The original score calls for male chorus, baritone soloist, band (wind ensemble) and organ. May 17, 1872 was a significant and memorable day, as the world premier of "Landkjenning" took place in the gymnasium at Akershus Fortress In Oslo. The occasion was a fundraising bazaar held for the restoration of the Nidaros Cathedral in Trondheim. Bjornson had written the poem for this occasion building his text on Snorre Sturlason's account of Olav Trygvason's plan to build a church in Nidaros, the medieval name for Trondheim, upon his return to Norway in A.D. 995. Young Olav had become a Christian in England and wanted to bring Christianity to Norway. In his solo he expresses his faith in the Almighty, and his men reiterate his prayer in a rousing grand finale. For the world premier the male chorus performing was a select group from Den Norske Studentersangforening and Handelstandens Sangforening with F.A. Bekkevold as soloist and Joh, Behrens as conductor. In 1881 the piece was printed as opus 31, however, Grieg had by then made a few revisions. This final version was scored for symphony orchestra, male chorus and baritone soloist and new interludes between stanzas had been added. popularity of this song has not diminished with age. The PCNSA has had Landkjenning on its Sangerfest program every year since its inception in 1902-3. The only exception was in 1985 at the Sangerfest concert in Everett. Faithful concert goers and followers flocked to the stage after the concert and informed the singers that It was a good concert, however, without Landkjenning, a Sangerfest concert it was not!

OLAY TRYGVASON ...

... was a great grandson of Harald Fairhair and accepted as King of Norway in 995 by the people of the Trondheim area and gradually by the rest of the nation. In his efforts to make the people adopt the Christian religion, he created many enemies. In the year 1000 his enemies joined forces with the Danish and Swedish kings and met Olav I (Trygvason) at SVOLDER. His fleet was hopelessly outnumbered, and when his Dragon Ship, ORMEN LANGE (Long Serpent) was taken, and Olav wounded, he jumped overboard and disappeared. Most of the song deals with Olav's Earl, Erling Skjalgson and his men. With their 56 lighter warships they had outsailed the 11 heavier Dragonships of the King and were unaware of his fate. As they lay waiting for the King, the message came "from the depth of the ocean, like a sigh, carried by the sobbing waves: Taken is the Long Serpent! Fallen is Olav Trygvason!"


MAJ-SANG ...

... Beautiful May, welcome to our countryside again. Beautiful May, welcome, friend of fun and games! Your radiance awakens the senses. Earth and skies mutter of love and enchantment. Sorrow flees from spring and tears turn to joy. Cheerful offerings rush toward you from the bosom of the grove and the flowerbuds. Just your praise they softly sigh, these fresh rose hedges and our silvery brooks cheerfully rush in your honor. Listen as thousands of birds, just like we, sing with grateful voices: Welcome beautiful May!

NAAR FJORDENE BLAANER ...

... When the Fjords Turn Blue - depicts the re-awakening of nature as yet another spring arrives in Norway. It is a praise, not only to the blue fjords, the beautiful and fragrant flowers, the rushing brooks and the singing birds, but to the hard working men and women of Norway as well. In seven words, "Gud signe dig Norge, mit deilige Land" (God Bless You Norway, My Beautiful Land), the lyricist John Paulsen of Bergen, has braided into this song a simple prayer for the homeland. The Norwegian emigrant composer, organist and choral director Alfred Paulsen of Chicago, helped immortalize the song with perhaps his best known tune, which he wrote in 1907. Alfred Paulsen, a student of L.M. Lindemann and Edvard Grieg, composed "Norge, Mit Norge" in 1911 (text Teodor Caspari). He also composed and wrote arrangements under the pseudonym of Leon Lambert. He was church organist in Jacob's Church in Oslo until 1888, the year he went to America. From 1895 he was organist and choral conductor of "Bethania" and directed both the Norwegian Glee Club and the Norwegian Quartette Club of Chicago.

Program Notes by Dr. Alf L. Knudsen



"Et syngende folk - et lykkelig folk." A singing people - a happy people, is the motto of the Norwegian Singers Association Landssangerforbund). In 1984 it was estimated that there were over 70,000 active singers in Norway belonging to several Singers Associations, and according to Arne B. Christiansen. President of Norges Landssangerforbund, the interest is on the

Song and Music are a birthright which has been entrusted to all nations in a greater or lesser degree.

The beauty and grandeur of Norway, with her lofty mountains, deep blue fjords, green clad valleys and forests, have inspired such great Norwegian writers as Bjornson, Garborg, Moe, Munch, Vinje and Asen, among others, to produce a wealth of stirring poetry. Composers like Borg, Grieg, Kjerulf and Paulsen, to name but a few, equally inspired by the same nature and the poems, have contributed compositions of lasting beauty that rightfully belong among the finest ever produced.

From the days of the Vikings to the present time, singing has been considered a national heritage of the Norwegian people. Virtually every town and village in Norway has a Singing Society, with Male Choruses having an especially important place in the musical life of the nation.

In 1845 Den Norske Studentsangforening, Norway's first Male Chorus, was organized by Johan Didrik Behrens, and already in June of 1851 the first Sangerfest was held in Asker, Norway.

In America, as in Norway, the characteristic Norwegian love for singing and the ability to organize has manifested itself. This has forged a strong link in the bond between those of Norwegian birth, ancestry and affiliation with the homeland.

As early as 1858, the first Norwegian Male Chorus was organized in America, and by 1886 there were enough choruses established to organize a "Sangerforbund", Singers Association, and in 1887 the first Sangerfest was held in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

In 1878 Portland, Oregon, organized the first Norwegian Male Chorus on the West Coast. Cities up and down the coast soon followed suit, and a "Forbund" was soon needed:

PACIFIC KYSTENS NORSKE SANGERFORBUND

was organized at Seattle August 26th, 1902 and comprises, at the present time, the Norwegian Singing Society of Portland, Oregon, Tacoma, Seattle, Ballard and Everett. It was decided at that time to celebrate the first annual Sangerfest in Everett in the summer of 1903. Acting upon this decision, the Everett singers have made preparations for the reception and entertainment of their fellow singers from the cities of the Pacific Northwest during a three-day festival, the climax of which will be the grand concert to be given at the Everett Theatre on Sunday afternoon, August 2nd, for which event the best musical talent on the coast has been secured besides the various singing societies thernselves.

(Quote from the "PROGRAM of the FIRST ANNUAL SANGERFEST of the PACIFIC KYSTENS NORSKE SANGERFORBUND to be held at EVEREIT, WASHINGTON August 1,2 and 3, 1903").

Every Sangerfest is THE BEST ONE, however, since 1902 the "Forbund" has realized some Highlights which deserve special mention. In 19:26, forty-seven singers constituted the first Norway Chorus which undertook a very successful Concert Tour. In 1962 the two Norwegian American Singers Associations joined forces at Sangerfest for the first time in Salt Lake City, Utah. The thrill of the over 700-voice Grand Chorus performing in the Mormon Tabernacle defies description. In May of 1981, a chorus of 100 singers, wives and friends, totaling 400, again made an extremely successful Concert Tour of Norway, this time cruising along the coast aboard M/S. Funchal. The success of the last venture has inspired the upcoming Concert Tour of Alaska in 1986.

Since that first Norwegian Male Chorus in America was organized in 1858, over 400 choruses have come and gone, 104 on the West Coast. At the present time 25 choruses are still active, 11 of which constitute today's Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers' Association.

THE NORWEGIAN MALE CHORUS OF SEATTLE

Historical Notes

By Thor Bjornstad, Chorus Historian

In 1889, the year that Washington was admitted to statehood, nineteen Norwegians got together in Seattle and founded "Nordmennenes Sangforening". The name has since been Americanized and the chorus is now known as The Norwegian Male Chorus of Seattle. The pupose of the organization, as stated in its by-laws, is to promote and cultivate vocal music and dramatic art and especially to foster and promote Nordic songs and music.

For several years the chorus struggled to keep going, with a succession of directors and no permanent place to hold rehearsals. When Rudolph Moller, a professional musician and a Ballard resident, took over as director in 1906 the survival of the chorus seemed more assured and interest has continued to grow until the chorus today has a roster of 75 active singers.

During its 100 years of existence the chorus has had many directors, the most noteworthy being Rudolph Moller who directed for 29 years, Professor August Werner who directed for a total of 33 years, and Dr. Alf L. Knudsen the present director who took over in 1974.

In 1902 the Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers Association was founded and the Seattle chorus became a member chorus. As the name implies, the association consists of Norwegian Male Choruses along the Pacific Coast, from Southern California in the south to British Columbia in the north. The association endeavors to hold a Sangerfest each year with member choruses taking turn hosting the event in their respective cities.

In 1904 Seattle hosted its first PCNSA Sangerfest. Since that time eleven more Sangerfests have been held in Seattle, including the 1989 Sangerfest.

Although each Sangerfest is hailed as being better than the preceding one, it is generally conceded that the 1951 Sangerfest in Seattle was especially outstanding. On that occasion 200 singers performed in concert, outside under a bright full moon, at the Green Lake Aqua Theater to an enthusiastic audience of over 5,000. Lauritz Melchior was guest soloist and he captivated the audience with his stage personality as well as with his singing.

It is expected that the 1989 Sangerfest will be another highlight in the 80 Sangerfests staged by the PCNSA. Being their centennial year, the Seattle chorus has invited Norwegian Male Choruses from all over the United States as well as Norway. It is expected that 500 singers will be on stage when they hold their grand concert at the new Washington State Convention and Trade Center on the evening of Monday, July 3, 1989.






